## USF faces Bemidji State Saturday in North-South battle

SIOUX FALLS – The No. 21 University of Sioux Falls Football Team (4-1, 4-1 NSIC), which has won three straight games, will travel to Bemidji State (4-1, 4-1 NSIC) in an important Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference North-South match up at 2 p.m., Saturday (Oct. 6) at Chet Anderson Stadium in Bemidji, Minn. It will be BSU's homecoming and the Cougars have yet to play the Beavers on homecoming.

**#AT STAKE** - Both teams come into the game with four wins in five games with explosive offenses matched by tough defenses. However, both squads need a victory to stay remain in the hunt for a conference title and possibly earn an NCAA DII postseason berth. USF has the league's top-ranked and DII's fourth-ranked rushing offense at 302.8 yards per game. USF is second in the NSIC at 491.0 yards in total offense per game and fourth in scoring at 37.6 points per game. Meanwhile BSU is seventh in NCAA DII in scoring offense at 43.8 ppg and 45th nationally in total offense 423.6 yards per game, including 257.0 yards rushing per game (3rd, NSIC). BSU ranks third in the NSIC and 13th nationally in rushing defense at 85.4 yards per game. while USF is third in the NSIC and 21st nationally by allowing 100.8 rushing yards per game. The Cougars also rank sixth in the NSIC in total defense at 360.6 yards per game and third in scoring defense with just 17.6 points allowed per game.

**#RECENT ACTION** – USF dropped a 16-15 decision at Winona State on Sept. 8 before stringing together three consecutive victories. USF has wins over Southwest Minnesota State, 39-21; Augustana, 51-13;

and Minot State, 56-14. Meanwhile, BSU rebounded from a 26-19 double overtime loss to No. 8 Minnesota-Duluth (Sept. 22) by recording a 27-10 road win over Wayne State on Sept. 29. The Cougars own a 4-1 lead in the series, including a 37-36 come-from-behind win during on Sept. 24, 2016 when USF was unbeaten in NSIC play en route to a 12-1 record and No. 8 national ranking by season end.

**#BSU NOTES** - Bemidji State, directed by head coach Brent Bolte (21-7), ranks seventh in scoring offense (43.8 ppg) and fourth in scoring defense (10.6) in NCAA DII. The Beavers rank third in the NSIC in rushing offense at 257.0 points per game and third in rushing defense at 85.4 yards per game. They are fifth in total offense at 423.6 yards per game and third in total defense at 293.2 yards per game. BSU has a solid ground game, which is led by Jalen Frye, who has 67 carries for 423 yards and two TDs. Andrew Lackowski has 50 carries for 276 yards and three TDs while Sage Booker has 32 carries for 275 yards and three TDs. Quarterback Jared Henning directs the Beavers attack. He has rushed for 79 yards on 26 carries with a TD while completing 23-of-41 passes for 213 yards and four TDs. Senior cornerback Gunner Olszewski, an all-league performer, leads the team on defense with 41 tackles, four pass breakups and an interception. Linebacker Gabe Ames has 27 tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss, sack and an interception while defense back Michael Junker provided 225 stops and three TFLs. BSU has totaled 13 sacks and nine interceptions.

**#USF OFFENSE ON ROLL** – USF has recorded three straight wins by a 146-to-48 differential. The Cougars has also totaled 500 yards or more in offense three consecutive weeks or 1,696 total yards on 204 plays for 8.31 yards per play. It is the first time since Sept. 10-24 of 2016 that USF has had 500 yards or more total offense in three straight games. In 2016 when USF won the NSIC title, they had 636 yards in a 37-36 win over Bemidji State on Sept. 24, 562 yards in a 35-20 win over Augustana on Oct. 1 and 670 yards in a 48-28 victory against SMSU on Oct. 8. In games, USF has totaled 500 yards or more in total offense, they are 21-1. As part of the offense, the rushing game has been especially effective with a league-high 302.8 yards per game, which ranks fourth in NCAA DII. A week ago, USF tied a DII program mark with 444 yards in the win over Minot State. He tied the mark of 444 set in 2016 against MSU Moorhead. In addition, the Cougars have averaged over nine yards per play in two straight games for the first time in the DII era. USF tied a school mark (St. Cloud State, 9.1, 2016) with 9.1 yards per play against Augustana and last week averaged 9.0 yards per play in the win over Minot State.

**#WATSON RANKS SECOND NATIONALLY IN RUSHING** - Junior running back Gabriel Watson has made a big impression in his first season with USF. He has rushed for 910 yards

ranks on 113 carries for an 8.1 yards per carry average with 12 TDs. He is second in NCAA DII in rushing yards per game at 182.0 while ranking second nationally in total yards. With 12 TDs, he leads NCAA DII in rushing TDs and is second overall in scoring with his 14.4 points per game (72 points in five games). He has twice been named NSIC Player of the Week. In five straight weeks, he has rushed for more than 100 yards, matching the recent streak of five straight by All-American running back Max Mickey in 2017. USF's DII mark for consecutive 100-yard rushing games was set by Nephi Garcia with seven straight in 2013. Watson has accumulated totals of 200, 172, 193, 140 and 205 rushing yards in his first five games of his career. Watson, who had 205 yards on 15 carries in just one half of play against Minot State, recorded the second most rushing TDs in a game by a USF player in the DII era with four against Augustana on Sept. 22. Luke Papillion set the record with five rushing TDs against NSU in 2013. With Watson leading the way, behind a veteran offensive front, USF leads the league in

### USF Picked 3rd in NSIC Pre-season Coaches Poll

In the NSIC Preseason Coaches Poll, USF was picked third overall and third in the NSIC South. The Cougars earned 195 points overall in the poll, finishing just two points from second-place Winona State. USF, which has been ranked No. 15 in NCAA DII by Street and Smith magazine this summer, received 24 more points (171) than a year ago when the Cougars were selected to finish fifth overall. In the South Division Poll, the Cougars were picked third with 37 points or two more than a year ago (35). Minnesota State was tapped the favorite in both the NSIC overall and South Division polls. MSU received 15 first-place votes and 225 points, which was ahead of Winona State at second with 197 overall points and 43 in the South Division. USF was third in the league, accumulating 195 points, edging ahead of North Division favorite Minnesota Duluth with 194 and Bemidji State, 165.

rushing and ranks fourth nationally at 302.8 yards per game. Aside from leading the league in rushing, Watson is also first in all-purpose yards with 185.2 per game.

**#THOMAS CHAPIN IMPACTING SPECIAL TEAMS** – Redshirt freshman Thomas Chapin, who was named NSIC Special Teams Player of the Week two weeks ago, has had a solid season. He ranks fifth in the league in punting at 42.0 yards per kick. He has 21 punts for 883 yards with seven punts placed inside the 20-yard line and six of 50 yards or more. He was honored by the league after averaging 54.0 yards per game on four punts for 216 yards in the rivalry win over Augustana on Sept. 22. In that game, he hammered a career-long 72-yard punt and placed two punts inside the Augustana's 20-yard line as USF picked up its sixth "Key to the City" win in seven games against Augustana.

**#USF LEADS BEMIDJI STATE, 4-1, IN SERIES** - USF owns a 4-1 edge in the series with Bemidji State, dating back to the first game on Sept. 4, 1982 when the Cougars took a 14-12 decision in Sioux Falls. In 1983, the Beavers won, 31-0, on Sept. 3 in Bemidji, Minn. On Sept. 22, 2012, USF took a 21-5 decision at Bob Young Field. In the game, USF used suffocating defense to record the win. The Cougars trailed 5-0 before Eric Anderson intercepted a pass by BSU's Alex Hass and took it to the end zone from 28 yards out for a 8-5 lead as the Cougars converted a two-point conversion on a pass from Taylor Perkins to Austin Van Hove. Later, Perkins, who completed 11-of-25 passes for 178 yards, connected with Jeremiah Oates on a 15-yard TD pass for a 15-5 lead. Braden Wiekling added field goals of 23 and 27 yards for the final advantage.

USF registered a 52-19 win at Bemidji State on Sept. 13, 2014 and a 37-36 come-from behind decision in 2016.

In 2014, USF jumped out to a 24-0 lead before the Beavers rallied with 19 points in the third quarter to cut the lead to 24-19. Then USF closed with a 28-0 run in the fourth quarter. On the right, USF forced six turnovers, turning three into scores, including an 88-yard interception return by Cameron Ostrom. On offense, Nephi Garcia had 25 carries for 134 yards and three TDs, including a 64-yard scoring run.

In 2016, No. 14 USF trailed 20-3 at halftime before putting together a 34-point third quarter and take a 37-30 lead over the visiting Beavers. USF had 636 yards in total offense, including 406 yards rushing on 41 attempts, led by All-American Max Mickey with 14 carries for 207 yards and a 75-yard TD run to open the third quarter. Luke Papilion threw for 229 yards and two TDs and had 163 yards rushing with a 46-yard TD run. BSU had 486 yards in total offense, including 259 yards passing. Jordan Hein, now on the BSU coaching staff, completed 20-of-34 passes for 259 yards and three TDs while also rushing for a score. BSU had a chance at the win but after Hein scored on a one-yard TD run with 17 seconds to play, a two-point conversion failed.

**#COO RECORD LARGEST VICTORY MARGIN SINCE 2016** - Against Minot State on Sept. 22, the Cougars had the largest margin of victory since a 51-7 win (44 points) at Upper Iowa on Nov. 5, 2016. In each of the past two weeks, USF has scored 35 or more points in two wins. The Cougars had 37 against Augustana in the 51-13 road and "Key to the City" win over the Vikings. Then against Minot State, USF opened up a 35-7 lead at the halftime break and cruised to a 56-14 win.

**#WALTERS NUMBERS INCREASING BY THE WEEK** - Junior quarterback Caden Walters leads the NSIC and ranks sixth in NCAA DII in passing efficiency at 180.3. Against Minot State last weekend, he completed 7-of-11 passes for 196 yards. In four plus games, the passing yardage numbers for Walters has improve nearly every week, jumping from 127 vs. Concordia-St. Paul to 129 against Winona State to 196 vs. SMSU, 244 against the Vikings and 196 against Minot State. He has completed 50-of-82 passes for 859 yards with a 61 percent rate. He has not thrown an interception since Winona State, a string of 52 straight passes.

**#MYLES PROVIDING BENCH SPARK** – Junior Colton Myles reached 100 yards rushing for the second straight game with 19 carries for 131

yards and a pair of TDs, which gives him three on the season. Myles has 436 yards on 67 carries with three TDs and a 6.5 yards per carry average. Also for USF, redshirt freshman running back Thuro Reisdorfer had eight carries for a career-best 50 yards and junior running back Mason Schroyer added a career-best 33 yards on seven carries with his first career TD in the win over Minot State. Redshirt freshman tight end Ben Soukup also caught his first career TD pass (29 yards).

**#DEFENSE RANKS 4th IN DII IN TURNOVER MARGIN** – USF's defense has long held a tradition of creating turnovers, playing shutdown defense and scoring TDs. In the DII era, USF has scored 39 TDs on defense and special teams, including 27 on defense alone. Junior cornerback Parker Gregston put up the 39th TD with his 75-yard interception return for a TD in the second quarter of the USF win over Augustana on Sept. 22. It was Gregston's second pick of the game and his first two of his career. So far, USF has a differential of plus-nine (14-to-5), which provides USF with a 1.8 average per game and a No. 4 ranking in NCAA DII. USF ranks ninth nationally by creating 14 turnovers.

**#ROAD WARRIORS** – Since 2014, USF has won 22-of-26 road games. In 2014, USF was 4-1, followed by 6-1 in 2015, 5-0 in winning the league title in 2016 and 6-1 in the playoff season a year ago. USF is 1-1 in 2018.

**#WINNERS WIN** – After five nine-win campaigns in the past six years, the Cougars have continued the 2018 season with plenty of momentum, including recording three wins in four games. A tradition of success is embedded in the program. The motto, "Winners Win" continues as the program's mantra.

**#JOHNSON MAKING IMPACT** – In just five games, Nate Johnson is making an impact at USF. The junior wide receiver has 15 catches for 318 yards with four TDs. Johnson averaged 21.2 yards per catch and 63.6 yards per game. He ranks fifth in the NSIC in all-purpose yards with 581 yards or 116.2 per game. He has also recorded 60 punt return yards and 203 yards in kickoff returns. Also for USF senior Michael Maxwell has 12 catches for 290 yards with a TD while tight end Clint Sigg has added 10 catches for 127 yards with three TDs. Maxwell leads the team with 24.2 yards per catch.

**#COO TRACKS** – Five-time All-American Dennis Gardeck, who helped lead the 2017 Cougars to the playoffs, has earned a spot on the Arizona Cardinals NFL roster. Gardeck was All-NSIC, Harlon Hill and Cliff Harris finalist and NSIC Newcomer of the Year after accumulating 75 tackles, 14 tackles and 21 tackles for loss.

~Senior offensive tackle Trey Pipkins has been named to the Senior Bowl Watch List and two preseason All-American Teams - D2Football.com and The Podium. He has 186 career pancakes.

~Captains for the 2018 season will include Pipkins, senior wide receiver Michael Maxwell, junior safety Tucker Stout and senior All-NSIC defensive end Logan Dykstra.

~USF has both an offensive and defensive lineman named Nick Zimmerman. On offense, one of the Nicks hailed from Rosendale, Wisc., and is a 6-3, 296 starting center. A business administration major, he has been a starter for the past two seasons at dons No. 63. On defense, the other Nick is a 6-0, 282-pound starting defensive tackle from Oceanside, Calif. Zimmerman, who has a sack, five tackles and a TFL in three and five appearances starts, is in his first season at USF. He is a psychology major.

**#JUST WIN BABY** - USF is 58-13 (.817) overall in the NSIC, the best all-time mark in the NSIC. USF is 65-20 all-time in NCAA DII with a 35-11 mark against South opponents and 23-2 vs. the North. The Cougars are 29-7 in road NSIC games and 29-6 in home NSIC games. In North Division road games, the Cougars are 10-2 and 12-0 at home against NSIC North teams. USF stands 18-6 against South opponents at home and is 17-5 on the road. USF clinched their 24th straight winning season with a win over Wayne State on Oct. 12, 2017. It is a streak which is unmatched in D2 and the fifth-longest streak across all divisions. The string of success began with an 8-3 season for legendary head coach Bob Young in 1994.

**#GAME SCORING STREAK AT 156** - Since moving to DII in 2011, the Cougars have scored 3,014 points in 85 games or 35.45 ppg. USF has scored in 156 straight games, dating to a 55-0 loss to Carroll College in the final game of the 2005 season. USF recorded a DII-best 73 points vs. Minnesota State-Moorhead (Sept. 27) in 2014.

USF has averaged 36.88 ppg (1,992 pts) over past four years plus when USF has gone 45-9. USF has had 4,500 yards or more in offense five straight years and 6,647 (2nd most all-time at USF) in 2016. In five games, USF has 2,455 yards in 2018.

## Jon Anderson

**2nd Season  
(13-4 at USF)**



Jon Anderson is in his second season as head football coach at the University of Sioux Falls.

He was formally introduced as USF's 21st head coach on Tuesday, Dec. 6. In 17 games with USF, he has directed the team to a 13-4 record. In 2017, the No. 20 Cougars not only reached the postseason for the fourth straight year but earned an NCAA DII playoff berth for a third straight season as part of a 9-3 season. The Cougars finished 9-2 in league play for third overall in the NSIC with a 24th straight winning season.

In 2018, USF has opened the season ranked No. 14 in the AFCA Coaches Poll (opened at No. 20 in the preseason rankings) and No. 16 in the D2Football.com media poll (opened preseason poll at No. 18). After going 4-1, including a 51-13 "Key to the City" victory over Augustana and 56-14 win over Minot State on Cougar Days, USF is ranked No. 21 by D2Football.com and receiving votes in the AFCA poll.

In his first game as head coach, USF, ranked No. 17, knocked off then- No. 10 Minnesota Duluth, 26-7, on the road. In week two, his first game as head coach of USF at Bob Young Field, No. 9 Cougars defeated Northern State, 37-7. The Cougars followed up with a 38-7 victory on the road at U-Mary and a 34-0 home win over Minnesota Crookston in the Hall of Fame game. In week five, No. 5/7 USF defeated Southwest Minnesota State, 24-10 in another road game. The No. 6 Cougars dropped a 31-13 decision to No. 17 Winona State on Cougar Days. In week seven, the No. 18 Cougars defeated Wayne State, 31-7, on the road. In week eight, USF moved to 5-0 this year on the road with a 27-9 victory over Concordia St. Paul. In his first game as head coach in the "Key to the City" matchup with Augustana, the No. 13 Cougars recorded a 21-14 decision at Bob Young Field. USF defeated Upper Iowa, 19-7, to extend its road NSIC winning streak to 17 games. In a battle for a share of the NSIC title, the Cougars dropped a 27-23 decision to league champ and No. 1 Minnesota State at Bob Young Field. USF advanced to play Midwestern State, No. 5 nationally, and dropped a heart-breaking 24-20 decision.

Previous to coming to USF, Anderson was head coach at West Virginia State where he had a 10-34 record. He is now 19-35 in his coaching career.

While a coach with USF from 2002-2012, Anderson helped lead the Cougars to a 134-26 record, three NAIA championships (2006, 2008, 2009), as well as the program first, nine-win team at the NCAA DII level. Most recently Anderson served as the head coach at West Virginia State for four seasons (10-34 record). He also made sure to keep the program involved in the community through projects such as Breast Cancer Awareness, Flood Relief, Coach to Cure MD, the Relay for Life, WVSU Cares Day, and work at Dunbar Primary School.

Anderson spent 11 years with USF, including his final three seasons as defensive coordinator. Overall, the Cougars posted a 134-26 record including a 21-5 playoff record with Anderson as part of the coaching staff. At the DII level, he was part of the staff and team that was 5-4 in the transition year from NAIA to NCAA DII in 2011 and the 9-2 team squad in 2012. The 2012 team earned USF's first ever national ranking in its first year as member of the NSIC. In fact, the Cougars climbed as high as No. 17 in the AFCA poll and were ranked seven times in that national poll.

While Anderson coached at USF, the Cougars dominated its conference opponents, winning 92-of-95 conference games. In 2009, the school posted a perfect 15-0 record in claiming its second consecutive NAIA national championship.

In 2012, Anderson's defensive unit was among the conference leaders in scoring defense, surrendering only 20.2 points a game. The Cougars' defense was also among the league leaders in forcing turnovers taking the ball away from opponents 29 times, including 23 interceptions. The 2012 defensive unit built on the success of the 2011 team when the Cougars' defense forced 21 turnovers and gave up just 21.6 points per game.

During Anderson's three years as defensive coordinator, the Cougars posted a 27-7 record and limited opponents to an average of 16 points per game. Prior to being named the Cougars' defensive coordinator, Anderson served eight years as the special team's coordinator and linebackers coach. In that role, he coached five All-Americans and eight All-Conference players.

Anderson, a native of Maryville, Missouri, played college football for four years at Buena Vista University in Storm Lake, Iowa, and coached the secondary at his alma mater during the 1999 and 2000 seasons.

He moved to Madison, South Dakota, to join the Dakota State University staff as the linebackers and special teams coach for the 2001 season. He arrived at USF for the 2002 season and earned his master's degree from South Dakota State University in 2003. He worked with legendary head coach Bob Young, and former head coaches Kalen DeBoer and Jed Stugart.

He and his wife, Amanda, have two sons, Trevor and Tyce.

# Sioux Falls Football History

Since football started at the University of Sioux Falls in 1902, the Cougars have tasted success at both the NAIA and NCAA Division II level. During that period, USF has won NAIA league titles and four times been crowned a national champion. The Cougars won NAIA national titles in 1996, 2006, 2008, and 2009.

Since the move to NCAA DII in 2011, the Cougars have constructed a 64-20 record. In NSIC play, beginning in 2012, the Cougars are 57-13. Since moving to DII, the Cougars have finished third (9-2, 5-2, NSIC South, 2012), fourth (6-5, 4-3 NSIC South, 2013) and second (11-1, NSIC South, 2014) in the NSIC South. USF, which finished the season #21 in the AFCA poll and #17 in D2football.com was 9-3 and earned its first ever NCAA DII playoff berth. In 2016, the Cougars moved from #23 in the AFCA poll to #4 and finished 12-1 after heartbreaking 27-24 OT loss to #5 Harding in the second round of the NCAA DII playoffs. The Cougars, which won the NSIC crown for the first time, earned a program best D2 #2 seed in the NCAA DII playoffs in Super Region 3. USF was #8 in the final AFCA and D2Football.com polls.

The Cougars won their first round playoff game in 2016 with a 34-21 win over Azusa Pacific at Bob Young Field. With the win, USF hosted a second round game for the first time at the DII level and stand 13-1 all-time in playoff games at Bob Young Field. In 2017, the Cougars finished 9-3 with Jon Anderson at the helm. The Cougars defeated No. 7 Minnesota Duluth to open the season and played three more ranked teams. USF continued its national ranking streak of 48 consecutive weeks, which is the longest in the NSIC.

To this point, USF has won 20 league titles, had 106 All-Americans and 328 all-league players, including 13 in 2015, a program-best 24 in 2016 and 14 in 2017. In total USF has had 86 players recognized on the NSIC All-League team, including, 14 in 2017, program best 24 in 2016, 13 in 2015, 14 in 2014, eight in 2013, and 13 in 2012. USF has had 12 players named first team, 21 to the second team and 15 honorable mention. John Tidwell became USF's first 3-time first team All-NSIC selection in 2015 and was joined by, Luke Papilion, Trevor Wescott, Antonio Green, in 2016 and Josh Butler in 2017.

Former USF quarterback Kurtiss Riggs was inducted into the NAIA Hall of Fame in 2013. Riggs led USF to a two-year record of 25-1, setting NAIA records for TD passes in a season (55), and most attempts without an interception (290) during the 1996 season. He directed the Cougars to its first national title in 1996. In leading USF to a 14-0 record, Riggs set schools records in single season passing yards with 3,993, completions, 265, and had single game passing marks in passing yards with 457, completions, 30 and TDs (9). He was a 1996 NAIA first team All-American.

In the title game win over Western Washington, he threw for 455 yards and five TDs. Riggs, who accumulated 496 completions in 801 attempts for 7,329 passing yards and 85 TDs in his career, was the third athlete from USF named to the NAIA Hall of Fame. USF punter Brian Hansen was inducted in 1995 and track and field standout Wally Diehl was inducted in 1968. Former head coach Bob Young, who was inducted into the NAIA Hall of Fame in 2010, has the most wins in school history with a 172-69-3 mark from 1983-2004. USF's home field is named in Young's honor. He was a two-time GPAC Coach of the Year (2002, 2003). Kalen DeBoer, who owns the school's best all-time winning percentage at .957, was the GPAC Coach of the Year three times

## USF has recorded 15, 10-win seasons

(2006, 2007, 2008) and named the AFCA/NAIA Coach of the Year in 2006, 2008 and 2009. He led USF to a 67-3 record and three national titles (2006, 2008, 2009). Four USF players were named NAIA National Players of the Year, including Nick Kortan in 2002, Chad Cavender in 2007, Lorenzo Brown in 2009 and Jon Ryan in 2010.

Two former Cougars played in the NFL, including Rick Danmeier (1972-75) who was with the Minnesota Vikings from 1977-82. He ranks sixth on the Vikings all-time scoring list with 364 points. Punter Brian Hansen (1980-83) played with the Washington Redskins, New York Jets, Cleveland Browns, New England Patriots, and New Orleans Saints from 1984-99. He is the only player in school history to be drafted by the NFL as he was taken in the ninth round of the 1984 draft. He averaged 42.3 yards per punt in the NFL.

In 1902, the school played its first game against the University of South Dakota, falling 33-0. Over the 96 years of football, USF has a 405-402-20 record. The Cougars claimed its 400th all-time win in 2014 in a 38-9 win over Concordia, St. Paul on Oct. 4. At the NAIA level, USF was 36-12 in the playoffs with four national titles, three runner-up finishes and three semifinal appearances. The Cougars won their first ever league title (SDIC) in 1981 and had their first unbeaten regular season in 1988 when they also appeared in the playoffs for the first time. In 1995, USF won the program's first playoff game. USF is 1-3 in NCAA DII playoffs game and 2-3 in the DII postseason.

## Look Back over the Years

After that first game in 1902 USF did not play again until the 1911 season when they lost to Huron, 24-9. In 1915, the program tasted the winning feeling for the first time with a 41-0 win over Pipestone. In 1916, the program had the first winning season at 3-2-2. The Cougars recorded a 46-0 win over Augustana. Records suggest that USF hired T.R. Johnson in 1919 when the Cougars were 0-2. Later, USF hired another USD graduate in Frank McCormick, who led the program from 1924-27 (4-18, .182). Francis Olson, who is tied with Philip Tinsworth (6-45-1, .130, 1949-55) and Richard Sterup (20-40, .333, 1962-68), for the second longest tenure (seven years) at USF, had a 19-24-6 (.388) mark from 1928-34.

The early years at USF were tough with just five .500 or better seasons in the first 30 years of the program. However, the 6-1-1 season in 1934, including a 108-to-35 scoring edge, was a standout season. In 1960, the Cougars, which included USF Hall of Fame members Bob Young and Reid Beier, were 6-2 with a 188-to-151 scoring margin. In 1966 and 1967, USF put together a 13-5 combined record (6-3, 7-2). Later in 1980, the Cougars began a six-year winning run of 38-18, including a 6-3-1 record in 1981 when the Cougars captured their first-ever league title, winning the SDIC. The 1981 team produced the school's first-ever league title as the Cougars won the SDIC. In a 9-1 campaign in 1982 USF held a 234-to-92 scoring edge but finished second in the SDIC, although they were ranked ninth in the NAIA poll as Dave Schroeder was named the District 12 Coach of the Year.

Head Coach Bob Young took over 1984, directing the Cougars to its most successful period ever. In 22 seasons (1983-2004), Young led his teams to a 172-69-3 (.711) record and the school's first NAIA championship in 1996 (47-25 win over Western Washington). In his first season in 1984, USF went 8-2 with an SDIC title and a 233-to-145 scoring edge. In 1988, USF had the school's best season in history as they went 10-1 with a 14-9 playoff loss (first-ever playoff berth) to Northwestern (Iowa) spoiling an undefeated regular season. They finished ranked 8th in the final NAIA DII poll. It was the first time that USF had won 10 straight games. Bob Booth was named the SDIC MVP, USF's first league MVP. Bob Young was named Coach of the Year. Booth was the first defensive player to win the award since 1981.

By 1994, the Cougars were ready to take a step up. After going 18-22 over the previous four seasons (1990-93), the Cougars put together an 8-2 campaign before going 11-1 in 1995 as they went unbeaten in the regular season. A 42-17 loss to U-Mary ended the perfect run. But it was a precursor of things to come.

In 1996, the Cougars, who were ranked as high as #2 in the national rankings in the regular season, dominated from start to finish as they opening with a 58-6 decision against Concordia (Neb.). In the opening four games, USF had a 199-to-61 scoring edge. It was a margin that continued as the Cougars rolled up a 636-to-227 scoring margin. After an unbeaten season, which included six games of 50 points or more, USF defeated U-Mary, 56-19, gaining a little revenge for the loss in 1995. Then they defeated rival Northwestern (Iowa), 52-21,

and edged Evangel (Mo.), 28-22. In the finals, the Cougars received a big-time performance from quarterback Kurtiss Riggs, who completed 25-of-33 passes for 431 yards and five TD in a 47-25 win over Western Washington (11-2) before 4,000 in attendance Jim Carroll Stadium in Savannah, Tenn. Both USF and #6 Western Washington played in their first ever championship game. In the win, David Ruter, who had 19 carries for 55 yards and four catches for 98 yards, scored three TDs, including receptions of 20 and 64 yards and a nine-yard run. Riggs, who was the Offensive Player of the Game, connected with Kalen DeBoer, who caught 10 passes for 131 yards, for two TDs (5, 19). DeBoer also had a 54-yard TD run. Overall, the Cougars had 518 yards in total offense. Jeremy Gardner also cracked 100 yards receiving with six receptions for 133 yards. USF defensive end Travis Dumke (eight tackles, 2 TFLs) was the Defensive Player of the Game.

Before Coach Young retired in 2004, he started USF on its greatest run of success. From 2001-to-2010 the Cougars compiled an unbelievable mark of 127-9 or a winning percentage of .934. In USF's run, they reached the quarterfinals in the NAIA every year while win three national titles, and finishing second three times with two semifinal appearances. In that run, every USF team won at least 10 games. In 2001, Young took the Cougars to the finals, falling to Georgetown, Kentucky, 49-27, in a season when they finished 12-2 and won a GPAC title. A year later, they were unbeaten in the regular season and 12-1 overall as USF, which won the GPAC again, reached the national semifinals where the Cougars lost to Carroll College (Mt.), 20-17. The Cougars again claimed the GPAC crown and had a second straight unbeaten regular season in 2003. After two playoff wins, including a 33-7 win over Northwestern (IA), the Cougars dropped a 16-13 loss to Northwest Oklahoma State in the national semifinals. In Young's final season (2004), the Cougars had a third straight unbeaten regular season before falling to Azusa Pacific, 24-3 in the quarterfinals. Young ended his career by guiding the Cougars to 44 straight regular season wins, including perfect regular seasons from 2002-04. In 2005, Kalen DeBoer, a wide receiver on the 1996 title winning team, took over the USF program.

In a five-year run, DeBoer led USF to a record of 67-3 (.957) and three national titles. Under his watch, the Cougars captured four GPAC titles, three national titles and had a streak of 50 straight home wins. DeBoer's first season in 2005 ended in an 11-2 record and a trip to the national quarterfinals. In the that second round playoff game, USF fell to Carroll College, 55-0. In 2006, the Cougars defeated St. Francis (Ind.), 23-19, in a title game that matched teams with the same mascot name and abbreviation (USF). The Cougars, which broke from a 13-13 halftime tie with 10 points in a four-minute period of the third quarter, won by forcing four turnovers, including three fumbles. Before a crowd of 5,805 at Jim Carroll Stadium in Savannah, Tenn., USF, which was ranked #2 in the country, won the 51st annual NAIA national title as QB Chad Cavender (15-of-21-155) was named game MVP.

In 2008, the Cougars winning streak continued all the way to Rome, GA. The #2 Cougars defeated #1 Carroll College, 23-7, to win a second title in three seasons. Before 6,500, the Cougars scored TDs on offense, defense and special teams. Carroll had won five of the six previous championships including the 17-9 win in 2007 over USF. In a season when USF recorded seven shutouts, an eighth nearly came in the championship game but Carroll scored with 6:15 to play in the game. In total, USF allowed just 83 points all season, a school record. In the 14-0 season, the Cougars had a 125-to-26 advantage in four playoff wins. Three times scored seven points or less in the playoffs. A year later, the Cougar Pride kept rolling. In a 15-0 season, USF had an 184-to-70 edge in the playoffs. One of the school's most memorable wins occurred in the 15-0 campaign in 2009. The then NAIA Cougars defeated NCAA DII power North Dakota, 28-13, in Grand Forks. In the 2009 championship game, USF edge #3 Lindenwood (13-1), 25-22 in Rome, Ga. Braden Wieking, a Sioux Falls native, was offensive player of the game with three field goals and two extra points. Linebacker Dominic Studzinski was defensive player of the game after seven tackles and two sacks. A Wieking field goal from 42 yards gave USF a lead they didn't relinquish as USF increased their winning streak to 29 straight games. After the season, HC Kalen DeBoer took a position at Southern Illinois and USF hired Jed Stugart, who led USF to a 13-1 season. In fact, the 29-game streak went to 42 straight before a loss to nemesis Carroll College, 10-7 in the title game. USF won a 10th straight GPAC title. The next year in 2011, the program began a transition to NCAA DII.

USF opened with a 9-2 season in 2012 when they earned their first-ever national ranking, rising as high as #17. The Cougars also registered their first win

over a NCAA DII ranked squad (St. Cloud State, 32-19). After going 6-5 in 2013, the Cougars registered an 11-1 season in 2014. That season was magical with the team's then highest DII ranking of #10 on Oct. 27. The Cougars were ranked nine straight weeks. In December, 2014, USF defeated Central Oklahoma, 42-10 in the Mineral Water Bowl in Excelsior Springs, Mo. It was USF's first ever postseason appearance at DII. The momentum continued in 2015 as the Cougars rolled to a 9-3 season, which included its first ever DII playoff appearance. While USF lost at Henderson State, 23-16, it was a year to remember as the Cougars opened 7-0 and earned its first ever top five ranking in both the AFCA Coaches Poll and D2football.com. In 2016, the Cougars captured their first NSIC Championship, rolling to an 11-0 record in the regular season and a 12-1 overall mark. USF advanced to the "Sweet 16" and hosted two playoff games.

With its third consecutive berth in the NCAA DII playoffs and a 9-3 record in 2017, USF extended its all-time consecutive winning seasons to 24, which ranks fifth best across all divisions and tops in NCAA DII. The Cougars lost to No. 5 Midwestern State, 24-20 in the playoffs on the road. USF, directed by HC Jon Anderson, had 14 players named all-league; linebacker Dennis Gardeck was NSIC Newcomer of the Year and named to five All-American teams; 25 student-athletes named Academic All-NSIC and Nicholas Stanke and Austin Schaffer were named CoSIDA First Team Academic All-Americans.
