#1 Mavericks Begin Road Trip on Saturday at Bemidji State Kickoff is Scheduled for 1:00 p.m.

MANKATO, Minn. --- The top-rated Minnesota State football team begins a two-game road trip this Saturday as it travels to Bemidji State to wrap up the northern portion of its NSIC schedule. Kickoff is scheduled for 1:00 p.m.

Our History: The 2018 season marks the school's 92nd season playing football. The Mavericks are 458-384-28 (.542) in 870 games since their inception as a varsity sport in 1922. Minnesota State is in its 10th season in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference and owns an 96-13 (.880) record in league action. Over the course of its history, MSU has claimed 22 conference championships, including 14 NIC titles and five NSIC championships. The Mavericks also made their 10th appearance in the NCAA Tournament last season. MSU owns a 9-10 overall record in NCAA postseason play.

Grabbing the Reins: The 2018 season marks the ninth season with Head Coach **Todd Hoffner** on the sidelines. During his nine seasons at Minnesota State, Hoffner has compiled an 86-20 (.811) record, including four NSIC Championships and five trips to the NCAA Tournament in 2008, 2009, 2014, 2015 and 2017.

Against the Beavers: Saturday's game between Minnesota State and Bemidji State marks their 48th all-time meeting, with the Mavericks leading the series with a 30-15-2 record. BSU won their last meeting 45-17 during the 2016 season at Blakeslee Stadium. MSU owns a 14-9 road record against the Beavers.

In 2016, Minnesota State recorded 352 yards of total offense against the Beavers, including 179 rushing yards. In comparison, BSU notched 563 yards of offense, including 306 passing yards.

Junior **Ryan Schlichte** threw for 112 yards and a touchdown. Schlichte also recorded 51 rushing yards and a touchdown carry. Junior **Shane Zylstra** caught a touchdown pass as well. Senior **Zach Dodge** tallied seven tackles, with senior **Michael Palme** following right behind with six.

Last Week for the Mavericks: Minnesota State improved to 7-0 last weekend as it defeated Minot State 62-13 at Blakeslee Stadium. The Mavericks have now won 20 consecutive NSIC games dating back to week 10 of the 2016 season.

The Mavericks more than doubled the Beavers' offensive output as they notched 305 rushing yards and 290 passing yards. The Beavers managed 241 yards of total offense, with 183 yards coming through the air. MSU's 595 yards of offense are the most since the Mavericks recorded 607 yards of offense against Midwestern State last season in the NCAA Tournament.

All three Maverick quarterbacks threw at least one touchdown pass Saturday afternoon as they combined to for 290 yards and five touchdowns. Sophomore **JD Ekowa** completed nine passes for 168 yards and two touchdowns, while junior **Ryan Schlichte** threw for 111 yards and two touchdowns.

Seven Mavericks caught at least one pass, including junior **Shane Zylstra** who led the

MSU receiving corps with eight catches for 132 yards and three touchdowns. This is the third time this season that Zylstra has recorded more than 100 receiving yards in a game. Junior **Tyler Schmidt** and sophomore **Parker Gloudemans** each caught a touchdown pass as well.

Senior **Michael Palme** led the Maverick defense with six tackles, while sophomore **Jake Schaper** posted four tackles and recovered a fumble.

Sophomore **Justin Taormina** also returned a Minot State kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown.

Last Week for the Beavers: Bemidji State dropped to 5-2 last weekend as it fell to Upper Iowa 27-24. BSU led 24-6 with 8:48 to go in the third quarter, but UIU tallied 21 unanswered points to end the game with the three point win.

As a team, BSU recorded 335 yards of offense against the Peacocks, including 229 rushing yards. UIU managed to record 399 yards of offense, including 248 passing yards.

Jared Henning completed eight passes for 89 yards. Landon Jones caught four passes for 54 yards. Jones also returned the game's opening kickoff 96 yards for a touchdown.

Andrew Lackowski led the BSU rushing attack with 121 yards and two touchdowns.

Justin Van Houtan and Gunner Olszewski

led the Beaver defense with 12 tackles each. Olszewski, Michael Junker and John Vogeler each recorded an interception as well.

Concerning the Mavericks: Minnesota State improved to 7-0 last weekend as it bested Minot State 62-13.

As a unit, Minnesota State is averaging 44.7 points and 479.7 yards of offense a game this season. In comparison, opposing teams are averaging 18.0 points and 297.6 yards of offense a game.

Junior **Nate Gunn** leads the MSU rushing attack with 702 rushing yards and 12 touchdowns. Sophomore **Justin Taormina** has notched 314 rushing yards and a touchdown, while sophomore **JD Ekowa** has added 266 yards and three touchdowns.

Junior **Ryan Schlichte** has thrown for 1,160 yards and nine touchdowns this season. He is averaging 165.7 passing yards a game and has completed 61.7% of his passes.

The Maverick receiving corps is led by the duo of juniors **Shane Zylstra** and **Justin Arnold**. Zylstra has tallied 657 receiving yards and nine touchdown catches, while Arnold has caught 22 passes for 300 yards and a touchdown.

Juniors **Alex Goettl** leads the MSU defense with 39 tackles, including 8.5 for a loss and 3.5 sacks. Sophomore **Chance Bowen** has tallied 21 tackles, including 10.0 for a loss

and 9.0 sacks as well. Sophomore **Cade Johnson** has also recorded 32 tackles, including four for a loss.

Concerning the Beavers: Bemidji State enters the weekend with a 5-2 record, including a 27-24 road loss at Upper Iowa last weekend.

As a unit, BSU is averaging 38.3 points and 400.7 yards of offense per game. Opponents have averaged 14.4 points and 310.4 yards of offense per game.

Andrew Lackowski and Jalen Frye lead the Bemidji State rushing attack this season. Lackowski has notched 523 rushing yards and seven touchdowns, while Frye has posted 501 yards and two touchdowns.

Jared Henning has thrown for 468 yards and five touchdowns this season, with Alec Ogden following with 289 yards and five touchdown passes.

Landon Jones leads the BSU receiving corps with 450 yards and four touchdowns. Mannie Kugmeh and Jacob Anderson have each caught three touchdown passes as well.

Gunner Olszewski leads the Beaver defense with 58 tackles, to go along with two interceptions. Michael Junker has tallied 37 tackles and a team-best four interceptions. Gabe Ames leads the BSU defense with 8.5 tackles for a loss.

Football Luncheon: The Minnesota State

football luncheons will take place the day before each home game at 11:45 a.m., at the Loose Moose. The luncheons will feature a coach's presentation, Q&A with Maverick student-athletes and video. The luncheons are open to the public.

NCAA Playoff History: The Mavericks own a 9-10 all-time record in the NCAA Tournament, including a 7-6 mark at Blakeslee Stadium. MSU defeated CSU-Pueblo (16-13 OT) and Midwestern State (63-21) before falling to Texas A&M-Commerce (31-21) in the third round of the NCAA Tournament last season.

What a Stretch: Minnesota State's 40-game NSIC winning streak came to an end as it fell to Winona State 31-27 in 2015 (10/24/15). MSU began the winning streak back on week one of the 2012 season. MSU's 40 straight conference victories set an NSIC record, passing the previous record of 34 consecutive wins set by Minnesota Morris from 1975-79.

In the Second Half: The Mavericks have outscored their opponents 130-42 in the second half this season.

This is Our House: Minnesota State owns a 4-0 record at Blakeslee Stadium. Since joining the NSIC in 2008, the Mavericks have posted a 61-11 (.847) record at home.

Strong on the Road: Prior to its road loss to Winona State in 2016, Minnesota State had won its previous 24 road games dating back to week one of the 2012 season.

Head Coach Todd Hoffner

Todd Hoffner enters his ninth season as head coach of the Minnesota State football program.

Over the course of eight seasons, Hoffner has led Minnesota State to a five NCAA playoff appearances (2008, 2009, 2014 & 2015) including an appearance at the NCAA National Championship game in 2014. The Mavericks also advanced to a Mineral Water Bowl game in 2011. He owns an overall record of 86-20 with the Mavericks.

Under Hoffner, the Mavericks have won four NSIC Championships (2011, 2014, 2015 & 2017) and six NSIC South Division Championships (2008, 2009, 2011, 2014, 2015 & 2017).

In 2008, Hoffner transformed a team that finished 4-7 the year before into a team which finished 9-3, won the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference South Division, and qualified for the NCAA tournament for the fourth time in school history. The Mavericks finished the season ranked #23 in the nation, marking the third time in school history that the Mavericks were ranked at the conclusion of the season by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA).

In 2009, Minnesota State played to a 10-2 record and was named the NSIC South Division champions. The Mavericks qualified for their second straight NCAA appearance and hosted the first playoff game in the history of Blakeslee Stadium. The Mavericks finished the year ranked #12 in the AFCA coaches poll.

In 2010, the Mavericks finished 6-5, securing the 45th winning season in program history and marking the first time since 1991-94 that MSU has recorded three straight winning seasons.

The 2011 season saw the Mavericks finish with a 9-3 record, including a 28-14 win postseason over Northeastern State in the Mineral Water Bowl. With its 9-3 record, MSU recorded its fourth straight winning season. The Mavericks earned a share of the NSIC Regular Season Championship and the NSIC South Division Championship.

The 2014 season proved to be one for the record books as Hoffner guided the Maverick football program to a 14-1 record, en route to its first appearance in the NCAA National Championship game. The Mavericks finished the season #2 in the AFCA coaches poll.

MSU would keep things rolling with home field advantage in the NCAA Tournament as it defeated Pittsburg State (24-21 OT), Minnesota Duluth (44-17) and Concord (47-13) to advance to the NCAA Championship game against CSU-Pueblo.

MSU would establish several program records during its historic season including points scored (600), rushing yards (3,625), total offense (6,704) and all-purpose yards (8,103). The Maverick offense averaged 40 points per game, while the defense allowed just 12.9 points per contest as opposing offenses managed to score just 193 points in 15 games.

The 2015 season saw the Mavericks three-peat as NSIC Champions as they finished the season with a 10-2 overall record. MSU also advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the fourth time during his tenure at MSU where it faced Emporia State in the first round. A total of five Mavericks received at least one All-American honor as well, while 12 Mavericks received All-NSIC honors.

Highlights from Minnesota State's 2015 season would include the Mavericks' home opener against Minnesota Duluth where the Mavericks erased a 17-point deficit to defeat the Bulldogs 20-17 in front of 6,378 fans. The Mavericks would then go on to set a Blakeslee Stadium attendance record of 7,187 fans who witnessed MSU's 35-27 homecoming victory over Augustana.

The 2016 season saw the Mavericks finish their season with an 8-3 record, marking the seventh time the Mavericks have finished their season with a winning record under Hoffner. In total, eight Mavericks went on to receive All-NSIC honors and five would claim Don Hansen All-Central Region accolades. Zach Dodge would go on to receive Don Hansen All-American honors as well.

Highlights from the 2016 season include MSU's 45-12 road victory over St. Cloud State, which included a 28-point effort in the second quarter. MSU followed up with another 45-point performance two weeks later as the Mavericks defeated Concordia-St. Paul 45-10 in their annual homecoming game, marking Hoffner's sixth homecoming victory. Minnesota State then went on to spoil the homecoming festivities at Augustana as the Mavericks defeated the Vikings 42-35.

In 2017, Mavericks returned to dominance in the NSIC as they finished the regular season with an 11-0 record, to go along with an NSIC Championship and an NSIC South Division Championship. Highlights of Minnesota State's regular season include its 38-23 win over #20 Minnesota Duluth on the road, MSU's 42-21 win over Augustana during its annual Homecoming Game and its 27-23 road victory over #13 Sioux Falls during the regular season finale. A total of 16 Mavericks would receive All-NSIC honors for their efforts and three of them, Casey Bednarski, Evan Perrizo and Jake Porter would go on to claim All-American accolades.

Behind its 11-0 record, the Mavericks made their fifth appearance in the NCAA Tournament under Hoffner. MSU would open the tournament against #20 CSU-Pueblo in a rematch of the 2014 NCAA Championship. The ThunderWolves were able to jump out to an early 10-0 lead, but the Mavericks responded two field goals and touchdown to take a 13-10 lead with just over 13 minutes to go in the game. CSU-Pueblo was able to knot up the score at 13-13, but MSU prevailed in overtime as Casey Bednarski drilled a 37-yard field goal to give MSU the 16-13 win. MSU followed with a dominating 63-21 win over #5 Midwestern State in the second round of the tournament, before falling to Texas A&M-Commerce 31-21 in the third round of the NCAA Tournament.

In eight seasons under Hoffner, 121 Mavericks have earned All-NSIC South Division honors, including 16 during the 2017 season. In 2009, Hoffner was named the NSIC Coach of the Year and the AFCA Region 5 Coach of the Year. He has also seen five of his players receive extra recognition from the NSIC including NSIC Defensive Newcomer of the Year Junior Aumavae in 2009, NSIC Defensive Player of the Year Joshua Gordon in 2014 & 2015 and NSIC Offensive Newcomer of the Year Nick Pieruccini in 2014. In 2017, Shane Zylstra was named the NSIC Offensive Player of the Year and Nate Gunn was named the NSIC Offensive Newcomer of the Year.

During his time at Minnesota State, Hoffner has seen two players earn invitations to NFL training camps in Junior Aumavae (Dallas Cowboys) and offensive lineman Adrian Battles (Minnesota Vikings). Following his release from the Vikings, Battles signed with the Green Bay Packers as a practice squad player where he eventually went on to win a Super Bowl ring in 2011. Some of Hoffner's first recruits in the the summer of 2008 include Adam Thielen and Chris Reed, who have both continued on to the NFL.

During his eight years at MSU, 85 Mavericks have earned Academic All-NSIC honors and five went on to claim CoSIDA Academic All-American honors, including Josh Meeker, Justin Otto, Jake Porter, Jeffrey Raymond and Connor Thomas. The Mavericks have also been active in the community as they have participated in youth reading programs, the Million Tree Project.

A 1989 Valley City (N.D.) State grad where he was a cornerback on the football team and a 400-meter hurdler on the track team, Hoffner earned a master's degree from North Dakota in 1991. A native of Esmond, N.D., Hoffner and his wife, Melodee, have three children.

Gimme' Eleven: With its 7-0 record this season, Minnesota State has strung together 11 winning seasons in a row. MSU's 11 winning seasons in a row are the most in program history.

NSIC Players of the Week: Junior **Alex Goettl** was named the NSIC Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts against St. Cloud State in week five. Goettl returned a fumble for a touchdown and returned an interception to the SCSU three.

Sophomore **Justin Taormina** was named the NSIC Special Teams Player of the Week for his efforts against Minot State. Taormina returned a kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown and averaged 44 yards in his three returns.

All-NSIC Honorees: A total of 16 Mavericks received All-NSIC honors last season, including 11 players who claimed All-NSIC First Team accolades. Junior **Shane Zylstra** was named the NSIC Offensive Player of the Year, while junior **Nate Gunn** was named

the Offensive Newcomer of the Year.

In the Trenches: Minnesota State has rushed for 1,742 yards this season, compared to 502 yards by its opponents. MSU rushers are averaging 5.4 yards per carry.

Air Traffic: Maverick quarterbacks have thrown for 1,616 yards this season, compared to 1,581 yards by their opponents. Maverick receivers are averaging 15.8 yards per catch.

On Third Down: MSU is 43-of-90 (48%) on third down conversions this season. Its opponents are 31-of-100 (31%) on third down conversions.

Offensive Onslaught: As a team, MSU is averaging 479.7 yards of offense per game this season, including 248.9 yards on the ground. In comparison, its opponents are averaging 297.6 yards of offense a game.

On Defense: MSU has allowed 18 points per game this season, while the Mavericks have scored 44.7 points per game.

Southern Domination: During the last four seasons, NSIC South Division teams put together a combined record of 80-40 against NSIC North Division opponents. Since the 2012 season, Minnesota State has put together a 27-2 record against north division opponents.

On Fourth Down: The Mavericks are 6-of-11 (55%) on fourth down attempts this season. Their opponents are 6-of-13 (46%) in fourth down attempts.

Several Targets: A total of 11 Mavericks have caught at least one pass this season. Junior **Shane Zylstra** leads the Mavericks with 35 catches for 657 yards and nine touchdowns. Junior **Justin Arnold** has caught 22 passes for 300 yards and a touchdown as well. Sophomore **Parker Gloude** has caught two touchdown passes also.

Make it Seven: Junior **Nate Gunn** rushed for more than 100 yards in MSU's first seven games last season. He is the first Maverick to rush for more than 100 rushing yards in seven straight games since TJ Schraufnagel did so back in 1999. Gunn has rushed for more than 100 yards in 14 games in his career with the Mavericks, including four this season.

I'm in Range: Senior kicker **Casey Bednarski** was 25-of-27 in field goal

attempts last season. He was also 3-of-5 in attempts from 50 yards or more last season (Made 63, 50, 51/Missed 55, 51). Bednarski's 25 field goals and 134 points last season are both MSU single-season records. This season he is 5-of-7 in field goal attempts
