## BSU to host top-NSIC Bulldogs

### Soccer Notebook

- Heading into the second to last weekend of the regular season, the Bemidji State University soccer team is getting ready to host Minnesota Duluth on Friday. The Bulldogs currently sit atop the NSIC standings in first place. On Sunday the Beavers will pack up and head over to Wisconsin-Superior for a late nonconference match.
- Last weekend saw the Beavers go into an offensive slump as they were unable to score a goal. However, BSU's defense was solid only allowing one goal in each game last weekend. The University of Mary downed Bemidji State with a goal in the second half, while Northern needed extra minutes to knock off the Beavers.
- **Ashlee Ellefsen** (Jr., Hugo, Minn.) needs only one goal or two assists to break the all-time school record in points scored in a career. She currently has 70 and the record is at 71. If she gets another assist she will also set another school record for most assists in a season, currently at seven. Ellefsen also only needs four more goals to break the school record for most goals in a career.
- **Samantha Ross** (Jr., Stillwater, Minn.) made 14 saves last weekend off of 16 shots on goal. Her play was crucial in keeping the Beavers in the game last weekend even though they were unable to score.
- Plagued by late season injuries, the Beavers have lost three players in the past two weeks due to injuries. **Kim Sorteberg** (Sr., Anoka, Minn.), **Tiffany VanHaften** (Fr., Chaska, Minn.), and **Jenny Stromberg** (Jr., Elk River, Minn.) will all miss the rest of the regular season due to injury.

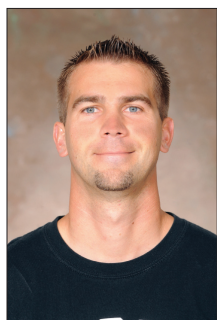

## Head Coach Jim Stone



On July 23, 2002, Bemidji State University took an integral step toward developing a competitive women's soccer program with the hiring of Jim Stone as head coach. The BSU soccer program had never won more than the four victories Stone's squad achieved in 2002.

Stone has the highest win percentage in BSU history (.510), along with the most wins (72). He is the only coach in BSU soccer history with a record greater than or equal to .500 in conference play.

The 2005 season was a record-breaking year for the Beavers. As a team BSU set or tied numerous records, including most wins (12) and most shutouts (10) in a season. The Beavers were also the 12th most improved team in the nation that year.

Under Stone's guidance BSU has been well represented on the NSIC All-Conference teams and garnered its first ever All-American in 2005. Juniors Ashlee Ellefsen (Hugo, Minn.) and Alysha Domiano (Dayton, Minn.) both garnered post-season honors during their freshman campaigns, with Ellefsen being named to the All-NSIC Second Team and Domiano earning All-NSIC Honorable Mention honors. Ellefsen was then named All-NSIC Third Team, Daktronics First-Team All-Region, and Daktronics All-America Honorable Mention in her sophomore year.

Domiano (2008 third team), Megan Wallner (2007 third team), Erin Foss (2005 second team) and Cristina Egnell (2004 third team, 2005 first team) have all been named to CoSIDA Academic All-District squads under Stone's tutelage.

## Scouting Minnesota Duluth (11-2-1, 9-1-0 NSIC)

- Minnesota Duluth is currently on a five-game winning streak coming off a weekend that saw the Bulldogs take games away from the University of Mary, 2-1, and Northern State, 2-0.
- Clare Dahmen netted both of the game-winning goals over the weekend for UMD. Dahmen responded to a Northern State goal with the game-winner in the Bulldogs' 2-1 victory on Saturday, before scoring the opening goal in UMD's 2-0 victory over Mary on Sunday. She now has five game-winning scores on the year, all of which have come in NSIC matches.
- Bulldog keeper Hannah Bengtson allowed just one goal over the weekend, leading UMD to a 2-0 showing in the two games against Northern State and Mary. She made a total of six saves in 180:00 of action, including earning the shutout in the Bulldogs' Sunday 2-0 victory over the Marauders. The clean sheet was her ninth of the season, tied for most among league net minders. Bengtson, who has allowed just four goals in 10 conference games this season, now leads NSIC goalies in goals against average (0.40) and saves percentage (.917), when it comes to conference matches.

## Scouting Wisconsin-Superior (3-15-0, 0-7-0 WIAC)

- UW-Superior is currently in last place in the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC).
- This past week saw the Yellowjackets drop a game to WIAC rival UW-Stout, 3-0, then beat Northland International 1-0 on Sunday. They then played another game on Wednesday losing to St. Catherine (Minn.) 3-0.
- The Yellowjackets have been outscored 98-18 so far this season.
- UW-Superior is led by Jenna Bartsias who has 7 points on the year (3G 1A).
- Felicia Bibeau has been in net for the majority of the season for the Yellowjackets posting a .682 save percentage off of 161 Saves.
