Senior **Zuzana Tomcikova** (G, Bratislava, Slovakia) picked up her 17th shutout of her career while setting career marks in saves and minutes played in goal.

Head Coach Steve Sertich



Steve Sertich enters his sixth season as head coach of the BSU women's hockey program. Sertich has helped propel the program to heights never seen before. At the conclusion of the 2010-11 season, the team finished in sole possession of fifth place in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association, a program best. The same season saw the Beavers

open their new home, the Sanford Center, and claim the best home winning record in program history going 9-5-2 on home ice. The Beavers also captured their first-ever wins over a top-ranked team, a 5-3 win over then-No. 1 Mercyhurst Oct. 16, 2010, and their first-ever win over Minnesota Duluth, a 1-0 win Nov. 5, 2011.

In the spring on 2010, Sertich was inducted into the Minnesota High School Hockey Coaches Hall of Fame. The honor, which is bestowed by the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association, is given to coaches that have outstanding contributions to the sport of hockey in the state of Minnesota.

Under his tutelage, the BSU women's hockey team has posted its most conference wins in a single season, with nine in both 2009-10 and 2006-07. Sertich has also coached two Olympians while at Bemidji State, Nina Ziegenhals who played for Team Germany in the 2002 Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City, and Zuzana Tomcikova who played for Team Slovakia in the 2010 Winter Olympics in Vancouver

During summer 2008, Sertich served as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's Under-22 Select team that played in the annual three-game Women's Under-22 Series with Canada, which took place from Aug. 20-23.

Sertich was a member of the U.S. National Team from 1973-75. He was also a member of the 1976 U.S. Olympic team, which finished fifth at the Innsbruck, Austria games. The U.S. team recorded wins over Finland and Poland en route to a 2-3 finish in Group A.

He also played two years in the German Professional League, spending the 1974-75 season as captain for Fussen and two seasons from 1978-80 playing for Nurnburg.

Sertich is a 1974 graduate of Colorado College with a bachelor's degree in elementary education and humanities. He received a master's degree in elementary education from Minnesota State in 1999.

Sensational Senior Class

• The BSU senior class consisting of Kimberly Lieder, Alana McElhinney, Zuzana Tomcikova, Montana Vichorek, Marlee Wheelhouse and Lauren Williams needs only one win to surpass the career wins mark by a four-year class. The group tied the mark with a 4-0 win over Minnesota State Jan. 7. The mark is currently shared at 45 wins held with the 2003 graduating class of Bre Dedrickson, Kerri McEwen, Amber Fryklund, Lisa Peters, Amy Shepler, Alicia Kinsman and Lili Raynard.

Pivotal Series

• This weekend's match-up between Ohio State University and Bemidji State University is a pivotal one as it pits the fifth and sixth place teams in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) standings. The Buckeyes currently hold a one point advantage in the standings over the Beavers as both teams are vying to position themselves to host the first round of the WCHA playoffs. In the current format of the conference tournament, the top four teams host the bottom four teams in a first round best-of-three playoff series with the winner going on to the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth, Minn. Currently only six points separate the sixth-place team (Bemidji State) and the third-place team (University of North Dakota) making the outcome of this weekend's series very important for the rest of the season.

Poll Position

• The Beavers have been a staple in the national polls this season. Bemidji State has been in the top 10 in the last four *USCHO.com* polls including a program-best No. 7 ranking Dec. 5. The Beavers have been in the last five *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* polls. The Beavers are currently No. 9 in both polls after a disappointing split with Minnesota State University at Sanford Center last weekend.

Helping From The Blue Line

• **Montana Vichorek** (Sr., D, Moose Lake, Minn.) needs only two assists to tie Lisa Peters' mark for assists by a defenseman. Vichorek added two helpers in last Saturday's 2-0 win over Minnesota State. She has 50 assists in her career which is also good for eighth for all position players in BSU history. Vichorek has also recently found her way into the top 10 for scoring on BSU's career list as she is currently tied with Caesare Stimson with 67 career points.

Three Is The Magic Number

• When you see the number three on the scoreboard it is a good sign that BSU might pick up the win. The Beavers are 13-1-1 this season when scoring over three goals in a game. They are also 12-3-0 when they limit opponents to three or less goals this year.

Kelly Named WCHA Rookie of the Week...Again

• **Rachael Kelly** (Fr., F, Rosemount, Minn.) garnered *WCHA Rookie of the Week* honors Jan. 11 for the second time this season. Kelly picked up the honor earlier this season after tallying a vital goal in BSU's upset of then-No. 2 University of Minnesota Oct. 9. Kelly was selected this week after notching two assists in the Beavers' 4-0 win over Minnesota State.

Erickson Breaks Into Top 10 For Goals

• Emily Erickson's goal against Wisconsin was her 32nd of her career catapulting her into the top 10 all-time for goals in a career. Erickson needs only one more point to break into the top 10 for points in a career.

Cleaning Up

• The Bemidji State Beavers have picked up three sweeps this season with two wins against Robert Morris University, University of Maine and WCHA foe St. Cloud State University. The sweep of St. Cloud State was the first conference sweep of the season for BSU.

More Power

• The BSU power play is currently ranked fourth in the nation with 27 goals on 103 attempts. **Montana Vichorek** (Sr., D, Moose Lake, Minn.) is tied for fourth nationally with six power-play goals this season.

Home Grown

• BSU has found success recruiting all over Minnesota and has delved into Canada for some talent but currently the Beavers' five leading scorers all hail from Northern Minnesota. **Sadie Lundquist** of Cloquet is currently BSU's leading scorer with nine goals and 18 assists. **Emily Erickson** of Coleraine has chipped in 10 goals and 12 assists. Defensemen **Montana Vichorek** of Moose Lake and **Erika and Marlee Wheelhouse** round out BSU's leading scorers this season.

Moving Forward

• The Bemidji State defense has done a great job of helping score goals this season. The Beaver defensemen have accounted for 71 of 195 points this season. Three players (**Montana Vichorek**, **Marlee Wheelhouse** and **Erika Wheelhouse**) rank in the top 10 in the nation for defenseman scoring and are also among BSU's top five scorers this season. The BSU blue liners have scored 22 goals and tallied 49 assists this season led by Vichorek's seven and 14 assists.

Can't Stop, Won't Stop

• The Bemidji State women's hockey team has been a scoring machine this season accounting for 72 goals in 23 games. BSU's 11 goals against Lindenwood marked their highest scoring output since tallying 15 goals versus Wayne State University in 1999.

Wheelhouse Selected WCHA Defensive Player of the Week

• **Erika Wheelhouse** (Jr., D, Crookston, Minn.) earned *WCHA Defensive Player of the Week* honors for a second time this season after notching a goal and three assists to help BSU to a split with No. 6 North Dakota. Wheelhouse also earned the honor after tallying six assists on the weekend against Ohio State University Oct. 7-8. The mark fell just one assist short of her season total from the 2010-11 campaign.

And The Points Keep Coming

BSU has had two players tie the school record for most points in a single game this season as **Montana Vichorek** (Sr., D, Moose Lake, Minn.) and **Sadie Lundquist** (Jr., F, Cloquet, Minn.) have each tallied six points in a game. Vichorek notched two goals and four assists in a 8-1 win over St. Cloud State University while Lundquist tallied a goal and five assists versus Lindenwood University. Vichorek's mark also set the school record for points in a game by a defenseman. Lundquist's five assists set the school record for assists in a game.

Taking The Next Step

• With the program's start this season the Beavers appear to be taking the next step in building BSU into a nationally respected program. This can be evidenced in the strides made by several players this season. 10 Beaver skaters have already established career-bests for points in a season and BSU is only 23 games into the season. These players are; **Molly Arola** (5 points), **Tess Dusik** (8 points), **Kimberly Lieder** (6 points), **Sadie Lundquist** (27 points), **Emily McKnight** (3 points), **Mackenzie Thurston** (9 points), **Montana Vichorek** (21 points), **Erika Wheelhouse** (21 points), **Marlee Wheelhouse** (20 points) and **Abby Williams** (6 points).

Hard Work Pays Off

• After nearly two-and-a-half years with the program third-string goaltender **Jessica Havel** (Jr., Grand Rapids, Minn.) finally saw her first career action in the third period against Lindenwood University. Havel notched 10 saves in the third period for the Beavers.

Chart Toppers

• BSU currently has players in the top 10 in several categories nationally. The Beavers have three players ranked among the top 10 for points per game for defensemen; **Montana Vichorek** (5) , **Erika Wheelhouse** (9) and **Marlee Wheelhouse** (10). In addition, **Zuzana Tomcikova** is ranked in the top 10 for shutouts (T8). **Sadie Lundquist** is ranked in a tie for fourth for power-play goals. **Rachael Kelly** ranks in a tie for seventh for game-winning goals with three. As a team for the Beavers are in the top 10 for power play (4).

Comeback Kids

• The Bemidji State University women's hockey team has shown time and time again this season that they are poised in the face of adversity. After mounting two comebacks against Ohio State University the week prior. BSU did it again as they came from behind in the waning minutes against Maine to come away with an overtime victory over the Black Bears, 3-2. BSU was down 2-1 with less than two minutes left when they pulled the goaltender in order to go on a six-on-four skater advantage via a power play. **Emily Erickson** (R-Jr., F, Coleraine, Minn.) quickly netted the puck tying the game and forcing an overtime where **Tess Dusik** (So., F, Oak Bluff, Manitoba) tallied the game winner two minutes into the extra period. BSU again came back after going down 1-0 early last Sunday against Minnesota Duluth. The Beavers scored four goals in the final two periods to pick up their second-ever win over the No. 6 Bulldogs.

Overtime

• **Tess Dusik's** goal Oct. 14 against Maine gave BSU their first overtime victory since defeating Minnesota State University 2-1 Dec. 11, 2010. The overtime win was only the seventh all-time for the Beavers. BSU again went to overtime last Friday against Minnesota and suffered their first loss of the season in an overtime. The Beavers are 1-1-2 this season in overtime. Their two other
