Last Week for the Beavers

• The Bemidji State University women's hockey team set the school record with 72 shots on goal as they scored over 10 goals for the first time since tallying 15 goals against Wayne State University Dec. 4, 1999 in an 11-0 win over Lindenwood University. The 11 goals serves as BSU's second-best scoring performance in school history. The Beavers had eight players score goals in the game. Sadie Lundquist (Jr., F, Cloquet, Minn.) led the squad with one goal and five assists.

Quick Take - Minnesota Duluth

• The University of Minnesota Duluth enters the weekend with a 4-5-1 record and are currently ranked 6/7 in the polls heading into their series against the Beavers. The five-time NCAA Division I National Champions have faced a tough schedule so far this year as they have had four series against opponents ranked in the top 10 nationally. UMD currently has wins over ranked foes Boston College, University of North Dakota and University of Minnesota.

Head Coach Steve Sertich



Steve Sertich enters his sixth season as head coach of the BSU women's hockey program. Sertich has helped propel the program to heights never seen before. At the conclusion of the 2010-11 season, the team finished in sole possession of fifth place in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association, a program best. The same season saw the Beavers

open their new home, the Sanford Center, and claim the best home winning record in program history going 9-5-2 on home ice. The Beavers also captured their first-ever wins over a top-ranked team, a 5-3 win over then-No. 1 Mercyhurst Oct. 16, 2010, and their first-ever win over Minnesota Duluth, a 1-0 win Nov. 5, 2011.

In the spring on 2010, Sertich was inducted into the Minnesota High School Hockey Coaches Hall of Fame. The honor, which is bestowed by the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association, is given to coaches that have outstanding contributions to the sport of hockey in the state of Minnesota.

Under his tutelage, the BSU women's hockey team has posted its most conference wins in a single season, with nine in both 2009-10 and 2006-07. Sertich has also coached two Olympians while at Bemidji State, Nina Ziegenhals who played for Team Germany in the 2002 Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City, and Zuzana Tomcikova who played for Team Slovakia in the 2010 Winter Olympics in Vancouver

During summer 2008, Sertich served as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's Under-22 Select team that played in the annual three-game Women's Under-22 Series with Canada, which took place from Aug. 20-23.

Sertich was a member of the U.S. National Team from 1973-75 He was also a member of the 1976 U.S. Olympic team, which finished fifth at the Innsbruck, Austria games. The U.S. team recorded wins over Finland and Poland en route to a 2-3 finish in Group A.

He also played two years in the German Professional League, spending the 1974-75 season as captain for Fussen and two seasons from 1978-80 playing for Nurnberg.

Sertich is a 1974 graduate of Colorado College with a bachelor's degree in elementary education and humanities. He received a master's degree in elementary education from Minnesota State in 1999.

Looking For Win No. 2

The Beavers picked up their first-ever win over University of Minnesota Duluth last season in a 1-0 victory at Sanford Center. BSU is on a quest for win No. 2 and possibly win No. 3 over the Bulldogs as they head to AMSOIL Arena for the series this weekend.

The Rookies

BSU had three players score their first career goals last Thursday against Lindenwood University as **Natasha Kostenko** (Fr., F, Fannystelle, Manitoba), **Kristin Huber** (Fr., F, Kelowna, British Columbia) and **Whitney Wivoda** (Fr., F, Fairbanks, Alaska) each tallied their first career goals in BSU's 11-0 win over the Lady Lions.

And The Points Keep Coming

BSU has had two players tie the school record for most points in a single game this season as **Montana Vichorek** (Sr., D, Moose Lake, Minn.) and **Sadie Lundquist** (Jr., F, Cloquet, Minn.) have each tallied six points in a game. Vichorek notched two goals and four assists in a 8-1 win over St. Cloud State University while Lundquist tallied a goal and five assists versus Lindenwood University. Vichorek's mark also set the school record for points in a game by a defenseman. Lundquist's five assists set the school record for assists in a game.

Taking The Next Step

• With the program's start this season the Beavers appear to be taking the next step in building BSU into a nationally respected program. This can be evidenced in the strides made by several players this season. Seven Beaver skaters have already established career-bests for points in a season and BSU is only 13 games into the season. These players are; **Molly Arola** (4 points), **Tess Dusik** (7 points), **Sadie Lundquist** (22 points), **Emily McKnight** (3 points), **Mackenzie Thurston** (6 points), **Marlee Wheelhouse** (13 points) and **Abby Williams** (6 points).

Hard Work Pays Off

• After nearly two-and-a-half years with the program third-string goaltender **Jessica Havel** (Jr., Grand Rapids, Minn.) finally saw her first career action in the third period against Lindenwood University. Havel notched 10 saves in the third period for the Beavers.

Tally Your Votes

• After falling out of the *USCHO.com* poll following a loss to Minnesota State, BSU is still receiving votes in both the *USCHO.com* and *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* polls. The Beavers have either received votes or been ranked in both polls since their victory over No. 10 Providence College Oct. 1.

Well Isn't That Special

• The BSU power play is currently ranked third in the nation with 18 goals on 54 attempts while their penalty kill is ranked sixth in the country only allowing four power-play goals this year. Combined, BSU's special teams are fifth in the nation. **Marlee Wheelhouse** (Sr., D, Crookston, Minn.) and **Sadie Lundquist** (Jr., F, Cloquet, Minn.) have each tallied four power-play goals this season to lead the Beavers and rank tied for sixth in the nation in power-play goals. BSU's 18 power-play goals already matches their total from last season.

Chart Toppers

• BSU currently has players in the top 10 in several categories nationally. **Sadie Lundquist** currently ranks among the top assist leaders in the country (5). The Beavers have three players ranked among the top 10 for points per game for defensemen; **Montana Vichorek** (3), **Erika Wheelhouse** and **Marlee Wheelhouse** (T5). In addition, **Zuzana Tomcikova** is ranked in the top 10 for save percentage (7) and shutouts (6). **Marlee Wheelhouse** and **Sadie Lundquist** are ranked in a tie for sixth for power-play goals. **Rachael Kelly** ranks in a tie for second for game-winning goals with three while **Abby Williams** is in a tie for eighth with two. As a team for the Beavers are in the top 10 for scoring offense (8), scoring defense (7), scoring margin (9), power play (3), penalty kill (5), combined special teams (5) and team winning percentage (9).

• **Zuzana Tomcikova** (Sr., G, Bratislava, Slovakia) is the career wins leader with 33 victories as the BSU netminder. The senior needs 15 games appeared in, 482 minutes played and 272 saves to surpass the career marks for those categories.

• BSU has found success recruiting all over Minnesota and has delved into Canada for some talent but currently the Beavers' five leading scorers all hail from Northern Minnesota. **Montana Vichorek** of Moose Lake and **Sadie Lundquist** of Cloquet currently lead the team with four goals and 10 assists while Coleraine-product **Emily Erickson** and Crookston-natives **Marlee and Erika Wheelhouse** have also been a huge part of the BSU scoring this season.

Moving Forward

• The Bemidji State defense has done a great job of helping score goals this season. The Beaver defensemen have accounted for 46 of 134 points this season. Three players (**Montana Vichorek**, **Marlee Wheelhouse** and **Erika Wheelhouse**) rank in the top 10 in the nation for defenseman scoring and are also among BSU's top five scorers this season. The BSU blue liners have scored 15 goals and tallied 31 assists this season led by Vichorek's five goals and 10 assists.

Can't Stop, Won't Stop

• The Bemidji State women's hockey team has been a scoring machine this season goals accounting for 49 goals in 13 games. BSU's 11 goals against Lindenwood marked their highest scoring output since tallying 15 goals versus Wayne State University in 1999.

Lets Go Smurfin'

• **Steve Sertich** chose to match-up his line of **Abby Williams, Lauren Williams** and **Kristi King** up against the daunting Minnesota line of Jen Schoullis, Sarah Erickson and Amanda Kessel Oct. 29. The line was tasked with the responsibility of serving as a defensive forward line and thus shutting down the Golden Gopher top unit. The trio did so holding Schoullis, Erickson and Kessel scoreless Saturday after the trio was responsible for all four goals in Minnesota's 4-1 victory Friday. The line of A. Williams, L. Williams and King has been dubbed the "Smurf" line after the loveable short blue creatures from the 1980s animated series. All three players are under 5-4 in height and thus have a diminutive stature similar to the "Smurfs" thus garnering the nickname.

Friendly Confines

• Bemidji State is 4-1-1 at Sanford Center this season including upset victories over No. 2 Minnesota and No. 10 Providence. BSU is 13-6-3 since opening Sanford Center Oct. 15 against Mercyhurst College. The Beavers have only been swept at Sanford Center once since moving into their new home and that was against No. 1 Wisconsin last season. The Badgers would go on to capture the NCAA Division I National Championship. BSU has had six victories over top 10 teams at Sanford Center including their first-ever win over a No. 1 opponent (Mercyhurst) and their first-ever win over No. 3 Minnesota Duluth.

Saturday Night Special

• BSU is only 2-2-2 in Friday games but has been successful avenging Friday results as they currently boast a 5-1-0 mark in games played on Saturday. The Beavers two upset wins over ranked foes came on Saturday as they defeated No. 10 Providence and No. 2 Minnesota at Sanford Center.

It Was The Best Start Ever...

• BSU's 8-3-2 start in the first 13 games is the best start Bemidji State has ever had. The start marks the first time the Beavers has ever had over six wins in the first 13 games. BSU had six wins in the first 13 games during the 1999-00 season and last season.

Poll Position

• The Bemidji State University women's hockey team was ranked in a tie for 10th with Harvard during the week of Oct. 31 in *USCHO.com* poll. The ranking was the first in program history for BSU after upsetting No. 2 University of Minnesota 2-1 Saturday at Sanford Center.

Kelly Named WCHA Rookie of the Week

• **Rachael Kelly** (Fr., F, Rosemount, Minn.) garnered WCHA Rookie of the Week honors Nov. 2 after scoring a goal to help catapult BSU to a 2-1 victory over No. 2 Minnesota. Kelly leads all Beaver newcomers in scoring with four goals and two assists.

Against Ranked Foes

• Bemidji State has started the season 2-1-1 against ranked foes as they have wins against No. 2 Minnesota and No. 10 Providence. BSU also tied No. 10 Providence. The teams only loss game in the first game against No. 2 Minnesota Friday.

Cleaning Up

• The Bemidji State Beavers have picked up two sweeps this season with two wins against University of Maine and two wins versus WCHA foe St. Cloud State University. The sweep of St. Cloud State was the first conference sweep of the season for BSU.

Comeback Kids

• The Bemidji State University women's hockey team has shown time and time again this season that they are poised in the face of adversity. After mounting two comebacks against Ohio State University the week prior. BSU did it again as they came from behind in the waning minutes against Maine to come away with an overtime victory over the Black Bears, 3-2. BSU was down 2-1 with less than two minutes left when they pulled the goaltender in order to go on a six-on-four skater advantage via a power play. **Emily Erickson** (R-Jr., F, Coleraine, Minn.) quickly netted the puck tying the game and forcing an overtime where **Tess Dusik** (So., F, Oak Bluff, Manitoba) tallied the game winner two minutes into the extra period.
