HEAD COACH STEVE SERTICH



Steve Sertich enters his sixth season as head coach of the BSU women's hockey program. Sertich has helped propel the program to heights never seen before. At the conclusion of the 2010-11 season, the team finished in sole possession of fifth place in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association, a program best. The same season saw the Beavers open their new home,

the Sanford Center, and claim the best home winning record in program history going 9-5-2 on home ice. The Beavers also captured their first-ever wins over a top-ranked team, a 5-3 win over then-No. 1 Mercyhurst Oct. 16, 2010, and their first-ever win over Minnesota Duluth, a 1-0 win Nov. 5, 2011.

In the spring on 2010, Sertich was inducted into the Minnesota High School Hockey Coaches Hall of Fame. The honor, which is bestowed by the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association, is given to coaches that have outstanding contributions to the sport of hockey in the state of Minnesota.

Under his tutelage, the BSU women's hockey team has posted its most conference wins in a single season, with nine in both 2009-10 and 2006-07. Sertich has also coached two Olympians while at Bemidji State, Nina Ziegenhals who played for Team Germany in the 2002 Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City, and Zuzana Tomcikova who played for Team Slovakia in the 2010 Winter Olympics in Vancouver

During summer 2008, Sertich served as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's Under-22 Select team that played in the annual three-game Women's Under-22 Series with Canada, which took place from Aug. 20-23.

Sertich was a member of the U.S. National Team from 1973-75 He was also a member of the 1976 U.S. Olympic team, which finished fifth at the Innsbruck, Austria games. The U.S. team recorded wins over Finland and Poland en route to a 2-3 finish in Group A.

He also played two years in the German Professional League, spending the 1974-75 season as captain for Fussen and two seasons from 1978-80 playing for Nurnburg.

Sertich is a 1974 graduate of Colorado College with a bachelor's degree in elementary education and humanities. He received a master's degree in elementary education from Minnesota State in 1999.

BEMIDJI STATE WOMEN'S HOCKEY NOTEBOOK

Last Time Out for the Beavers

• Bemidji State picked up its first sweep since Dec. 30-31 with two victories over St. Cloud State University at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud last weekend. The Beavers were led by their potent power play which set a school record with five goals on the man advantage last Saturday. BSU was led by **Montana Vichorek** and **Emily Erickson**, each of who tallied five points in BSU's 6-1 win over the Huskies.

Quick Take - North Dakota

• UND is led by the nation's leading scorer Jocelyne Lamoureux, who paces the nation's fourth-best scoring offense. North Dakota is hard to defend with three of the best offensive players in the nation with J. Lamoureux, Monique Lamoureux-Kolls and Michelle Karvinen. UND is coming off a series split at No. 2 Minnesota last weekend in Minneapolis. North Dakota leads the season series 3-1-0 against the Beavers with a loss coming earlier this season at Sanford Center.

The Minnesota Five

• After going 0-for-26 on the power play over the previous five games, BSU broke out of its funk in convincing fashion against St. Cloud State University. Saturday, the Beavers set a school record with five power-play goals all of which came from its top power-play unit consisting of all Northern Minnesota goals; **Emily Erickson**, **Sadie Lundquist**, **Montana Vichorek**, **Erika Wheelhouse** and **Marlee Wheelhouse**. The group went 5-for-6 overall on the man advantage led by M. Wheelhouse's two goals and Vichorek's four assists. Vichorek returned to the squad Saturday after missing Friday due to a graduate school interview and was the main facilitator or goal scorer on four of the five power-play neters.

Redemption Song

• The Bemidji State University women's hockey team will look to redeem itself against UND this weekend as they open the WCHA Playoffs. BSU lost a heart-wrenching series against North Dakota last season as Monique Lamoureux-Kolls tallied an overtime goal to end the Beavers' season. BSU is 1-3-0 against UND this season but is ready to redeem itself against North Dakota in a rematch against their rivals this weekend.

The Road to the FINAL FACEOFF

• BSU will look to get back to the WCHA FINAL FACEOFF for the second time in program history as they open up WCHA Playoffs this weekend. The Beavers only appearance in four-team tournament came following the 2009-10 season. The Beavers made it to the semifinals where they were knocked out by University of Minnesota Duluth, 7-3.

Leave it to Lundquist

• It might be a coincidence but the Beavers are 13-3-2 this season when their leading scorer, Sadie Lundquist, picks up an assist or a goal on the game. Lundquist was held scoreless in five-straight games from Jan. 27 to Feb. 10 during which BSU went 0-5. The BSU junior has scored in the last three games helping the Beavers to three straight victories.

Snapping the Skid

• The Beavers snapped an 11-game WCHA losing streak in first games of the series last Friday as they upended St. Cloud State 3-2 at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud. BSU hadn't won a game in the first game of a series in conference since Oct. 21 against the Huskies prior to Friday's victory.

Winningest Season

• The Bemidji State University women's hockey team achieved its winningest season ever during the 2011-12 regular season as they finished 17-15-3. The team finished over .500 for the first time in program history. The accomplishment highlights an already stellar season from the Beavers in which they set several program records and achieved their first-ever program ranking before ascending to a program-best No. 7 ranking nationally.

Vichorek Named WCHA Defensive Player of the Week

• Bemidji State University defenseman **Montana Vichorek** (Sr., D, Moose Lake, Minn.) earned *Western Collegiate Hockey Association Defensive Player of the Week* laurels after playing a part in a BSU record five power-play goals (1g, 4a) in a 6-1 victory Saturday over St. Cloud State University. The weekly award is the second of her career for Vichorek who was selected *WCHA Rookie of the Week* Jan. 28, 2009. Vichorek only played in one game last weekend as she returned to the team Saturday after visiting University of Colorado-Denver's campus Friday for an interview for pharmacy school. Vichorek has been the anchor of BSU's top power-play unit for the entire season.

Patty Kaz

• BSU goaltender **Zuzana Tomcikova** was selected as one of 30 nominees for the 2012 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, given out to the top NCAA Division I women's hockey player. Tomcikova joins 12 other WCHA players on the ballot. She is one of only four goaltenders nominated for the award including WCHA counterparts Alex Rigsby (Wisconsin) and Noora Raty (Minnesota).

Z4ALLAMERICA

• **Zuzana Tomcikova** has now set every major career goaltender record for Bemidji State as she is now the all-time leader in saves, wins, games played, minutes played, shutouts, goals against average and saves percentage. Tomcikova is also moving her way up in the NCAA record books. The senior is currently slotted third all-time in saves in Division I history with 3,462. She moved past Molly Schaus of Boston College for third last weekend. She needs only 129 saves to surpass Shari Vogt of Minnesota State for second and to become the all-time leader in the WCHA for saves. Tomcikova also currently leads the NCAA and WCHA in saves this season with

Sensational Senior Class

• The BSU senior class consisting of **Kimberly Lieder, Alana McElhinney, Zuzana Tomcikova, Montana Vichorek, Marlee Wheelhouse and Lauren Williams** became the all-time winningest class in program history with a 5-3 victory over Ohio State University. The group has 49 wins in its four years which surpassed the 45 wins of the 2002-03 senior class which included current assistant coach Amber Fryklund. The senior class will play its final home game at Sanford Center this Saturday against UMD. The group of six has set numerous records. Tomcikova holds almost all the goaltending records while M. Wheelhouse, Vichorek and Lieder are ranked in the top 10 in the majority of BSU's career categories for scoring by defensemen.

Comeback Kids

• Bemidji State staged several comebacks earlier in the season and went back to its roots the last two weekends as the Beavers came back from a 2-0 deficit to tie No. 2 Minnesota 2-2 early in the third period. . After a third goal put Minnesota ahead 3-2 late in the third period BSU looked to be down and out until an **Erika Wheelhouse** goal with 49 seconds left tied the teams at 3-3 and sent the Beavers and Golden Gophers to overtime. Minnesota eventually won the shoot-out but BSU still received a point from the valiant effort. Then again versus Wisconsin, as BSU crawled back after being down 2-2 to force an overtime with the Badgers with late goals from E. Wheelhouse and **Whitney Wivoda**. Wisconsin won the game in overtime on a Madison Packer goal.

It Was History In The Making

• Bemidji State played in front of the largest crowd in NCAA Division I women's hockey history as Wisconsin's "Fill the Bowl" promotion brought an NCAA record 12,402 fans into the stands Saturday night to watch what turned out to be a great game.

Season Records

• In addition to a plethora of career records BSU is setting, members of the team have also been busy setting or inching closer to season records. **Montana Vichorek** and **Erika Wheelhouse** have already set the mark for assists by a defenseman in a season with 16 while **Sadie Lundquist** recently set the mark for power-play goals in a season with her seventh netter against Minnesota last Saturday. Last weekend, Lundquist and Vichorek moved into the top two spots for season assists with Vichorek in first and Lundquist in second. The duo surpasses their assist coach Amber Fryklund's mark. Vichorek's five-point performance last Saturday also moved her into the lead for most points in a season by a defenseman, surpassing Lisa Peters' mark of 27.

Falling out of the Polls

• After spending four straight weeks in the *USCHO.com* poll and five straight weeks in the *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* poll the Beavers fell out for the first time Jan. 16 after a split with Ohio State University at home. Bemidji State is still receiving votes in both polls. BSU has been ranked or received votes every week since the start of the season following a victory over then-No. 9 Providence College Oct. 1.

Against Ranked Foes

• BSU is 5-11-2 against ranked opponents this season. The Beavers have beaten No. 2 University of Minnesota, University of Minnesota Duluth twice, then-No. 6 University of North Dakota and then-No. 9 Providence College this season. BSU's win against Minnesota Oct. 29 helped catapult them into the rankings for the first time in program history.

Kelly Named WCHA Rookie of the Week...Again

• **Rachael Kelly** (Fr., F, Rosemount, Minn.) garnered *WCHA Rookie of the Week* honors Jan. 11 for the second time this season. Kelly picked up the honor earlier this season after tallying a vital goal in BSU's upset of then-No. 2 University of Minnesota Oct. 9. Kelly was selected this week after notching two assists in the Beavers' 4-0 win over Minnesota State.

Do-Over

• Bemidji State has struggled in first games of series this season as they are only 4-12-2 (2-11-1 WCHA) in the first game of series. The Beavers snapped an 11-game WCHA skid with a win over St. Cloud State last Friday. However you do not want to catch the Beavers in the second game, or even moreso after they have suffered a loss. BSU is 12-4-1 in second games of series this season and 9-3-1 after suffering a loss.

More Power

• The BSU power play is currently ranked sixth in the nation with 36 goals on 153 attempts. BSU set a school record last weekend with five power-play goals against St. Cloud State.

Moving Forward

• The Bemidji State defense has done a great job of helping score goals this season. The Beaver defensemen have accounted for 99 of 266 points this season. **Montana Vichorek** ranks in the top 10 in the nation for defenseman scoring and is also among BSU's top five scorers this season. The BSU blue liners have scored 31 goals and tallied 68 assists this season led by Vichorek's eight goals and 23 assists.

Can't Stop, Won't Stop

• The Bemidji State women's hockey team has been a scoring machine this season accounting for 91 goals in 33 games. BSU's 11 goals against Lindenwood marked their highest scoring output since tallying 15 goals versus Wayne State University in 1999.

Wheelhouse also earned the honor after tallying six assists on the weekend against Ohio State University Oct. 7-8. The mark fell just one assist short of her season total from the 2010-11 campaign.

And The Points Keep Coming

BSU has had two players tie the school record for most points in a single game this season as **Montana Vichorek** (Sr., D, Moose Lake, Minn.) and **Sadie Lundquist** (Jr., F, Cloquet, Minn.) have each tallied six points in a game. Vichorek notched two goals and four assists in a 8-1 win over St. Cloud State University while Lundquist tallied a goal and five assists versus Lindenwood University. Vichorek's mark also set the school record for points in a game by a defenseman. Lundquist's five assists set the school record for assists in a game. Vichorek and **Emily Erickson** (R-Jr., F, Coleraine, Minn.) each came one point from the school record with five points against St. Cloud State in Saturday's 6-1 win.

Taking The Next Step

• With the program's start this season the Beavers appear to be taking the next step in building BSU into a nationally respected program. This can be evidenced in the strides made by several players this season. 12 Beaver skaters have already established career-bests for points in a season. These players are; **Molly Arola** (6 points), **Tess Dusik** (12 points), **Kimberly Lieder** (12 points), **Sadie Lundquist** (34 points), **Emily McKnight** (3 points), **Mackenzie Thurston** (15 points), **Montana Vichorek** (31 points), **Erika Wheelhouse** (23 points), **Marlee Wheelhouse** (27 points); **Danielle Williams** (3 points), **Lauren Williams** (7 points) and **Abby Williams** (10 points).

Chart Toppers

• BSU currently has players in the top 10 in several categories nationally. The Beavers have one player ranked among the top 10 for points per game for defensemen; **Montana Vichorek** (6). **Sadie Lundquist** is ranked in a tie for 10th for power-play goals. In addition, **Zuzana Tomcikova** is ranked in the top 10 for save percentage (6). As a team the Beavers are in the top 10 for power play (6).
