Last week for the Beavers

• The Bemidji State University women's hockey team hit the ice for an exhibition with the Thunder Bay Queens last Friday. Eight different BSU players scored for the Beavers with Montana Vichorek (Sr., D, Moose Lake, Minn.) and Rachael Kelly (Fr., F, Rosemount, Minn.) leading the way with two apiece. Mackenzie Thurston (Jr., F, Ottawa, Ontario) tallied three assists on the night.

Quick take - Providence

• The Providence Friars finished last season with a 22-12-1 (12-8-1 Hockey East) mark and finished third in the final Hockey East standings. The Friars return Kate Bacon (16g, 14a) and Corinne Buie (11g, 13a) to lead their offensive attack. Bacon was a *Hockey East Second Team All-Star* selection last season while Buie was named to the *Hockey East All Rookie Team*. Defensively, Jennifer Friedman returns to anchor the blue-line. Friedman tallied seven goals and 16 assists last season. In net, Genevieve Lacasse returns after notching 948 saves and a 1.83 goals against average during the 2010-11 season.

• The Friars are led by Bob Deraney, who is in his 12th season as head coach of the program.

Head Coach Steve Sertich



Steve Sertich enters his sixth season as head coach of the BSU women's hockey program. Sertich has helped propel the program to heights never seen before. At the conclusion of the 2010-11 season, the team finished in sole possession of fifth place in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association, a program best. The same season saw the Beavers

open their new home, the Sanford Center, and claim the best home winning record in program history going 9-5-2 on home ice. The Beavers also captured their first ever wins over a top-ranked team, a 5-3 win over then-No. 1 Mercyhurst on Oct. 16, 2010, and their first ever win over Minnesota Duluth, a 1-0 win on Nov. 5, 2011.

In the spring on 2010, Sertich was inducted into the Minnesota High School Hockey Coaches Hall of Fame. The honor, which is bestowed by the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association, is given to coaches that have outstanding contributions to the sport of hockey in the state of Minnesota.

Under his tutelage, the BSU women's hockey team has posted its most conference wins in a single season, with nine in both 2009-10 and 2006-07. Sertich has also coached two Olympians while at Bemidji State, Nina Ziegenhals who played for Team Germany in the 2002 Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City, and Zuzana Tomcikova who played for Team Slovakia in the 2010 Winter Olympics in Vancouver

During summer 2008, Sertich served as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's Under-22 Select team that played in the annual three-game Women's Under-22 Series with Canada, which took place from Aug. 20-23.

Sertich was a member of the U.S. National Team from 1973-75. He was also a member of the 1976 U.S. Olympic team, which finished fifth at the Innsbruck, Austria games. The U.S. team recorded wins over Finland and Poland en route to a 2-3 finish in Group A.

He also played two years in the German Professional League, spending the 1974-75 season as captain for Fussen and two seasons from 1978-80 playing for Nurnburg.

Sertich is a 1974 graduate of Colorado College with a bachelor's degree in elementary education and humanities. He received a master's degree in elementary education from Minnesota State in 1999.

Season Outlook

• The Bemidji State University women's hockey team is coming off a historic season in 2010-11. The Beavers accomplished firsts last season including beating a No. 1 team for the first time in program history, recording the program's first-ever win over University of Minnesota Duluth and snapping a 17-game losing streak to University of Minnesota on its way to a 14-17-4 (11-13-4-2 WCHA) mark and a fifth-place WCHA finish.

Bemidji State will look to build off its historic season heading into 2011-12 despite the loss of seniors Annie Bauerfeld, Erin Cody and Erin Johnson. Cody and Bauerfeld both ended their careers as Top 10 scorers in the BSU record books.

With the loss of much of its scoring, BSU will turn to a strong defensive core in All-WCHA goaltender **Zuzana Tomcikova** (Sr., Bratislava, Slovakia) along with seniors **Kimberly Lieder** (D, Eagan, Minn.), **Montana Vichorek** (D, Moose Lake, Minn.) and **Marlee Wheelhouse** (D, Crookston, Minn.) and sophomore **Erika Wheelhouse** (D, Crookston, Minn.). Tomcikova posted a 1.84 goals against average and 692 saves last season. The senior is on the verge of capturing career records in both wins and saves.

On the offensive side, the Beavers will need strong seasons from **Emily Erickson** (Jr., F, Coleraine, Minn.) and **Sadie Lundquist** (Jr., F, Cloquet, Minn.). They will also turn to several other returnees and newcomers to step up as they look to fill the void of their trio of departed seniors.

Forwards

• Bemidji State will have to replace nearly 40 percent of its scoring with the loss of Bauerfeld, All-WCHA selection Cody and Johnson.

"We have some big shoes to fill scoring-wise with those three graduating," said head coach Steve Sertich. "Sadie and Emily both had good years last year and we are expecting good things from them this year."

The pair was the second and third-leading scorers for the Beavers behind Cody last season. Lundquist had a breakthrough sophomore year scoring eight goals and tallying 14 assists while Erickson had 16 goals and 11 assists and led the team with six power-play scores.

Other key contributors last season were senior **Lauren Williams** (Eagan, Minn.), juniors **Abby Williams** (Alexandria, Minn.) and **Mackenzie Thurston** (Ottawa, Ontario) and sophomore **Tess Dusik** (Oak Bluff, Manitoba). Lauren tallied five points last season (3g-2a). Abby had two goals in her first season playing for the Beavers after sitting out 2009-10 after transferring from Minnesota State University. Thurston had two assists during her sophomore season.

"I believe Mackenzie is ready to take her game to the next level," Sertich said. "Offensively I think she has some confidence coming into the season. We are also looking for some scoring out of Tess, Abby and Lauren."

Also returning to the fray are juniors **Molly Arola** (Walker, Minn.) and **Jamie Hatheway** (Trenton, Ontario) and sophomore **Emily McKnight** (Carman, Manitoba). Arola scored her lone goal of the year on a power-play at University of Minnesota Duluth. Both Hatheway and McKnight contributed last season but neither player scored.

The Beavers add several newcomers for the 2011-12 season at the forward position. Joining the program are Maine transfer **Kristi King** (So., Stillwater, Minn.) along with freshmen **Alex Citrowske** (Prior Lake, Minn.), **Kristin Huber** (Kelwona, British Columbia), **Rachael Kelly** (Rosemount, Minn.), **Natasha Kostenko** (Fannystelle, Manitoba) and **Whitney Wivoda** (Fairbanks, Alaska), King had two goals and one assist for the Black Bears during her freshman campaign.

Defensemen

• Bemidji State will be anchored by a defensive unit that returns every member from a group that set the school record for fewest goals allowed (88) last season.

Anchoring the blue-line for the Beavers will be seniors Lieder, Marlee Wheelhouse and Vichorek and junior Erika Wheelhouse. Vichorek led all BSU defensemen in scoring last season with 16 points (2g-14a). The Wheelhouse sisters also had strong campaigns in 2010-11. Marlee had 10 points (2g-8a) while sister Erika posted eight points (1g-7 a). Lieder added four points (1g-3a), as a junior.

"Defensively we have a nucleus of Montana, the Wheelhouse sisters and Kim who are returners who played a lot last season," Sertich said.

Also returning to the blue-line are sophomores **Allie Duellman** (Maplewood, Minn.), **Alex Ehler** (Portage, Wis.) and **Danielle Williams** (Waconia, Minn.). Duellman and Williams both had two points last season (1g-1a) while Ehler tallied one assist.

Joining the ranks of the defensive corps are freshmen **Kayleigh Chapman** (Virden, Manitoba) and **Tegan Rose** (Gibbons, Alberta).

"Hopefully some of the younger players can raise their game to another level and provide some support to the upperclassmen.," Sertich said.

Goaltending

• Goaltending for Bemidji State continues to be one of the team's strongest areas as they head into the 2011-12 season.

All-WCHA second team selection Tomcikova anchors the position for the Beavers heading into her senior season. Tomcikova already holds school records in goals against average and winning percentage. She will be chasing the program's records for career wins and saves during her senior campaign. Her goals against average of 1.84 was good for the school record for lowest goals against average in a season. Tomcikova also set season records for most wins (13) and most shutouts (six) during her junior season.

Joining Tomcikova in the crease is **Alana McElhinney** (Sr., Calgary, Alberta). McElhinney started eight games last year including a win over No. 1 Mercyhurst. She grabbed 235 saves last season.

The pair of BSU goaltenders combined to set a school record with the fewest goals allowed (88) in one season.

"We have veteran goaltending with both Zuzana and Alana returning," Sertich said. "Both players have played in the league and played against good teams. We look forward to having both of them back for their senior seasons.

Jessica Havel (Jr., Grand Rapids, Minn.) also returns at goaltender for the Beavers.

• Zuzana Tomcikova is on track to set several school records during her senior season. The Slovakian superstar in goal for the Beavers already owns school records for career shutouts (13), season shutouts (5) and season wins (12). Newcomer watch

• After losing much of its scoring following the 2010-11 season, the BSU women's hockey team will look to several newcomers to fill voids in their lines for the 2011-12 season.

• **Rachael Kelly** (Fr., F, Rosemount, Minn.) and **Kristi King** (So., F, Stillwater, Minn.) became the first two freshman to find the net in 2011-12 as they did so in the exhibition against the Thunder Bay Queens Sept. 23. **Whitney Wivoda** (Fr., F, Fairbanks, Alaska) also tallied points after notching an assist on Kelly's first goal against the Queens.

• In addition to Kelly, King and Wivoda, three other newcomers made appearances in the exhibition game as **Natasha Kostenko** (Fr., F, Fannystelle, Minn.) and **Kristin Huber** (Fr., F, Kelowna, British Columbia) split time on the fourth forward line and **Kayleigh Chapman** (Fr., D, Virden, Manitoba) played on the third defensive line.

• Freshmen **Alex Citrowske** (F, Prior Lake, Minn.) and **Tegan Rose** (D, Gibbons, Alberta) did not appear in the exhibition match along with freshman **Jenessa Philipczyk** (F, Stillwater, Minn.), a walk-on who intends to redshirt during the 2011-12 season.
