Last Time Out

The Beavers (11-19-4, 7-17-3-2, 29 points) took five of six points from WCHA rival St. Cloud State University Feb. 21-22. The five points were the most that BSU has posted in a series since Nov. 15-16 when it swept Minnesota State.

Two from Tougas

Kaitlyn Tougas tallied a goal and an assist in Saturday's win over SCSU. It was her fourth multi-point game of the season and the eighth of her career. The sophomore forward leads Bemidji State in points and assists and is tied for the team lead in goals (8-13=21 pts.)

Streiking senior

Despite having her four-game point streak snapped at SCSU, Tess Dusik has scored five points in BSU's last five games and is second on the squad with 14 points (7g, 7a).

Grenier the Great

Junior Kristine Grenier has continued to provide BSU with offensive punch in her first season in the green and white. Grenier netted her eighth goal of the season against SCSU, which ties her for the team lead in that category.

Shutout on Saturday

Goaltender Jessica Havel made the most out of her first start since Dec. 8 as she shut out the Huskies Saturday, 3-0. Havel made 38 saves to record her third career shutout and fifth career victory.

Scoring shorthanded

Redshirt-sophomore Stephanie Anderson tallied a short-handed goal in Saturday's victory at SCSU. With seven short-handed goals, the 2013-14 total ranks second only to a BSU women's hockey record of 10 set in 1999-2000.

Block Party

Shot blocking has been a critical part of Bemidji State's success this season. BSU is first in the country in blocks with 674 with defensemen Alex Ehler (104, 1st), Allie Duellman (95, 3rd), Ivana Bilic (83, 6th) all ranked among the top 10.

Power Outage

The Bemidji State power-play unit has failed to score in its last 17 chances. BSU's last power-play goal came Jan. 31 against University of Minnesota Duluth.

Next up...

This weekend the Beavers will travel to No. 9 University of North Dakota for a best-of-three WCHA playoff series. The winner will earn a berth into the 2014 WCHA Final Faceoff.

Scouting North Dakota:

No other team is happier that the Olympics are over more so than North Dakota (17-11-4, 14-10-4 WCHA). UND had three of its top players leave to compete in this year's games in Sochi. During the period that its Olympians were away, UND had a 1-6-1 mark compared to a 16-5-3 mark with them.

One of those Olympians is Michelle Karvinen. Karvinen represented Finland in Sochi, led all players participating in the games in points and was named the top forward of the tournament. Despite missing a month of the season, Karvinen still is tied for the team lead in goals with 13. In her absence, Josefine Jakobsen has picked up the offensive slack and shares the team lead in goals and paces the team in assists (18) and points (31).

North Dakota has two underclassmen goaltenders that it has relied on this season. Sophomore Shelby Amsley-Benzie has seen the most time in net and has 11 victories this season. Freshman Lexie Shaw has also chipped in six victories this season and has posted a 1.92 goals against average.

Playoff History:

Bemidji State will tangle with North Dakota for the third time in the postseason. The Beavers are 0-3-1 versus UND this season. BSU's playoff record against North Dakota is 1-4.

Stat to keep in mind:

The home of the Beavers, the Sanford Center, will be the site for this year's WCHA Final Faceoff. Bemidji State will look to earn its second trip ever to the Final Faceoff. The only other time BSU made it was 2009-10.
