ANNA FOBBE OF BEMIDJI STATE, TILMAN SCHOBER OF SPRING HILL HEADLINE GOOGLE CLOUD ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA® DIVISION II SOCCER TEAMS

AUSTIN, Texas – Senior goalkeeper **Anna Fobbe** of Bemidji State University and senior midfielder **Tilman Schober** of Spring Hill College headline the 2018 Google Cloud Academic All-America® Division II Men's and Women's soccer teams, as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA).

The Division II Academic All-America® program is being financially supported by the NCAA Division II national governance structure to assist CoSIDA with handling the awards fulfillment aspects for the 2018-19 Division II Academic All-America® teams program.

Fobbe has been selected as the recipient of the Google Cloud Academic All-America® of the Year award for Division II women's soccer, while Schober has been tabbed the Google Cloud Academic All-America® of the Year award winner for men's soccer.

An exercise science-pre-physical therapy major with a 4.00 GPA, Fobbe comes off a record-breaking season for Bemidji State. She led the Beavers to an 18-1-2 record and a berth in the NCAA Central Regional Championship. She was in goal for all 21 matches, as the team set a school record for wins while recording the school's first Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference regular season title and first NCAA Tournament victory.

A native of St. Paul, Minnesota, Fobbe was named the 2018 NSIC Goalkeeper of the Year and was a first team All-NSIC selection. In addition, she was named to the D2CCA All-Central Region Team. She finished with an 18-1-2 record with a 0.53 goals-against average, the latter figure ranking 16th in Division II. She led the NSIC with 11 shutouts. She set single-season school records for wins, shutouts, and goals against average. Academically, she was a three-time Academic All-NSIC selection and 2017 NSIC Elite 18 Award Recipient. She finished with a career record of 39-11-3, a school record for wins, and her 0.67 GAA is also a school record. She ranks third in career save percentage (.866).

A senior business administration major with a 3.99 GPA, Schober led Spring Hill to a first-ever NCAA Tournament berth as the Badgers were in their first season of NCAA postseason eligibility. The Badgers won their first Gulf South Conference Tournament championship to earn a first-ever NCAA Division II playoff berth. They would lose to Barry in the South Regional, snapping a 14-match winning streak.

Schober played in all 19 matches as Spring Hill finished with a 17-2-0 record. A midfielder, he finished with four goals and a GSC-high 16 assists for 24 points, ranking second on the team in scoring. He stands third in Division II in assists per game. The native of Schriesheim, Germany was a second team All-GSC honoree. He concludes his career as the school-record holder in assists (28) while ranking fourth career points (52).

Twenty-five of the 33 members of the 2018 Google Cloud Academic All-America® Division II Women's Soccer teams have at least a 3.90 G.P.A., with 16 student-athletes maintaining a perfect 4.00 GPA. The 12 members of the first team have an average GPA of 3.91.

The 2018 Google Cloud Academic All-America® Division II Women's Soccer teams have five repeat performers – **Norah Barnes** (Notre Dame College), **Abby Bohanski** (Winona State University), **Madison Ham** (Grand Valley State University), **Jennifer Kendall** (Colorado School of Mines), and **Bethany Sutherland** (Harding University) - from last year's CoSIDA Academic All-America® teams.

Twenty-five of the 34 members of the 2018 Google Cloud Academic All-America® Division II Men's Soccer teams have at least a 3.80 GPA, with nine student-athletes maintaining a perfect 4.00 GPA. The 11 members of the first team have an average GPA of 3.89.

The Google Cloud Academic All-America® Division II Men's Soccer teams have three repeat performers – **Kenton Keeslar** (Slippery Rock University), **Justin Barkow** (South Dakota School of Mines and Tech.), and **Michael Stewart** (Oklahoma Baptist University) - from last year's CoSIDA Academic All-America® teams.
