GNAC RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK:

Offense - Cody VonAppen, Western Oregon (QB, 5-10, 200, Sr., Kailua, HI) and Demetrius Sumler, Central Washington (RB, 5-10, 220, Sr., San Diego, CA -

Colorado) are the *Red Lion Offensive Co-Players of the Week*. VonAppen completed 16 of 27 passes for 424 yards and four touchdowns as the Wolves used a 21-point first quarter and a 28-point fourth quarter to cruise to a 66-20 win over Dixie State. VonAppen had one of the most efficient games in GNAC history by a quarterback averaging a GNAC-record 26.5 yards per completion. The previous record for yards per completion was 25.5 by WOU's Josh Riddell (13-332) against CWU in 2008. Sumler rushed for 226 yards and tied a GNAC record with five rushing touchdowns to lead the Wildcats to a 51-10 Homecoming win before 5,120 fans at Tomlinson Stadium. Sumler scored on runs of one and 47 yards in the first quarter, 27 in the second quarter, eight in the third quarter and 37 in the fourth quarter moving into third place in the nation in scoring with 84 points. He also caught three passes for four yards. **Defense** - Colton Russi, Humboldt State (LB, 6-2, 240, Jr., Meadow Vista, CA) who was coming back from a leg injury that kept him out of the lineup for three games, made several big hits and led the Jacks in tackles with nine in a 24-20 win over Azusa Pacific in earning *Red Lion Defensive Player of the Week* honors. **Special Teams** - Chris Campbell, Humboldt State (P, 5-10, 170, So, Granite Bay, CA) averaged 40.8 yards on eight punts, including a long of 51 yards in the Lumberjacks' 24-20 win over Azusa Pacific. Campbell placed two punts inside the 20-yard line and didn't have a touchback to claim the *Red Lion Special Teams Player of the Week* award. **Honorable Mention** - Nick Ricciardulli, Humboldt State; Michael Akins, Western Oregon; Matt Burke, Central Washington.

FROM THE RECORD BOOK: In addition to VonAppen and Sumler's record-setting performances (*See Red Lion Players of the Week*), there were several other noteworthy performances Saturday ... Humboldt State running back Nick Ricciardulli set a GNAC record for most carries (45) and rushed for 251 yards, the second highest individual rushing total in GNAC history, in the 'Jacks 24-20 win at Azusa Pacific. Ricciardulli has rushed for 1,063 yards and currently ranks fourth nationally averaging 151.9 yards. He has had six 100-yard rushing contests, one shy of the GNAC single season record. Central Washington's Nat Conley set the previous record for carries (40) and for rushing (322) against HSU in 2001 ... Sumler's five touchdowns were among six by CWU as it tied the conference record for most rushing TDs for the second time this season, both times against Simon Fraser ... Western Oregon had 696 yards in total offense, tying the conference record set by Central Washington against Fort Lewis in a 75-41 win in 2002. The Wolves also became the third team in conference history (and the second in two weeks) to

score 66 points in a conference game. HSU scored 66 against SFU on Nov. 13, 2010. SFU then matched that total on Oct. 6 against Azusa Pacific ... Tyler Davis had a 94-yard touchdown reception from VonAppen, which is the third longest in conference history. VonAppen's total offense total of 463 yards (424 passing, 39 rushing) is the third highest in conference history.

GNAC SWITCHES TO SUPER REGIONAL III: The GNAC will compete in Super Regional III this fall after spending the past few years in Super Regional IV. Also part of the 44-team Super Regional III is the MIAA (Mid-America), the Great American Conference and the Northern Sun. The MIAA was also part of Super Regional IV last season. Six teams from each of the four regions qualify for the playoffs. "Earned access" berths are awarded to certain conferences which have a team ranked in the Top 10 in their region. With only five playoff-eligible members, the GNAC does not receive an earned access berth. Azusa Pacific is a provisional NCAA member and is not eligible for the playoffs.

GAME RECAPS AND NOTES

Central Washington 51, Simon Fraser 10 (at Ellensburg): Demetrius Sumler rushed for 226 yards and tied a GNAC record with five rushing touchdowns to lead the Wildcats to a 41-point Homecoming win before 5,120 fans at Tomlinson Stadium. Sumler scored on runs of 1 and 47 yards in the first quarter, 27 in the second quarter, eight in the third quarter and 37 in the fourth quarter moving into third place in the nation in scoring with 84 points. He also caught three passes for four yards ... In all, the Wildcats netted 374 yards on the ground (and 502 in total offense) and tied a GNAC single-game record for the second time this season with six rushing touchdowns. They also had six on Sept. 8 against the Clan ... True-freshman Jordan Todd had 134 yards on 23 carries, completing the scoring in the fourth quarter on a 16-yard run ... Quarterback Ryan Robertson completed 10 of 15 passes for 114 yards as Anthony Spain had four receptions for 65 yards. He had a seven-yard touchdown catch in the second quarter to give CWU a 31-0 halftime lead ... SFU's Bo Palmer had 95 yards on 11 rushes, including a 63-yard run to CWU's six yard line to set up a 28-yard field goal by Tiernan Docherty early in the third quarter. Two minutes later Lemar Durant caught a 44-yard touchdown pass from Trey Wheeler on the first play following a 22-yard punt return by Tore Corrado to account for SFU's only touchdown ... Wheeler came into the game, completing 70 percent of his passes (175 of 249), but completed just 14 of 37 for 146 yards as CWU held the Clan to 264 yards ... Linebacker Eric Murphy led Simon Fraser with 11 tackles, including nine solos (two for losses of three yards). DB Casey Chin had 10 tackles. Linebacker Riley Wall was one of three CWU players with five tackles. He had a six-yard sack and a tackle for a one-yard loss. CWU's Stan Langlow and SFU's Matt Isherwood each had interceptions.

Western Oregon 66, Dixie State 20 (at Monmouth): Cody VonAppen completed 16 of 27 passes for 424 yards

and four touchdowns as the Wolves used a 21-point first quarter and a 28-point fourth quarter to cruise to a 46-point win over Dixie State ... Western Oregon equaled the GNAC record for most points scored in a conference game. Humboldt State set the record against Simon Fraser on Nov. 13, 2010. SFU matched that record last week in a 66-38 home win against Azusa Pacific ... The Wolves also tied the GNAC single-game record for total offense netting 696 yards. Central Washington had 696 in a 75-41 win over Fort Lewis in 2002 ... VonAppen had one of the most efficient games in GNAC history by a quarterback averaging a GNAC-record 26.5 yards per completion and 15.7 per attempt. The previous record for yards per completion was 25.5 by WOU's Josh Riddle (13-332) against CWU in 2008. The record for most yards per attempt is 17.8 by the Wolves' Evan Mozzochi (15-267) against Dixie State last season ... Among his completions was a 94-yard touchdown throw to Tyler Davis in the second quarter. That is the third longest in conference history ... VonAppen also hooked up with Tyrell Williams for a 71-yard TD in the first quarter and with Williams for a 37-yard six-pointer in the fourth quarter. He had a six-yard TD toss to Mark Moore in the opening period ... Williams had six catches for 197 yard, matching the eighth highest yardage total in conference history. Davis had 106 yards on two catches, while Mitch Frei had 129 yards on seven catches for the Red Storm ... WOU also rushed for 250 yards as Joe Harris had 128 on 13 carries, and Kenneth Haynes had 69 on 13. VonAppen had 39 on 10 rushes, finishing the contest with 463 yards, the third highest total in GNAC history ... Dixie had 326 yards as quarterback Griff Robles completed 24 of 45 passes for 276 yards. Mitch Frei had seven catches for 129 yards ... DB Cameron Greene led Dixie State with 10 tackles. Defensive end Sipili Tuigamalala led WOU with six tackles. Coulter Mastenbroek and Bryce Peila had interceptions for the Wolves. Mastenbroek returned his 74 yards, while Peila's was his 19th career interception, three shy of the GNAC record. He has four this season.

Humboldt State 24, Azusa Pacific 20 (at Glendora): Casey Mintz completed a 36-yard pass to Marquise Deadwiler with two minutes left in the second quarter to give Humboldt State a 21-20 lead at halftime and the Lumberjacks added a third-quarter 42-yard field goal by Matt Bruder to beat Azusa Pacific 24-20 ... HSU running back Nick Ricciardulli did much of the work for the 'Jacks rushing for 251 yards – the second highest total in GNAC history. He carried the ball a GNAC record 45 times, five more than Central Washington's Nat Conley did when he set a GNAC single-game rushing record of 322 yards against Humboldt in 2001 ... Mintz completed eight of 18 passes for 127 yards including a pair of touchdowns to Deadwiler, who had five catches for 88 yards. Deadwiler also had an eight-yard TD reception in the first quarter ... Humboldt finished with 411 yards, including 284 rushing. Azusa Pacific had 262 yards as running back Terrell Watson had 117 yards on 21 carries. Watson scored on a three-yard run in the second quarter to give APU a 20-14 lead ... Humboldt, however, then took advantage of a short punt and a penalty to set up a four-play, 47-yard drive for the go-ahead touchdown ... Linebacker Colton Russi led

Humboldt State with nine tackles, three of them for losses of seven yards, while defensive back Jeremiah Maluia had eight tackles, two for losses. Linebacker Spencer Danielson had 14 tackles and LB Jake Henderson had 10 tackles for the Cougars.

PREVIOUS RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Week of Aug. 27-Sept. 2: Offense - Nick Ricciardulli, Humboldt State (RB, 5-8, 190, Jr., Poway, CA) rushed for 159 yards on 24 carries, scoring on touchdown runs of one and 74 yards in the Lumberjacks' 38-13 win over Colorado Mesa. Ricciardulli also had three receptions and finished with 162 all-purpose yards. His 74-yard jaunt equals the fifth longest in conference history. **Defense** - Alex Markarian, Humboldt State (DE, 6-4, 245, So., Chino Hills, CA) had nine tackles including six solos and three quarterback sacks for losses of 16. **Special Teams** - Kelly Morgan, Western Oregon (K, 5-10, 170, Sr., Sherwood, OR) kicked a 53-yard field goal - the second-longest in GNAC history - and also connected from 30 yards and on both of his extra point attempts extending his streak to 58 in the Wolves' 48-20 loss to Grand Valley. He also averaged 65.6 yards on five kickoffs, two of which were touchbacks.

Week of Sept. 3-9: Offense - Demetrius Sumler, Central Washington (RB, 5-10, 220, Sr., San Diego, CA - Cathedral Catholic) rushed for 154 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Wildcats to a GNAC record setting rushing performance in a 56-28 win at Simon Fraser. CWU, which finished with 316 rushing yards, scored six touchdowns on the ground equaling the GNAC single-game record. **Defense** - Jeremiah Maluia, Humboldt State (DB, 5-11, 202, Jr., Compton, CA) forced two fumbles and also intercepted a pass leading to three touchdowns as the defending GNAC champions opened their conference season with a 42-17 home win over Azusa Pacific. In the first quarter, he forced a fumble to set up Humboldt's first touchdown, a 26-yard pass from Alex Rump to Victor Spencer. Later in the period he had a 25-yard interception to set up a two-yard touchdown run by Nick Ricciardulli. Early in the third quarter he forced a fumble, which he returned 62 yards for a touchdown. He and the rest of the Jacks' secondary held Azusa Pacific to 132 net passing yards, and now rank No. 5 nationally in pass efficiency defense. Maluia also had two tackles. **Special Teams** - Alexander Bradt, Western Oregon (LB, 6-1, 210, Fr., Salem, OR - West Salem) averaged 47.4 yards on five punts, including a long of 73 that was just one yard shy of the GNAC record.

Week of Sept. 10-16: Offense - Nick Ricciardulli, Humboldt State (RB, 5-8, 190, Jr., Poway, CA) rushed for a career-high 204 yards on 33 carries, averaging 6.2 yards to lead the Lumberjacks to a 41-21 home win against Simon Fraser. Ricciardulli scored a touchdown and broke a long run of 48 yards to set up another. He also caught two passes for 18 yards as the 'Jacks improved to 3-0. **Defense** - Cedrique Chaney, Central Washington (DB, 6-0, 188, Fr., Kelso, WA) saved four potential Western Oregon touchdowns in the Wildcats' 21-14 overtime win at

Monmouth. Chaney had a GNAC-record tying three interceptions, two in the end zone and another at the Wildcat 11-yard line. He also forced a fumble deep in CWU territory in the fourth quarter which was returned 56 yards by defensive back Kevin Puckett to set up a 34-yard, five-play drive which culminated with a nine-yard touchdown run by Johri Fogerson to tie the game with 4:13 remaining in regulation. Chaney, who also had five tackles, got his first interception in the end zone on a third-and-goal play from the 10-yard line, on Western Oregon's first drive of the game. In the second quarter, on a first-and-10 play from the 13, he earned another end zone interception to set up a CWU kneel down to end the first half. In the third quarter, he intercepted a pass on a first-and-10 from the 36-yard line to end another WOU drive. His fourth-quarter forced fumble came after Western Oregon had drove to CWU to set up a potential game-clinching score. **Special Teams** - Cache Morgan, Dixie State (KR/DB, 5-11, 190, Sr., West Jordan, UT - Utah State) had three kickoff returns for 135 yards, including the second 100-yard return of his career to equal his own GNAC record. He also had a five-yard interception return and a total of six tackles from his defensive back position as the Red Storm beat Azusa Pacific 24-22 to improve to 2-0 in GNAC play.

Week of Sept. 17-23: Offense - Demetrius Sumler, Central Washington (RB, 5-10, 220, Sr., San Diego, CA - Cathedral Catholic) rushed for 148 yards including touchdowns from three, four and 50 yards leading the Wildcats to a 41-17 win against Azusa Pacific at Pop Keeney Stadium in Bothell. Sumler's second touchdown came with 3:56 left in the first half and his third touchdown came early in the third quarter opening up a 27-7 lead. Sumler also had two receptions for 11 yards. **Defense** - Scotland Foss, Western Oregon (LB, 6-3, 235, Sr., Albany, OR - West Albany) had two interceptions, including one in the end zone with 24 seconds remaining, to seal the Wolves' 20-16 home win against Simon Fraser. The clinching interception came after Simon Fraser quarterback Trey Wheeler had completed seven consecutive passes driving his team from his own 22 to the WOU 14. Foss also had six tackles, including four primaries. **Special Teams** - Chris Campbell, Humboldt State (P/LB, 5-11, 230, Jr., San Diego, CA) averaged 42.3 yards on three punts including a fourth-quarter boot that traveled 48 yards before it hit the ground with backspin and remained in place at the DSC 4-yard line.

Week of Sept. 24-30: Offense - Bo Palmer, Simon Fraser (RB, 5-9, 209, Sr., North Vancouver, BC) rushed for 145 yards on just 17 carries and scored four touchdowns leading the Clan to a 41-28 home win over Dixie State. Palmer scored in each period - from two yards in the first quarter, 37 early in the second period, 54 late in the third stanza and one midway through the fourth quarter as the Clan earned their first conference victory of the season. Palmer, who averaged 8.5 yards per rush, also caught four passes for 23 yards as SFU had a total of 463 yards in total offense. **Defense** - Isaiah Davis, Central Washington (CB, 6-0, 176, Fr., Bremerton, WA - South Kitsap) had 10 tackles and broke up three passes (including two in the end

zone) leading the Wildcats to a 31-3 win over ninth-ranked Humboldt State, which came into the contest ranked ninth nationally in scoring averaging 42.5 points. Davis also had 98 return yards, including 42 yards on five punt returns and 56 on two kickoffs. His 40-yard return on the game's opening kickoff set up a 56-yard, 11-play touchdown drive. **Special Teams** – Alexander Bradt, Western Oregon (P, 6-1, 210, Fr., Salem, OR – West Salem) averaged 42.8 yards on eight punts including a long of 54 in the Wolves' 20-7 road win at Azusa Pacific Bradt currently ranks eighth nationally in punting averaging 44.1 yards per attempt.

Week of Oct. 1-7: Offense – Trey Wheeler, Simon Fraser (QB, 6-1, 190, So., Seattle, WA – Liberty) completed 32 of 47 passes for 378 yards and four touchdowns as the Clan matched the GNAC record for most points scored in a conference game in a 66-38 home win against Azusa Pacific. Wheeler, who has had four of the five highest passing totals this fall in the GNAC (404, 378, 312 and 310), led SFU to a 654-yard offensive output in the contest. SFU matched Humboldt State's record for most points it accomplished in a 66-20 win on Nov. 13, 2010 against the Clan. **Defense** – Kraig Akins, Western Oregon (DE, 6-2, 280, So., Springfield, OR – Thurston) had seven tackles, including two quarterback sacks as the Wolves held previously nationally 24th-ranked Humboldt State to 230 yards in a 42-14 win at the Redwood Bowl. **Special Teams** – Austin Haslem, Dixie State (K, 5-9, 170, Fr., Philomath, OR) averaged 55 yards on kickoffs and also scored five points, kicking two extra points and a 27-yard field goal as the Red Storm beat first-place Central Washington 29-21.
