GNAC RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Offense - Nick Ricciardulli, Humboldt State (RB, 5-8, 190, Jr., Poway, Calif.) rushed for 206 yards on only 18 carries, scoring three touchdowns and surpassing 200 yards for the third time this season and the second consecutive game to claim his third *Red Lion Player of the Week* award this fall. He was also the Jacks' leading receiver with four catches for 83 yards, including a 60-yard touchdown hook-up from quarterback Casey Mintz. Ricciardulli, who ranks third in NCAA Division II rushing with 158.6 yards per game, has gone over the 100-yard mark in all but one of the 'Jacks' eight games to equal a GNAC single-season record for most 100-yard rushing games of seven. **Defense** - Nick Grunsky, Azusa Pacific (SS, 5-10, 190, Jr., Folsom, CA - Vista del Lago) had an interception at the Cougars' 11-yard line with 12 seconds left to seal a 24-17 upset of Central Washington. Just prior to the interception, he was credited with a pass breakup. Grunsky also earned eight tackles in the win in earning *Red Lion Defensive Player of the Week* honors. **Special Teams** - Gustave Benthin, Western Oregon (DL, 6-2, 285, Jr., Nampa, ID) blocked an 18-yard field goal attempt that would have tied the game with 6:30 left in the fourth-quarter as the Wolves extended their win streak to five games with a 20-17 road win at Simon Fraser earning him *Red Lion Special Team* honors. He also had seven tackles and assisted on a tackle for a loss. **Honorable Mention** - Kyle Dravis, Azusa Pacific; Jerry Maluia, Humboldt State; Matt Bruder, Humboldt State; Bryce Peila, Western Oregon.

THE RUSHING GAME (200 Yards): Ricciardulli is the first running back in GNAC history to record three 200-yard games in the same season. The only other running back to have more than one in their career was the 'Jacks' Lyndon Rowells who had four, two in the 2010 season and two more in the 2011 campaign. There have been only 12 200-yard games in the 10-history of the conference, four of them this year. In addition to Ricciardulli's three, CWU running back Demetrius Sumler netted 226 against Simon Fraser on Oct. 13. Ricciardulli's 289 all-purpose yards Saturday is the third highest single-game total in GNAC history.

THE RUSHING GAME (100 Yards): Ricciardulli's seven 100-yard games this season equals the GNAC record for most in a single-season. Rowells accomplished that feat twice. Bo Palmer of Simon Fraser also had seven last season. Emilio Iniguez of Central Washington had seven in 2004 and Western Oregon's Eliot Vinzant had seven in 2005.

THE RUSHING GAME (Full Season): Ricciardulli has rushed for 1,269 yards and needs just 148 more yards to match the GNAC single-season record of 1,417 Rowells set last season.

STREAK ENDS ON BLOCKED PAT: Humboldt State's Matt Bruder had his consecutive extra point streak end at 78 when his try on the 'Jacks final touchdown Saturday was blocked. Bruder made 44 of 44 in 2010 and was 34 of 34 this season. His streak was the second longest in GNAC history and ended the same way Garrett Rolsma's GNAC-record streak of 99 ended. Rolsma's miss, which was also blocked, came in the final minute of Central Washington's 21-20 playoff loss to Northwest Missouri in 2009. Bruder's blocked kick was returned for a defensive two-point PAT by Dixie's Cache Morgan. That was the fifth defensive PAT in GNAC history. Before his miss, Bruder had scored 15 points, one shy of the GNAC single-game record for a kicker. He converted on field goals from 21, 44 and 46 yards and six extra points.

GNAC SWITCHES TO SUPER REGIONAL III: The GNAC will compete in Super Regional III this fall after spending the past few years in Super Regional IV. Also part of the 44-team Super Regional III is the MIAA (Mid-America), the Great American Conference and the Northern Sun. The MIAA was also part of Super Regional IV last season. Six teams from each of the four regions qualify for the playoffs. "Earned access" berths are awarded to certain conferences which have a team ranked in the Top 10 in their region. With only five playoff-eligible members, the GNAC does not receive an earned access berth. Azusa Pacific is a provisional NCAA member and is not eligible for the playoffs.

GAME RECAPS AND NOTES

Azusa Pacific 24, Central Washington 17 (at Glendora): Kyle Dravis scored on a 53-yard pass from Nick Owens with 49 seconds remaining as Azusa Pacific broke a 17-17 tie to win its first game of the season ... The Cougars had built a 17-3 lead scoring a pair of quick-strike touchdowns in the third quarter. Running back Terrell Watson scored from 14 yards early in the period to finish off a four-play, 79-yard drive. Later in the period Ronald Douglas scored from 73 yards ... CWU, however, got two touchdowns from Demetrius Sumler, the nation's leading Division II scorer with 16 touchdowns, in the fourth quarter. Sumler scored from one yard with 8:55 remaining, then caught a nine-yard pass from Ryan Robertson with 7:01 left on the clock ... After Dravis' TD, the Wildcats took advantage of a short kickoff, an 18-yard return by Louie Bruketta and a 14-yard run by Robertson to take the ball down to the Azusa 18. But after two incomplete passes, Robertson was intercepted

by strong safety Nick Grunsky, sealing the win for APU ... Azusa finished the contest with a 401-364 advantage in total offense. The Cougars had 201 yards rushing – 82 by Watson, 78 by Douglas and 42 by Nick Owens – and 200 passing as Owens completed nine of 18. Dravis had three receptions for 131 yards ... Robertson completed 18 of 36 passes for 253 yards to lead Central. Anthony Spain had nine receptions for 162 yards. Sumler netted 73 yards on 24 carries ... Defensive back Tyler Thornton led APU's defense with 14 tackles, including six solos. Grunsky had eight tackles. DB Cory Burk and linebacker Stan Langlow each had eight tackles for the Wildcats.

Humboldt State 57, Dixie State 18 (at Arcata): Nick Ricciardulli had 289 all-purpose yards – the third highest total in GNAC history – to lead Humboldt State to a 57-18 victory ... Ricciardulli rushed for 206 yards and two touchdowns and also caught four passes for 83 yards. He now has three 200-yard rushing games this season and has had seven games of 100 or more yards. He is the first running back in GNAC history to rush for 200 yards three times in a season and his seven 100-yard games ties the GNAC record ... All three of Ricciardulli's touchdowns (on runs of 13 and 16 and on a 60-yard pass reception from quarterback Casey Mintz) came in the first quarter when Humboldt built a 28-9 lead ... The Jacks finished the contest with 685 yards in total offense, 369 rushing and 316 passing ... Daniel Wyatt rushed for 95 yards on 10 carries and scored three touchdowns (from three, 10 and 60 yards), while Bryson Hodges had 76 yards on 11 carries. Mintz completed 17 of 24 passes for 311 yards and was not intercepted. Ricciardulli (83 yards), Victor Spencer (76 yards) and Marquise Deadwiler (48 yards) all had four catches, while Tommy Darcey had three for 95 yards ... Dixie quarterback Griff Robles completed 20 of 50 passes for 262 yards and also rushed for a team-high 62 as the Red Storm netted 412 yards in total offense ... HSU kicker Matt Bruder converted on field goals from 41, 26 and 44 yards and also converted six extra points. His seventh PAT try was blocked ending his consecutive PAT streak at 78, the second longest in conference history ... Defensive back Jerry Maluia led Humboldt's defense with eight tackles and also broke up three passes. Linebacker Matt Tanuvasa had 11 tackles for Dixie, including its only quarterback sack.

Western Oregon 20, Simon Fraser 17 (at Burnaby, BC): Kelly Morgan kicked a 35-yard field goal with 14:55 remaining to snap a 17-17 tie as the Wolves extended their win streak to five to move into a tie for first place with Central Washington and Humboldt State ... Later in the fourth period WOU defensive tackle Gustave Benthin blocked an 18-yard field goal attempt that would have tied the game with 6:30 left ... Prior to Morgan's go-ahead kick, Simon Fraser scored on a 15-yard pass from quarterback Trey Wheeler to wide receiver Lemar Durant to go ahead 17-10 with 4:46 remaining in the third quarter. But, Western Oregon then drove 83 yards in seven plays, getting the final 25 on a run by Joe Harris with 1:49 left in the period ... Simon Fraser finished the contest with a 400-304 advantage in total offense and a 6-2 advantage in takeaways. Wheeler led the Clan offense completing 27 of

50 passes for 283 yards and two touchdowns, while Bobby Pospischil had 11 catches for 102 yards, including a nine-yard reception which took the ball to the one right before Benthin's block. Durant had six receptions for 110 yards, scoring twice. Durant has had six 100-yard reception games this season, two shy of the GNAC single-season record ... Western Oregon was led by running back Kenneth Haynes with 87 yards on 26 catches. Harris carried the ball only five times for a net 25 yards, but found the end zone twice including from two yards in the opening quarter. Quarterback Trey Shimabukuro completed 14 of 26 passes for 152 yards ... Defensive back Patrick Tepea had eight tackles to pace the Wolves defense. DB Bryce Peila had a 49-yard interception return and was one of four players – along with DB Coulter Mastenbroek, Benthin and linebacker Scotland Foss – with seven tackles. Peila's interception was his GNAC-leading fifth of the season and the 20th of his career, leaving him two shy of the GNAC career mark. He now has 436 interception return yards, extending his own GNAC record ... Defensive back Casey Chin led the Clan with 12 tackles, including 2 ½ for losses totaling 13 yards. Adam Berger had two of SFU's six takeaways, recovering a fumble and also intercepting a pass.

PREVIOUS RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Week of Aug. 27-Sept. 2: Offense - Nick Ricciardulli, Humboldt State (RB, 5-8, 190, Jr., Poway, CA) rushed for 159 yards on 24 carries, scoring on touchdown runs of one and 74 yards in the Lumberjacks' 38-13 win over Colorado Mesa. Ricciardulli also had three receptions and finished with 162 all-purpose yards. His 74-yard jaunt equals the fifth longest in conference history. **Defense** – Alex Markarian, Humboldt State (DE, 6-4, 245, So., Chino Hills, CA) had nine tackles including six solos and three quarterback sacks for losses of 16. **Special Teams** – Kelly Morgan, Western Oregon (K, 5-10, 170, Sr., Sherwood, OR) kicked a 53-yard field goal – the second-longest in GNAC history - and also connected from 30 yards and on both of his extra point attempts extending his streak to 58 in the Wolves' 48-20 loss to Grand Valley. He also averaged 65.6 yards on five kickoffs, two of which were touchbacks.

Week of Sept. 3-9: Offense - Demetrius Sumler, Central Washington (RB, 5-10, 220, Sr., San Diego, CA – Cathedral Catholic) rushed for 154 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Wildcats to a GNAC record setting rushing performance in a 56-28 win at Simon Fraser. CWU, which finished with 316 rushing yards, scored six touchdowns on the ground equaling the GNAC single-game record. **Defense** – Jeremiah Maluia, Humboldt State (DB, 5-11, 202, Jr., Compton, CA) forced two fumbles and also intercepted a pass leading to three touchdowns as the defending GNAC champions opened their conference season with a 42-17 home win over Azusa Pacific. In the first quarter, he forced a fumble to set up Humboldt's first touchdown, a 26-yard pass from Alex Rump to Victor Spencer. Later in the period he had a 25-yard interception to set up a two-yard touchdown run by Nick Ricciardulli. Early in the third quarter he forced a fumble, which he

returned 62 yards for a touchdown. He and the rest of the Jacks' secondary held Azusa Pacific to 132 net passing yards, and now rank No. 5 nationally in pass efficiency defense. Maluia also had two tackles. **Special Teams** – Alexander Bradt, Western Oregon (LB, 6-1, 210, Fr., Salem, OR – West Salem) averaged 47.4 yards on five punts, including a long of 73 that was just one yard shy of the GNAC record.

Week of Sept. 10-16: Offense - Nick Ricciardulli, Humboldt State (RB, 5-8, 190, Jr., Poway, CA) rushed for a career-high 204 yards on 33 carries, averaging 6.2 yards to lead the Lumberjacks to a 41-21 home win against Simon Fraser. Ricciardulli scored a touchdown and broke a long run of 48 yards to set up another. He also caught two passes for 18 yards as the 'Jacks improved to 3-0. **Defense** - Cedrique Chaney, Central Washington (DB, 6-0, 188, Fr., Kelso, WA) saved four potential Western Oregon touchdowns in the Wildcats' 21-14 overtime win at Monmouth. Chaney had a GNAC-record tying three interceptions, two in the end zone and another at the Wildcat 11-yard line. He also forced a fumble deep in CWU territory in the fourth quarter which was returned 56 yards by defensive back Kevin Puckett to set up a 34-yard, five-play drive which culminated with a nine-yard touchdown run by Johri Fogerson to tie the game with 4:13 remaining in regulation. Chaney, who also had five tackles, got his first interception in the end zone on a third-and-goal play from the 10-yard line, on Western Oregon's first drive of the game. In the second quarter, on a first-and-10 play from the 13, he earned another end zone interception to set up a CWU kneel down to end the first half. In the third quarter, he intercepted a pass on a first-and-10 from the 36-yard line to end another WOU drive. His fourth-quarter forced fumble came after Western Oregon had drove to CWU to set up a potential game-clinching score. **Special Teams** - Cache Morgan, Dixie State (KR/DB, 5-11, 190, Sr., West Jordan, UT – Utah State) had three kickoff returns for 135 yards, including the second 100-yard return of his career to equal his own GNAC record. He also had a five-yard interception return and a total of six tackles from his defensive back position as the Red Storm beat Azusa Pacific 24-22 to improve to 2-0 in GNAC play.

Week of Sept. 17-23: Offense – Demetrius Sumler, Central Washington (RB, 5-10, 220, Sr., San Diego, CA – Cathedral Catholic) rushed for 148 yards including touchdowns from three, four and 50 yards leading the Wildcats to a 41-17 win against Azusa Pacific at Pop Keeney Stadium in Bothell. Sumler's second touchdown came with 3:56 left in the first half and his third touchdown came early in the third quarter opening up a 27-7 lead. Sumler also had two receptions for 11 yards. **Defense** – Scotland Foss, Western Oregon (LB, 6-3, 235, Sr., Albany, OR – West Albany) had two interceptions, including one in the end zone with 24 seconds remaining, to seal the Wolves' 20-16 home win against Simon Fraser. The clinching interception came after Simon Fraser quarterback Trey Wheeler had completed seven consecutive passes driving his team from his own 22 to the WOU 14. Foss also had six tackles, including four primaries. **Special**

Teams - Chris Campbell, Humboldt State (P/LB, 5-11, 230, Jr., San Diego, CA) averaged 42.3 yards on three punts including a fourth-quarter boot that traveled 48 yards before it hit the ground with backspin and remained in place at the DSC 4-yard line.

Week of Sept. 24-30: Offense – Bo Palmer, Simon Fraser (RB, 5-9, 209, Sr., North Vancouver, BC) rushed for 145 yards on just 17 carries and scored four touchdowns leading the Clan to a 41-28 home win over Dixie State. Palmer scored in each period – from two yards in the first quarter, 37 early in the second period, 54 late in the third stanza and one midway through the fourth quarter as the Clan earned their first conference victory of the season. Palmer, who averaged 8.5 yards per rush, also caught four passes for 23 yards as SFU had a total of 463 yards in total offense. **Defense** – Isaiah Davis, Central Washington (CB, 6-0, 176, Fr., Bremerton, WA – South Kitsap) had 10 tackles and broke up three passes (including two in the end zone) leading the Wildcats to a 31-3 win over ninth-ranked Humboldt State, which came into the contest ranked ninth nationally in scoring averaging 42.5 points. Davis also had 98 return yards, including 42 yards on five punt returns and 56 on two kickoffs. His 40-yard return on the game’s opening kickoff set up a 56-yard, 11-play touchdown drive. **Special Teams** – Alexander Bradt, Western Oregon (P, 6-1, 210, Fr., Salem, OR – West Salem) averaged 42.8 yards on eight punts including a long of 54 in the Wolves’ 20-7 road win at Azusa Pacific Bradt currently ranks eighth nationally in punting averaging 44.1 yards per attempt.

Week of Oct. 1-7: Offense – Trey Wheeler, Simon Fraser (QB, 6-1, 190, So., Seattle, WA – Liberty) completed 32 of 47 passes for 378 yards and four touchdowns as the Clan matched the GNAC record for most points scored in a conference game in a 66-38 home win against Azusa Pacific. Wheeler, who has had four of the five highest passing totals this fall in the GNAC (404, 378, 312 and 310), led SFU to a 654-yard offensive output in the contest. SFU matched Humboldt State’s record for most points it accomplished in a 66-20 win on Nov. 13, 2010 against the Clan. **Defense** – Kraig Akins, Western Oregon (DE, 6-2, 280, So., Springfield, OR – Thurston) had seven tackles, including two quarterback sacks as the Wolves held previously nationally 24th-ranked Humboldt State to 230 yards in a 42-14 win at the Redwood Bowl. **Special Teams** – Austin Haslem, Dixie State (K, 5-9, 170, Fr., Philomath, OR) averaged 55 yards on kickoffs and also scored five points, kicking two extra points and a 27-yard field goal as the Red Storm beat first-place Central Washington 29-21.

Week of Oct. 8-14: Offense - Cody VonAppen, Western Oregon (QB, 5-10, 200, Sr., Kailua, HI) and Demetrius Sumler, Central Washington (RB, 5-10, 220, Sr., San Diego, CA – Colorado) are the *Red Lion Offensive Co-Players of the Week*. VonAppen completed 16 of 27 passes for 424 yards and four touchdowns as the Wolves used a 21-point first quarter and a 28-point fourth quarter to cruise to a 66-20 win over Dixie State. VonAppen had one of the most efficient games in GNAC history by a quarterback averaging a GNAC-record 26.5 yards per completion The previous record for yards per completion was 25.5 by

WOU’s Josh Riddell (13-332) against CWU in 2008. Sumler rushed for 226 yards and tied a GNAC record with five rushing touchdowns to lead the Wildcats to a 51-10 Homecoming win before 5,120 fans at Tomlinson Stadium. Sumler scored on runs of one and 47 yards in the first quarter, 27 in the second quarter, eight in the third quarter and 37 in the fourth quarter moving into third place in the nation in scoring with 84 points. He also caught three passes for four yards. **Defense** - Colton Russi, Humboldt State (LB, 6-2, 240, Jr., Meadow Vista, CA) who was coming back from a leg injury that kept him out of the lineup for three games, made several big hits and led the Jacks in tackles with nine in a 24-20 win over Azusa Pacific in earning *Red Lion Defensive Player of the Week* honors. **Special Teams** - Chris Campbell, Humboldt State (P, 5-10, 170, So, Granite Bay, CA) averaged 40.8 yards on eight punts, including a long of 51 yards in the Lumberjacks’ 24-20 win over Azusa Pacific. Campbell placed two punts inside the 20-yard line and didn’t have a touchback to claim the *Red Lion Special Teams Player of the Week* award.
