GNAC RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Offense – Tyrell Williams, Western Oregon (WR, 6-4, 200, Jr., Salem, OR – Cascade) caught five passes for 184 yards including touchdowns of 74 and 67 yards to lead the Wolves to a 46-34 road victory at Dixie State. Williams broke his own GNAC-record for most yards per catch (min. 5 catches) with his 36.8 average. He set the old GNAC record of 32.8 last season catching six passes for 197 yards in a game against Dixie State.

Defense – Austin Schnizler, Central Washington (DT, 6-3, 266, Sr., Ventura, CA – St. Bonaventure/Idaho State) had three quarterback sacks for losses of 24 yards and he also tackled running back Stephen Spagnuolo in the end zone for a safety to lead the Wildcats to a 54-14 win at Simon Fraser. He finished the contest with five tackles, including four for losses of 25 yards and was also credited with a forced fumble.

Special Teams – Matt Burke, Central Washington (P, 6-0, 192, Sr., Laguna, Hills, CA – Cabrillo) averaged 43.3 yards on three punts and did not allow a return yard as CWU maintained its Top 20 national ranking in punt return defense, allowing just 3.4 yards per return. Burke also tossed a 54-yard TD pass to Deionte Gordon on a fake punt in the second quarter to give the Wildcats a 30-14 lead.

Honorable Mention – Terrell Watson, Azusa Pacific (RB, 6-2, 230, Jr., Oxnard, CA) rushed for 279 yards and scored the game's clinching touchdown as the Cougars defeated Humboldt State 21-13 and remained tied for first place in the GNAC with Central Washington. Watson scored on a seven-yard run with 8:47 remaining stretching the Cougars' one-point lead to the final eight-point margin ... Jordan Todd, Central Washington (RB, 5-6, 186, So., Bellevue, WA - Interlake) rushed for 168 yards and two touchdowns, recording his sixth 100-yard game in seven contests. Todd scored in the first quarter on runs of 20 and six yards as the Wildcats bolted to an early 16-0 lead ... AJ Hull, Western Oregon (DB, 5-10, 170, Fr., Kenai, AK) had 12 tackles including 11 solos. He also forced a fumble and had a 54-yard interception return for a touchdown ... JD Duncan, Dixie State (TE, 6-4, 279, Sr., Corona, CA – Notre Dame/El Camano) caught 14 passes for 170 yards equaling a GNAC season-high for receptions and falling just one catch shy of the GNAC single-game record of 15.

3,000 AND COUNTING: In less than two full seasons in the GNAC, Azusa Pacific's Terrell Watson has rushed for 2,311 yards to rank sixth in conference history in career

rushing yards. The GNAC record is 2,836 by Jason Taroli of Western Oregon between 1997 and 1999 and in 2001. Including 697 yards in his freshman season, Watson now has rushed for 3,008 yards. Saturday's 279-yard effort against Humboldt State ranks sixth in GNAC history. Last week's 302-yard performance against Simon Fraser ranks No. 2. His performance earned Watson the *D2football.com National Offensive Player of the Week* award.

GNAC COMPETES IN SUPER REGIONAL III: The GNAC will compete in Super Regional III this fall for the second year in a row. Also part of the 44-team Super Regional III is the MIAA (Mid-America), the Great American Conference and the Northern Sun. Six teams from each of the four regions qualify for the playoffs.

EARNED ACCESS: "Earned access" berths are awarded to conferences which have a team ranked in the Top 8 in their region. Six teams from each region qualify for the playoffs. The impact of earned access is that if a team is ranked seventh or eighth, but qualifies for the earned access berth, it would qualify for the playoffs, displacing a team ranked above it in the top six. With only five playoff-eligible members, the GNAC does not currently receive an earned access berth. Azusa Pacific is a provisional NCAA member and is not eligible for the playoffs.

GAME RECAPS

Central Washington 54, Simon Fraser 14 (at Burnaby): Central Washington, which had scored a grand total of 89 points in its previous five conference games, exploded for 54 points, including 44 in the opening half to cruise to a 40-point win at Terry Fox Field ... The Wildcats scored virtually every way possible including twice on rushes and twice on passes. One of the passing touchdowns came off a fake punt. CWU also scored on a punt return, kickoff return, interception, safety and field goal ... Running back Jordan Todd scored on runs of 20 and six yards, netting 168 yards – his sixth 100-yard game of the season – on 22 carries ... Quarterback Jake Nelson tossed a 21-yard pass to Adam Schechter with 23 seconds left in the opening half. Earlier in the second quarter, punter Matt Burke, who averaged 43.3 yards on three boots, connected with defensive back Deionte Gordon for a 54-yard touchdown pass ... Jesse Zalk, Isaiah Davis and Blake Williams-Miller all had returns for touchdowns. Zalk scored on a 75-yard kickoff return in the first quarter, Davis returned a punt 59 yards for a TD in the second quarter and Williams-Miller had a 64-yard interception return for a score in the third period ... In all, CWU had a 176-0 advantage in punt and interception return yards, netting 80 yards on four punt returns and 96 yards on four interceptions ... The Wildcats also recovered two fumbles, finishing the contest with a plus 5 takeaway advantage (6 to 1) ... CWU outgained Simon Fraser 431 to 272 in total offense, including 303-75 rushing ... The Clan had 197 passing yards as starting quarterback Ryan Stanford completed 19 of 27 for 158 yards. SFU's two touchdowns came in the first quarter on passes from Stanford to Robert Borcky (19 yards) and Bobby Pospischil (12 yards). That cut CWU's lead to 16-14, but Zalk returned the subsequent kickoff 75 yards for a

score starting a string of 38 unanswered points ... Simon Fraser linebacker Casey Chin had a game-high 14 tackles. Defensive back Stan Langlow led CWU with seven tackles ... In addition to Williams-Miller, Davis, Cole Graves and Mitch Haldane had interceptions for CWU and Travis Hayes had a pick for the Clan.

Western Oregon 46, Dixie State 34 (at St. George):

Ryan Bergman passed for more than 400 yards for the second time this season against Dixie State and Western Oregon won a shootout that featured 1,109 yards in total offense before 4,022 fans at Hansen Stadium ... WOU never trailed in winning its fourth game in its last five outings. The Wolves led 40-20 midway through the third quarter, but had to fight off a comeback by the Red Storm, who pulled to within six points early in the fourth quarter after back-to-back touchdown passes from Griff Robles to Mitch Frei of 22 and 24 yards ... WOU, however, was able to put together an 11-play, 80-yard drive for the clinching touchdown with 2:11 remaining. Devauntee Hoffman got the score on a 10-yard run ... Robles completed 38 of 56 passes for a GNAC-season high 460 yards. Tight end Joe Don Duncan had 14 receptions for 170 yards and Frei had seven for 103. Duncan is the third player this fall in the GNAC to have 14 catches in a game ... Bergman, who had 417 passing yards against Dixie on Sept. 21, added 407 more on 24 completions in 39 attempts. Wide receiver Tyrell Williams had 184 yards on five reception. He scored on 74 and 67-yard completions ... Hoffman was the game's top rusher, netting 74 yards on 12 carries. He scored twice (on runs of 13 and 10) ... Western Oregon finished with a 567-542 advantage in total offense, out rushing Dixie 160-82 ... WOU defensive back AJ Hull, who scored in the second quarter on a 54-yard interception return, led the Wolves in tackles with 12, including 11 solos. He also forced a fumble. Defensive end Kraig Akins also had 12 tackles and linebacker Shane Kuenzi had 11. Defensive lineman William Kanongataa had eight, including 4 ½ for losses of 22 yards ... Defensive lineman Jake Miller, DB Zac Christian and linebacker Jake Duncan all had six tackles for the Red Storm. Christian also intercepted two passes.

Azusa Pacific 21, Humboldt State 13 (at Arcata, CA):

Terrell Watson had a huge second half for the second week in a row to power the Cougars to an eight-point win ... Watson gained 199 of his 279 rushing yards after the break and scored the game's final touchdown with 8:47 left in the fourth quarter. Last week, Watson rushed for 302 yards, 232 in the final period ... Humboldt State led 10-7 until late in the third quarter when APU drove 61 yards in nine plays to go ahead on a six-yard pass from quarterback Dasmen Stewart to Kevin Schick ... After a 46-yard field goal by Humboldt's Matt Bruder cut, the Cougars' lead to one-point, APU put together a 10-play, 67-yard drive. Watson scored on a seven-yard run to finish off the drive ... Humboldt State had two possessions after that, driving to APU's 33 on the second one before Ethan Danielson sacked Kyle Morris on a fourth down play at the 40-yard line ... Morris finished the game with 316 passing yards, completing 27 of 40 passes and was not intercepted. He also netted 26 yards on 11 rushes. Chase Krivashei caught

12 passes for 110 yards ... APU rushed for 357 yards in outgaining the Lumberjacks 427 to 378 in total offense. Stewart rushed for 59 yards on nine carries in addition to completing six of nine passes for 70 yards ... Safety Tyler Thornton led the Cougar defense with 13 tackles. Linebacker Marcus Mendillo had 10. DB Miguan Johnson had 13 tackles and linebacker Cameron Buell had 10 for Humboldt.

PREVIOUS RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Week of Sept. 2-8: Offense – Ryan Stanford, Simon Fraser (QB, 6-3, 199, So., Phoenix, AZ) threw for 446 yards and three touchdowns as the Clan upset Humboldt State 41-27 at the Redwood Bowl handing the Lumberjacks just their third home loss in the past four seasons. Stanford completed 33 of 46 passes. His yardage total is the fifth highest single-game total in GNAC history. **Defense** – Casey Chin, Simon Fraser (LB, 5-10, 214, Sr., Port Moody, BC – New Westminster) had 10 tackles, including one for a loss of two yards, and a pair of fourth-quarter interceptions in the Clan's victory. His first interception, which he returned 70 yards, came on a first down from the Clan 19 with 2:51 left. He then sealed the victory with another interception with 48 seconds remaining. **Special Teams** – Chris Campbell, Humboldt State (P, 5-11, 175, Jr., Granite Bay, CA) averaged 47 yards on six punts, including five that went inside the 20. His longest punt was 63 yards.

Week of Sept. 9-15: Offense – Terrell Watson, Azusa Pacific (RB, 6-2, 230, Jr., Oxnard, CA) rushed for 165 yards and two touchdowns as the Cougars extended their conference game win streak to five games with a 36-20 road win at Dixie State. Watson also surpassed the 2,000-yard career rushing mark increasing his total to 2,130. He also extended his streak of games with a rushing touchdown to eight and his streak of games rushing for 165 or more yards to four. **Defense** – Deionte Gordon, Central Washington (DB, 6-1, 203, Sr., Seaside, CA – Sacramento State) had three takeaways, setting up two of the Wildcats' three touchdowns in a 20-7 home win against Western Oregon. Gordon set up CWU's second first-quarter touchdown with a 22-yard interception return to the WOU 20-yard line. He also had an interception late in the first half and then forced and recovered a fumble in the third period, leading to a 5-play, 43-yard touchdown drive. He also had five tackles and broke up a pass. **Special Teams** – Jamie Cacciatore, Azusa Pacific (K, 5-8, 175, So., Orange, CA – El Modena) booted a 52-yard field goal – equaling the third longest in GNAC history – in the Cougars 36-20 road win at Dixie State. The field goal was the 11th 50-yarder in conference history and was just two yards shy of the GNAC record held by Western Washington's Michael Koenen. The NFL veteran booted a 54-yarder against Central Oklahoma in 2001.

Week of Sept. 16-22: Offense – Chris Tolbert, Simon Fraser (RB, 6-0, 190, Jr., Silver Springs, MD) and Ryan Bergman, Western Oregon (QB, 6-2, 175, Jr., Issaquah, WA) ... Tolbert, a transfer from Central Connecticut, scored twice in the fourth quarter to power the Clan to a 21-14 road win at Central Washington. He rushed for 106 yards, including a 10-yard touchdown run which set up a

game-tying two-point conversion pass from quarterback Ryan Stanford to Bobby Pospischil. Later in the period Tolbert caught a 27-yard TD pass from Ryan Blum after Stanford had handed the ball off to Blum as the Clan beat the Wildcats in Ellensburg for the first time since 1980. Tolbert caught a total of four passes for 38 yards ... Bergman tied the GNAC and the WOU school record tossing six touchdown passes in a 51-32 home win. Bergman completed 23 of 32 passes for 417 yards. Bergman tied the school record set by Jim Bowlen in 1957 against Lower Columbia and the conference record set last season by SFU's Trey Wheeler against Dixie State. **Defense** – Sean Barber, Azusa Pacific (LB, 6-1, 220, Sr., Edgewood, WA - Puyallup) had 15 tackles and two fumble recoveries as the Cougar defense held Humboldt State's offense scoreless in a 28-2 win. It was the second this season Barber has accounted for two of APU's takeaways in a game. Barber also had a pass breakup.

Week of Sept. 23-29: Offense – Griff Robles, Dixie State (QB, 6-5, 230, Sr., Spanish Fork, UT) and Jordan Todd, Central Washington (RB, 5-6, 186, So., Bellevue, WA – Interlake) ... Robles had 401 yards in total offense and accounted for six touchdowns leading the Red Storm to a 49-24 road win at Humboldt State. Robles completed 22 of 46 passes for 283 yards and three touchdowns and also rushed for 118 yards and three touchdowns. He scored on runs of 1, 1 and 12 yards and tossed TD passes of eight yards to Mitch Frei, 26 yards to Joel Davis and 17 to Joe Don Duncan ... Todd rushed for a GNAC-season high 189 yards and set up a first-quarter touchdown with a 53-yard run to lead Central Washington to a 7-3 win at Azusa Pacific. **Defense** – Kraig Akins, Western Oregon (DE, 6-2, 270, Jr., Springfield, OR - Thurston) and Daniel Moffett, Dixie State (FS, 6-2, 215, Jr., Kayville, UT – Davis) ... Akins had 11 tackles, including three for losses totaling 21 yards as the Wolves held previously unbeaten Simon Fraser to just three field goals in a 30-9 win. Among Akins three TFLs were two quarterback sacks. He also forced two fumbles. Moffett had a GNAC-record tying three interceptions (for 56 yards) in Dixie's 49-24 win at Humboldt State. Moffett, who also had four tackles and broke up a pass, is the sixth player in GNAC history to record three interceptions in a single game. **Specialty** – Isaiah Davis, Central Washington (DB, 5-10, 176, So., Bremerton, WA – South Kitsap) had 100 return yards for the Wildcats, netting 66 on four punt returns and 34 on two kickoff returns and providing valuable field position in a 7-3 win at Azusa Pacific.

Week of Sept. 30-Oct. 6: Offense – Griff Robles, Dixie State (QB, 6-5, 230, Sr., Spanish Fork, UT) had more than 400 yards in total offense for the second week in a row leading the Red Storm to a 39-12 win against Simon Fraser. Robles finished with a GNAC season-high 427 yards, rushing for 176 yards and completing 13 of 27 passes for 251 yards. He contributed six touchdowns, scoring on runs of 15 in the first quarter and 34 in the third quarter and tossing TD passes of 9 yards to Randon Willard in the opening period, 11 to tight end Joe Don Duncan and 7 to Willard in the second quarter and 48 to Duncan in the third period. **Defense** – Isaiah Davis, Central Washington (DB,

5-10, 176, So., Bremerton, WA – South Kitsap) tied a GNAC single-game record with three interceptions and also had seven tackles in a 21-13 road win at Humboldt State. Davis' first interception in the third quarter came near midfield, however, the latter two came in the fourth period deep in Humboldt territory (at the 14-yard line on a second-and-three play from the 38 and at the 10-yard line on a first-and-10 play from the 30). Davis also broke up two other passes and had 104 return yards, including seven on one punt return, 80 on three kickoffs and 17 on the three interceptions. He is the seventh player in GNAC history to record three interceptions in the same contest. **Specialty** – Jamie Cacciatore, Azusa Pacific (K, 5-8, 175, So., Orange, CA – El Modena) was a perfect four of four of field goals converting from 40, 26, 28 and 26 yards as the Cougars edged Western Oregon 34-32.

Week of Oct. 7-13: Offense – Terrell Watson, Azusa Pacific (RB, 6-2, 230, Jr., Oxnard, CA) rushed for a school-record 302 yards and a school and GNAC-record tying five touchdowns (1, 2, 70, 68 and 8) as the Cougars overcame a 23-3 halftime deficit to defeat Simon Fraser 44-36. In the fourth quarter alone, Watson rushed for 232 yards and four touchdowns. That included a 61-yard non-scoring run to set up his final touchdown. He also caught one pass for six yards to earn 308 all-purpose yards. Watson's per carry rushing average of 10.8 eclipsed the GNAC record for most yards per carry (min. of 20 attempts) of 9.7 set by SFU's Bo Palmer (20-194) three years ago against Dixie State. **Defense** – Shane Kuenzi, Western Oregon (LB, 6-0, 200, So., Salem, OR – West Salem) and Tyler Thornton, Azusa Pacific (FS, 5-8, 182, Jr., Bakersfield, CA - Centennial) ... Kuenzi had a team-high 10 tackles in a 38-21 home win over Humboldt State. He also forced a fumble, had an interception and broke up a pass ... Thornton had 12 tackles, including eight solos, and also broke up two passes in the Cougars' eight-point home win over Simon Fraser. **Special Teams** – Jesse Zalk, Central Washington (WR, 5-8, 153, Fr., Battle Ground, WA - Prairie) had 217 all-purpose yards, including 113 on three kickoff returns and 104 yards on a GNAC season-high 14 receptions. In the second quarter, he returned a kickoff 53 yards to set up a 34-yard field goal by Sean McDonald. Zalk later helped CWU rally from a 17-3 deficit tying the game at 24-24 on a seven-yard TD reception with 2:28 left. He then set up a game-winning 44-yard field goal with one second left with a 26-yard catch to the Dixie 29 with 14 seconds remaining.
