GNAC RED LION PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Jarrell Crayton, MSU Billings (F, 6-7, Sr., Bellevue, NE – Boise State) had 14 points and 14 rebounds accounting for 23.0 and 36.8 percent of team totals in a 71-61 loss at Grand Canyon. Crayton made seven of 13 shots and also had a pair of steals. Crayton's rebound total was the most for a MSUB player since Robert Mayes grabbed 15 against SPU on Feb. 18.

TEAM NOTES

Alaska Anchorage: Kyle Fossman scored 28 points, connecting on six of 11 three-pointers, in a 111-81 win Saturday over Northwest Indian College. Liam Gibcus added 25 points and 11 rebounds and Teancum Stafford had 22 points. Fossman added 22 more points and nine rebounds in an exhibition win Sunday.

Alaska Fairbanks: Multnomah visits The Patty Center for a pair of games Monday and Tuesday as the Nanooks conclude their 2012 schedule. Dominique Brinson takes a string of 18 consecutive free throws made into the contest. Brinson made his last 19 free throws last year and extended that streak to 22 before missing one in UAF's Nov. 9 game against Colorado State Pueblo.

Central Washington: Mark McLaughlin had team-highs for points (21), rebounds (9), steals (2) and blocks (3) in a 100-59 win over Evergreen State. Jordan Coby had 15 points as the Wildcats, who play Central Oklahoma and West Florida this week in Las Vegas, improved to 6-2. Both losses have been in overtime.

Montana State Billings: Jarrell Crayton has averaged 17 ½ points per game during his last eight contests and currently ranks sixth in the GNAC in scoring with a 15.5 average. In addition to Crayton's 14 points, MSUB got 12 points from Omar McDade and 11 from Brian Ridgeway in its loss at Grand Canyon.

Northwest Nazarene: Jonathan Hawkins has made 32 of 33 free throws on the season (including his last 13) and ranks second nationally with a 97.0 percentage. The Crusaders are idle until hosting Montana Tech on Dec. 29.

Saint Martin's: The Saints are in Florida this week for games against Lynn and Barry Tuesday and Wednesday in the Lynn Classic.

Seattle Pacific: The Falcons conclude their non-conference schedule Monday hosting Warner Pacific. SPU has had great balance this fall in winning eight of nine games. Jobi Wall leads the team with a 13.8 scoring average. Patrick Simon is averaging 13.4 points and David Downs, who had the longest consecutive free throw streak last season in the GNAC making 31 in a row, is scoring 13.3 per game.

Simon Fraser: The Clan travels to California for games Monday and Wednesday at Dominican and at the Academy of the Art to close out the 2012 portion of their schedule.

Western Oregon: Six players scored in double figures as WOU improved to 7-3 with a 98-93 win over Shorter. Kolton Nelson led the way with 19 points, while Rodney Webster had 18 points. Andy Avgi and Devon Alexander each scored 15 points.

Western Washington: The Vikings head to Las Vegas this week with a No. 6 national ranking and a 13-game win streak. They'll play No. 19 Drury, Mo. on Tuesday and Central Oklahoma on Wednesday. WWU's 13-game win streak is the fifth longest in GNAC history.

PREVIOUS RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Week of Nov. 5-11: David Downs, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-2, Jr., Kirkland, WA – Bellevue Christian) was named the Most Valuable Player leading the Falcons to the team title in Sodexo Tip Off Classic at Brougham Pavilion. Downs scored 31 points and also had a team-high nine assists as SPU debuted with 20- and 19-point victories. Downs made eight of 14 shots, including four of eight treys. He also led SPU with three steals and had just two turnovers.

Week of Nov. 12-18: Pat Voeut, Alaska Fairbanks (G, 5-11, Jr., Bellingham, WA – Whatcom CC) scored 46 points and also had 19 assists, nine rebounds and five steals leading the Nanooks to the team title in the GCI Alaska Invitational at Fairbanks. Voeut, who was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player, made 17 of 26 shots, including three of six three-pointers.

Week of Nov. 19-25: Andy Avgi, Western Oregon (F, 6-5, Fr., Woodburn, OR) scored 52 points and also had 15 rebounds in earning MVP honors in the Capital City

Classic. Avgi, who leads the GNAC in field goal percentage shooting 71.0 percent (44 of 62), made 20 of 25 shots (including 10 of 11 against Corban), including his only three-pointer. He also blocked two shots and had three steals.

Week of Nov. 26-Dec. 2: Devon Alexander, Western Oregon (G, 6-1, Fr., Fontana, CA) came off the bench to score 48 points, including 28 in a 118-113 triple overtime win over Central Washington Saturday as the Wolves extended their win streak to six games with a pair of home victories. Alexander scored nine of WOU's 13 points in the decisive third overtime period. He also had 13 steals, including a GNAC-record tying eight (for conference contests) in a 92-84 win against Northwest Nazarene Thursday. In the two contests, Alexander made 16 of 29 shots, including four of six three-pointers. He also converted on 12 of 13 foul shots, grabbed eight rebounds and had four assists.

Week of Dec. 3-9: Kenny Jones, Northwest Nazarene (G, 6-2, Sr., Los Angeles, CA) scored 43 points in wins over College of Idaho and New Hope Christian. Jones had 27 against the Coyotes, making nine of 16 shots as NNU extended its win streak over its county rivals to seven. He then netted 16 points and had four steals in a 20-point win over New Hope Christian.
