GNAC RED LION PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Rodney Webster, Western Oregon (G, 6-1, Sr., Hanford, CA – Hanford West & Fresno City CC) came off the bench to lead the Wolves in scoring (35), assists (9) and steals (5) as WOU ran its win streak to four games with a pair of victories, including a 84-76 regional counting-win over South Dakota Mines. Webster also had eight rebounds, the third most on the team, and shot 56 percent from the field (14-25) including three of four from beyond the three-point arc. He also had one of WOU's two blocks as the Wolves evened their regional record at 4-4.

HONORABLE MENTION: Richard Woodworth, Western Washington (G, 6-3, Sr., Bellevue, WA – Newport) scored 62 points in three contests as he closed in on the coveted 1000-point career milestone. Woodworth

ranks 58th in GNAC career history with 987 and needs 13 more to become the 55th member of the GNAC 1000-Point Club ... JB Pillard, Central Washington (F, 6-6, Sr., Kirkland, WA – Juanita) scored 58 points in a trio of games, including 29 in a 77-73 loss to West Florida. Pillard shot 71.9 percent from the floor (23 of 32) and also had 25 rebounds and four blocks, all team bests ... Ryan Rogers, Saint Martin (F, 6-4, Jr., Auburn, WA – Lower Columbia) scored 31 points as the Saints opened their home schedule with two victories. Rogers made 10 of 24 shots, including five of 11 three-pointers. He also had 11 rebounds.

MORE MENTIONABLES: Travis Thompson, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-1, 195. Jr., Anchorage, AK – Dimond) scored 64 points in a pair of lopsided victories (149-70 and 111-58) over Northland International. Thompson made 14 of 23 three-points and 18 of 29 shots overall in the two home games ... David Downs, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-2, Sr., Kirkland, WA - Bellevue Christian) had 38 points, 10 assists and nine rebounds in two victories, shooting eight of 12 from the three-point line. Downs now has made 203 career three-pointers.

RECORD FALLS IN 48 HOURS: Western Washington's GNAC record 140 point total lasted just 48 hours. After the Vikings beat Multnomah 140-88 on Dec.14, Alaska Anchorage scored 149 points in a 79-point win Monday (Dec. 16) over Northland International. The Seawolves also set GNAC records in the game for most three-pointers made (27) and most assists (41). Seawolf guard Brian McGill set a conference individual record for most assists with 20.

AROUND THE GNAC: Central Washington set a GNAC single-game record turning the ball over twice in a 111-59 victory against Quest Monday. The Wildcats shared the old record of three (versus Quest, 11-26-11) with Western Washington (versus Western Oregon, 1-9-10) ... GNAC teams finished 0-10 in exhibition games against Division I opponents including Montana State Billings' 82-75 loss Saturday at Long Beach State. That was by far the closest game of the 10 as the Yellowjackets led 38-32 at halftime before Don Monson's team rallied for the seven-point victory ... Central Washington and Tarleton State played nearly 13 minutes Saturday without either team getting an offensive rebound. The first OR came with 7:06 left in the opening period. Tarleton, which improved to 10-0 sweeping CWU and Western Washington, finished the

contest with nine offensive rebounds, three more than the Wildcats.

TEAM NOTES

Alaska Anchorage: The Seawolves made 47 of 99 three-pointers in its two wins against Northland International, following up its GNAC-record 27 with 20 in the second game. That is the fifth highest total in GNAC history. In addition to Thompson's 14 of 23 performance, Kyle Fossman made 10 of 24 from the arc. Fossman netted 37 points increasing his career point total to 932.

Alaska Fairbanks: Ronnie Baker had 18 points and Andrew Kelly had 16 rebounds in a 84-66 win over Northland International as the Nanooks improved to 4-0 at home.

Central Washington: The Wildcats sustained two four-point losses in the Las Vegas South Point Holiday Hoops Classic, one to unbeaten Tarleton State (75-71) and one to previous winless West Florida (77-73). JB Pillard had 38 points and Mark McLaughlin had 36 in the two contests. Counting a win earlier in the week over Canadian school Quest, Pillard had 58 points and McLaughlin tallied 57.

Montana State Billings: Connor Donaldson scored 34 points, converting on six of 13 three-points, as the Yellowjackets split two games with PacWest schools in the Las Vegas Challenge. Donaldson also had 12 rebounds. Jonathan Mesghna contributed 29 points and 15 rebounds.

Northwest Nazarene: The Crusaders return to action hosting Central Washington Saturday, Jan. 4 after a three-week break. NNU won two of its final three games prior to holidays.

Saint Martin's: Ryan Rogers led the Saints with 31 points in wins over Northwest Christian and South Dakota Mines. The Saints also got 26 points from Evan Coulter and 25 from Riley Carel. Matt Dodson had a team-high 15 rebounds and Tyler Copp led the Saints with 10 assists.

Seattle Pacific: David Downs, who had 38 points and 10 assists in two home wins, made eight of 12 treys increasing his career three-point total to 203 and moving into 14th place on the GNAC career list. He needs 17 more to move into the Top 10 ahead of his brother Jeff, who currently ranks 10th with 220,

Simon Fraser: Elijah Matthews had 17 points and five assists in a 100-72 win over Capilano as the Clan improved to 7-1 in non-conference games. SFU finished its non-conference schedule 3-1 in region contests. David Gebru had 15 points and Dillon Hamilton had 15 points in the victory.

Western Oregon: In addition to Rodney Webster's 35 points (See *Player of the Week* notes), the Wolves were led by Marwan Sarhan (30 points) and Andy Avgi (30 points) in its two wins. Sarhan was a perfect 13 of 13 from the floor and will take a string of 15 consecutive field goals

made into the New Year. That equals the third longest streak in GNAC history, trailing only a streak of 22 by Seattle Pacific's Rob Will in 2008 and a streak of 18 by WOU's Yuri Whyms in 2002. David Brittenen of Western Washington also made 15 in a row during the 2008 season.

Western Washington: Anye Turner had 35 rebounds in three games, including 20 against Thompson Rivers, the most by a Viking player since Mike Palm had 20 against Central Washington in 2003. It was just the 12th 20-rebound game in GNAC history. Turner also had 34 points, eight assists (the second most on the team) and a team-high eight blocks. Richard Woodworth led WWU with 62 points, while Austin Bragg had 46 points and 21 rebounds.

GNAC SPLITS 28 GAMES WITH PACWEST: GNAC teams posted a 54-34 record (.614) in the non-conference portion of their schedule. That percentage ranks just ninth during the 13-year history of the conference and is the second lowest since the 2006-07 season. GNAC teams finished 29-28 against Division II non-conference opponents, including 24-25 in regional contests. The GNAC split 28 games with the PacWest (14-14), lost six of nine games against the CCAA and posted a 7-5 record in games that count as regional contests under the NCAA "contiguous" state rule.

PREVIOUS RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Week of Nov. 3-10 - David Downs, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-2, 195, Sr., Kirkland, WA – Bellevue Christian) was selected the MVP in the CCA (Conference Commissioners Association) Division II Tipoff Classic as he led the Falcons to a 3-0 record. Downs averaged 25 points, shooting 62.1 percent from the field (18-29) and 76.5 percent from the arc (13-17). He also made 26 of 29 free throws (89.7 percent). In addition he led SPU with 11 assists and also had seven rebounds.

Week of Nov. 11-17 - Mark McLaughlin, Central Washington (G, 6-6, Sr., Bothell, WA - Inglemoor) scored 60 points in a pair of contests, including 42 in a 95-90 win over Colorado Christian to earn all-tournament honors in the SPU Sodexo Tipoff tournament. That equaled the ninth highest point total in GNAC history and was the most since John Allen of Western Washington and Parrish West of Alaska Fairbanks had 43-point games in January, 2011. McLaughlin made 17 field goals against CCU, one off the GNAC single-game record of 18 by Gerrit Eades of Saint Martin's against Alaska Anchorage in 2002.

Week of Nov. 18-24 - Ronnie Baker, Alaska Fairbanks (G, 6-3, Sr., Vallejo, CA – Diablo Valley) scored 59 points and also had 16 rebounds, 12 assists and four steals in leading the Nanooks to three wins and the tournament title in the GCI Alaska Invitational at Fairbanks. Baker, who was named to the all-tournament team, scored a career-high 29 points in Saturday's 83-72 win over Fresno Pacific. For the tournament, Baker shot 54.1 percent from the floor (20-37),

53.8 percent from the three-point line (7-13) and 80 percent from the foul line (12-15).

Week of Nov. 25-Dec.1: Austin Bragg, Western Washington (C, 6-9, Sr., Longview, WA – Clark CC) scored 20 points and also had 13 rebounds and five blocked shots to lead the Vikings to a 72-69 win over No. 1 ranked Metro State. Bragg hit a driving layup with 11.8 seconds to give WWU, which extended its home court win streak to a school and GNAC-record 31 games, a four-point lead.

Week of Dec. 2-8: Brian McGill, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-2, So., Clackamas, OR) scored 29 points and also had 10 assists to lead the Seawolves to a 96-76 win over Alaska Fairbanks Saturday at the Wells Fargo Sports Complex. McGill, a transfer from Western Oregon, made eight of 12 shots, including two of two three-pointers. He also converted on 11 of 12 foul shots. On the season, McGill ranks fifth in the GNAC in scoring (17.2) and second in assists (6.2).

Week of Dec. 9-15: Grayson Moore, Northwest Nazarene (G, 6-6, So., Logan, UT – Sheridan College) had back-to-back career highs in scoring 47 points as the Crusaders split two games. He scored 22 points and also had nine rebounds, three assists, three blocks and a steal in a 79-62 loss to College of Idaho Wednesday. Moore accounted for 35.5 percent of the Crusaders' points and 26.5 percent of its rebounds in the contest. He converted on six of 10 three-pointers as NNU cashed in on 11 of 27 overall. Moore followed that up with a 25-point, seven-rebound performance Saturday in an 88-82 win over Walla Walla. He made four of seven treys in that contest finishing the week with a 58.8 percentage from the arc (10 of 17) after beginning the week shooting just 21.6 percent on treys (8 of 37).
