GNAC RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: Mark McLaughlin, Central Washington (G, 6-6, Sr., Bothell, WA – Inglemoor & Tacoma CC) scored 66 points, including 39 in a 106-103 double overtime win over Western Oregon. McLaughlin, who is averaging nearly 30 points per game (29.4) in five conference contests and 26.3 overall, made seven of nine three-pointers in the two contests, including a trey with 10 seconds left in the first overtime to force the second extra five-minute period against WOU. Overall, he

connected on 17 of 34 shots and 25 of 26 foul shots, including 16 of 16 against the Wolves.

HONORABLE MENTION: Austin Bragg, Western Washington (C, 6-9, Sr., Longview, WA – Mark Morris & Clark CC) had career highs of 30 points and 17 rebounds as the Vikings ran their GNAC-record home win streak to 36 with 82-69 win over Simon Fraser Saturday. Bragg, who made 12 of 20 shots, including three of four three-pointers, also had three assists, three blocks and three steals ... David Downs, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-2, Sr., Kirkland, WA – Bellevue Christian) scored 44 points in two games, extending his string of 20-point games to five. Downs made 12 of 18 field goal attempts, including five of 10 three-pointers. He also converted on 15 of 17 free throws and had six assists ... Michael Loomis, Northwest Nazarene (G, 6-6, Fr., Tualatin, OR – Horizon Christian) scored 37 points, including 33 in Thursday's 85-77 win over Western Oregon. Loomis made nine of 15 field goals, including seven of eight three-pointers against the Wolves. He also had 14 rebounds, including eight in Saturday's contest.

MORE MENTIONABLES: Ronnie Baker, Alaska Fairbanks (G, 6-3, Sr., Vallejo, CA – Diablo Valley CC) scored 29 points and had nine rebounds, eight assists and five steals as the Nanooks split two road games. He had a career-high seven assists and tied his career high with four steals in Saturday's 79-70 win over MSU Billings as the Nanooks won for the first time at Billings in three years ... Isaac Bianchini, Saint Martin's (G, 6-0, Fr., Sedro Woolley, WA) scored 33 points converting on 11 of 21 three-pointers. Bianchini made five of nine treys in a 83-77 loss at Central Washington and converted on six of 12 treys in a 80-76 loss at Northwest Nazarene.

HOME STREAKS: Western Washington takes a GNAC-record 36-game home win streak into Wednesday's ROOT Sports game against Seattle Pacific at Sam Carver Gymnasium. The Vikings have also won 19 straight conference home games, which is one shy of their own GNAC record set between Dec. 2, 2004 and Jan. 20, 2007. Seattle Pacific extended its home win streak in conference games to 12 with two wins last weekend. That is the fourth longest streak in conference history ... In all games, Western Washington (9-0) and Alaska Fairbanks (6-0), which hosts Central Washington and Northwest Nazarene this Thursday and Saturday, respectively, are the lone remaining unbeaten teams at home this season in the GNAC.

FROM THE RECORD BOOK: Central Washington's Mark McLaughlin matched the third best individual single-game free throw performance in GNAC history by making 16 of 16 against Western Oregon. Ryan Diggs of Western Washington made 19 without a miss against Sonoma State on Nov. 25, 2005 and Saint Martin's Jake Linton converted on 18 of 18 against Alaska Fairbanks on Jan. 3, 2008. As a team, CWU converted on 32 of 34, the second best percentage by a team with two or more misses. Western Washington made 46 of 48 against Alaska Anchorage on Feb. 17, 2005 ... Loomis' seven three-pointers with just one miss equaled the second highest total in GNAC history for

most three-pointers with just a single miss. Robert Hicks of Central Washington had eight in nine attempts against Humboldt State on Jan. 26, 2006.

GNAC GAMES ON ROOT SPORTS: Eight regular-season GNAC games, including six men's contests will be televised this winter on *ROOT SPORTS*. Handling the play-by-play will be Brad Adam and Bob Akamian. Adam will provide the play-by-play for the four games in Bellingham and the Jan. 23 Alaska Fairbanks at Saint Martin's game, while Akamian will do the play-by-play for three contests. Dave Harshman will provide color for all eight contests.

TEAM NOTES

Alaska Anchorage: Brian McGill scored 36 points, including 23 against MSU Billings, and Travis Thompson netted 34, 21 against the Yellowjackets, in a pair of road losses. He was perfect from the foul line making 15 of 15. Thompson, who ranks 12th in GNAC history in career three-point percentage (44.1), was just three of 16 from the arc.

Alaska Fairbanks: Sergej Pucar had team highs of 30 points and two blocks and also had 10 rebounds as the Nanooks split two road games. The Nanooks also got 29 points and eight assists from Ronnie Baker and a team-high 11 rebounds from Andrew Kelly.

Central Washington: Mark McLaughlin (39 points, 11 rebounds), Kevin Davis (25 points, 11 rebounds) and JB Pillard (15 points, 13 rebounds) all had double-doubles in a 106-103 double-overtime win against Western Oregon. Davis also had a double-double in a 83-77 win over Saint Martin's, finishing the weekend with 38 points, 24 rebounds and nine blocked shots. Thirteen of his rebounds came off the offensive glass. The two wins earned the Wildcats *GNAC Team of the Week* honors.

Montana State Billings: Austin Hudson scored 35 points and Kalob Hatcher had 32 points and 15 assists as the Yellowjackets split a pair of home contests. Hudson made 12 of 18 shots, while Hatcher converted on nine of 16 shots. Devon Wallace led MSUB in both rebounds (12) and steals (6).

Northwest Nazarene: The Crusaders shot 58.8 percent from the arc (30 of 51) in sweeping home games against Western Oregon and Saint Martin's. Against the Wolves, they cashed in on 16 of 25 three-pointers. They then made

14 of 26 against the Saints rallying from a 14-point halftime deficit. Michael Loomis (37 points, 14 rebounds), Grayson Moore (33 points, 9 rebounds) and Kevin Rima (31 points, 12 rebounds) combined for 101 of the Crusaders' 165 points and 35 of its 60 rebounds. Moore also had team-highs for assists (10), blocks (2) and steals (4).

Saint Martin's: Evan Coulter netted 36 points, including 23 in Thursday's loss at Central Washington. Coulter also had 10 rebounds and a team-high eight assists. Tyler Copp also had eight assists and Ryan Rogers led the Saints with 11 rebounds. Isaac Bianchini scored 33 points, all on three-pointers (11 of 21), producing back-to-back career highs (15 at CWU and 18 at Northwest Nazarene).

Seattle Pacific: David Downs had 23 points against Alaska Fairbanks and 21 against Alaska Anchorage, recording his league-best 11th and 12th 20-point games of the season. The Falcons also got 23 points from Patrick Simon and 21 each from Mitch Penner and Cory Hutsen, recording their 11th and 12th consecutive conference home game victories.

Simon Fraser: Taylor Dunn scored 18 points and Ibrahim Appiah had 17 points and 13 rebounds, increasing his career total in the latter category to 499, in a 82-69 road loss at Western Washington. The Clan, which also got 14 points from Justin Cole and 11 from Sango Niang, led the first-place Vikings 36-34 at halftime before being outscored 48-33 after the break.

Western Oregon: Andy Avgi and Rodney Webster combined for 82 points in a pair of road losses at Northwest Nazarene (85-77) and Central Washington (106-103 in double overtime). Avgi scored 42 points, connecting on 15 of 22 shots, including both of his three-point attempts. He also had 10 rebounds. Webster had 40 points and a team-high eight assists. The Wolves were outscored 66-42 from the three-point line, making just 14 of 51, while allowing the Crusaders and Wildcats to shoot 55.0 percent (22 of 40).

Western Washington: Austin Bragg (career-high 30 points, career-high 17 rebounds) and Anye Turner (career-high 22 points, 15 rebounds) had double-doubles to lead the Vikings to a 82-69 home win against Simon Fraser extending their home win streak to 36 and their conference home win streak to 19. WWU played the game with starter Richard Woodworth (ankle injury) and played most of the second half without starter Joey Schrieber, who sustained a facial fracture in the opening minute of the second period and will be out for six-to-eight weeks.

GNAC SPLITS 28 GAMES WITH PACWEST: GNAC teams posted a 54-34 record (.614) in the non-conference portion of their schedule. That percentage ranks just ninth during the 13-year history of the conference and is the second lowest since the 2006-07 season. GNAC teams finished 29-28 against Division II non-conference opponents, including 24-25 in regional contests. The GNAC split 28 games with the PacWest (14-14), lost six of nine games against the CCAA and posted a 7-5 record in

PREVIOUS RED LION PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Week of Nov. 3-10 - David Downs, Seattle Pacific (G, 6-2, 195, Sr., Kirkland, WA – Bellevue Christian) was selected the MVP in the CCA (Conference Commissioners Association) Division II Tipoff Classic as he led the Falcons to a 3-0 record. Downs averaged 25 points, shooting 62.1 percent from the field (18-29) and 76.5 percent from the arc (13-17). He also made 26 of 29 free throws (89.7 percent). In addition he led SPU with 11 assists and also had seven rebounds.

Week of Nov. 11-17 - Mark McLaughlin, Central Washington (G, 6-6, Sr., Bothell, WA - Inglemoor) scored 60 points in a pair of contests, including 42 in a 95-90 win over Colorado Christian to earn all-tournament honors in the SPU Sodexo Tipoff tournament. That equaled the ninth highest point total in GNAC history and was the most since John Allen of Western Washington and Parrish West of Alaska Fairbanks had 43-point games in January, 2011. McLaughlin made 17 field goals against CCU, one off the GNAC single-game record of 18 by Gerrit Eades of Saint Martin's against Alaska Anchorage in 2002.

Week of Nov. 18-24 - Ronnie Baker, Alaska Fairbanks (G, 6-3, Sr., Vallejo, CA – Diablo Valley) scored 59 points and also had 16 rebounds, 12 assists and four steals in leading the Nanooks to three wins and the tournament title in the GCI Alaska Invitational at Fairbanks. Baker, who was named to the all-tournament team, scored a career-high 29 points in Saturday's 83-72 win over Fresno Pacific. For the tournament, Baker shot 54.1 percent from the floor (20-37), 53.8 percent from the three-point line (7-13) and 80 percent from the foul line (12-15).

Week of Nov. 25-Dec.1: Austin Bragg, Western Washington (C, 6-9, Sr., Longview, WA – Clark CC) scored 20 points and also had 13 rebounds and five blocked shots to lead the Vikings to a 72-69 win over No. 1 ranked Metro State. Bragg hit a driving layup with 11.8 seconds to give WWU, which extended its home court win streak to a school and GNAC-record 31 games, a four-point lead.

Week of Dec. 2-8: Brian McGill, Alaska Anchorage (G, 6-2, So., Clackamas, OR) scored 29 points and also had 10 assists to lead the Seawolves to a 96-76 win over Alaska Fairbanks Saturday at the Wells Fargo Sports Complex. McGill, a transfer from Western Oregon, made eight of 12 shots, including two of two three-pointers. He also converted on 11 of 12 foul shots. On the season, McGill ranks fifth in the GNAC in scoring (17.2) and second in assists (6.2).

Week of Dec. 9-15: Grayson Moore, Northwest Nazarene (G, 6-6, So., Logan, UT – Sheridan College) had back-to-back career highs in scoring 47 points as the Crusaders split two games. He scored 22 points and also had nine rebounds, three assists, three blocks and a steal in a 79-62 loss to College of Idaho Wednesday. Moore accounted for

35.5 percent of the Crusaders' points and 26.5 percent of its rebounds in the contest. He converted on six of 10 three-pointers as NNU cashed in on 11 of 27 overall. Moore followed that up with a 25-point, seven-rebound performance Saturday in an 88-82 win over Walla Walla. He made four of seven treys in that contest finishing the week with a 58.8 percentage from the arc (10 of 17) after beginning the week shooting just 21.6 percent on treys (8 of 37).

Week of Dec. 16-22: Rodney Webster, Western Oregon (G, 6-1, Sr., Hanford, CA – Hanford West & Fresno City CC) came off the bench to lead the Wolves in scoring (35), assists (9) and steals (5) as WOU ran its win streak to four games with a pair of victories, including a 84-76 regional counting-win over South Dakota Mines. Webster also had eight rebounds, the third most on the team, and shot 56 percent from the field (14-25) including three of four from beyond the three-point arc. He also had one of WOU's two blocks as the Wolves evened their regional record at 4-4.

Week of Dec. 30-Jan. 5: Riley Carel, Saint Martin's (G, 6-2, Jr., Enumclaw, WA) and Andrew Kelly, Alaska Fairbanks (F, 6-7, Sr., Gilbert, AZ – Chandler-Gilbert) ... Carel scored 29 points, including 17 in the Saints' 73-69 win over nationally 11th ranked Seattle Pacific as the Saints beat the Falcons for just the third time in the 13-year history of the conference. Carel also had career highs for assists (8) and steals (5) in the win, while also grabbing six rebounds and making seven of 12 shots. Kelly scored 26 points and also had 19 rebounds and three blocked shots in wins over Simon Fraser (67-58) and nationally 15th ranked Western Washington (65-61) as the Nanooks beat the Vikings at The Patty Center for the second year in a row.
