Phoenix host Warriors in Friday contest

Cumberland takes on Webber International on Friday night at Nokes-Lasater Field, a change of date and time necessitated by Hurricane Irma approaching the Florida coast on Sunday and Monday. Webber International is located in Babson Park, Fla., about an hour south of Orlando and east of Tampa. The Phoenix and Warriors have never met on the football field. Head coach Kelly Scott is in his 16th season with the Warriors and 12th at the helm of the program. Scott is the only original member of the coaching staff from the Warriors inaugural season in 2002. He served as the defensive coordinator before taking over as head coach before the 2006 season.

2-0 start is historic for Cumberland

Cumberland has started the 2017 campaign 2-0 for the first time since 2000. That team won its first five games of the season before losing its last five. It marks just the fourth time since the program was revived in 1990 that the Phoenix have begun the year 2-0, doing so in 1993, 1998 and 2000. The 1993 squad is the only one in school history to reach the NAIA playoffs, finishing the season 9-2, while the 1998 club posted a 6-5 mark.

Huntley racks up yards in air, on ground

Redshirt junior Dezmon Huntley enjoyed perhaps his best all-around performance at quarterback as a member of the Phoenix last week at the University of the Cumberlands, passing

for 291 yards and rushing for 101 yards and two touchdowns. It marked a career-best in passing yards (previous best was 202 last season at Mississippi College), completing 13-of-25. He accounted for five pass plays of 35 yards or more, including three of 42-plus. Huntley had another shaky start, throwing an interception on the second possession against the Patriots, but after that, he was on the money the rest of the game. He rushed 15 times for 101 yards, with TD runs of eight and nine yards. Huntley started slowly in the season-opener against Bluefield College, fumbling a pair of shotgun snaps, air-mailing a couple of passes and starting the game 0-for-5 passing in the first quarter. He settled down over the final three periods, accounting for 212 yards of total offense and two touchdowns in the 24-17 victory. Huntley hit Denarius Toliver for an eight-yard TD pass

in the second quarter and his six-yard TD run in the third period gave CU a 21-7 advantage. He finished 12-of-27 passing for 149 yards, one TD and two interceptions and added 63 yards rushing on 15 carries with one TD. He was also 6-for-11 passing for 62 yards and one TD on third down. Huntley leads the Phoenix with 164 rushing yards on 30 carries, 5.5 yards-per-attempt, with three TDs and has passed for 440 yards on 25-of-52 with one TD and three interceptions. He ranks third in the Mid-South Conference in total offense (594 yards) and fifth in passing yards.

Rushin gets the job done

Redshirt sophomore quarterback Joseph Rushin is tied for the Mid-South Conference lead in touchdowns through two games, posting five TDs, all on the ground. The McDonough, Ga., native carried six times for 35 yards with a six-yard TD run in the season opener against Bluefield College. He then posted a crazy stat line last week at the University of the Cumberlands, rushing eight times for four yards and four touchdowns. Rushin recorded four one-yard TD runs, three in the first half and the final one at the beginning of the fourth quarter. It marked the most rushing touchdowns in a game by a Cumberland player since Justin Snyder had five against the University of the Cumberlands on September 19, 2015. The last running back with that many rushing touchdowns in a contest was Lemeco Miller, who also had five versus Union College on October 6, 2012. Rushin has 14 carries for 39 yards and five TDs for the season.

O-line a strength for CU

Cumberland ranked 11th nationally in rushing offense per game last season, averaging 232.4 yards per contest with 32 rushing touchdowns. Seniors Nick Bodden, Chandler Peeples and Jason Smith along with junior Jeff Benson have a combined 85 career starts through two games in 2017. Bodden has played in 29 games with 26 starts while Peeples has played in 29 outings with 28 starts. Senior Jason Smith transferred from Eastern Kentucky two years ago and has started 21 of the 23 contests the last two seasons and junior Jeff Benson saw action in all 11 games last year with nine starts.

Parker, Rucker a solid 1-2 punch

Redshirt sophomores Kris Parker and Telvin Rucker combined for 149 rushing yards on 25 carries in the season-opener against Bluefield

College, averaging 5.96 yards per attempt. Parker led the team with 76 yards on 14 rushes. The Hoover, Ala., native paced the Phoenix with eight rushing touchdowns in 2016, carrying 64 times for 341 yards overall, including 92 yards with one TD against Reinhardt University and 65 yards with another score versus Campbellsville University. Rucker played mostly special teams last season but got a late-season audition because of injuries at Bethel University, rushing four times for 26 yards. The Memphis, Tenn., native produced 73 yards on 11 attempts against Bluefield.

Phoenix trying to get Johnson more touches

Kendall Johnson burst onto the scene in the 2016 season opener against Lindsey Wilson, scoring the team's first two touchdowns in the game, and put together his best all-around contest of the season against Campbellsville University. The Nashville, Tenn., native rushed 18 times for 104 yards and scored the game-winning touchdown in the fourth quarter versus the Tigers. He also caught five passes for 46 yards and returned a pair of kickoffs for 60 yards, amassing 210 all-purpose yards in the contest. At Bethel University Johnson collected seven catches for 93 yards, including the game-winning 18-yard TD reception in the second overtime, and also rushed five times for 54 yards. He ranked third on the club in rushing with 376 yards and five touchdowns, averaging 5.8 yards

per attempt, and finished last year with 29 receptions for 276 yards and one TD. The sophomore got just five touches in the season-opener against Bluefield College, accounting for 45 all-purpose yards between rushing, receiving and kickoff returns, and got only four touches at the University of the Cumberlands, registering 70 all-purpose yards.

Rodgers, Bryson emerge as go-to receivers

Junior receivers Ladarius Rodgers and Marcus Bryson emerged as Dezmon Huntley's top targets in the season-opener against Bluefield College and did so again last week at the University of the Cumberlands. Rodgers dropped a pair of passes in the first half versus Bluefield but still finished with a game-high five receptions for 55 yards, including three catches for 31 yards on third down. The Walls, Miss., native padded one grab for 44 yards at the Cumberlands. Bryson collected three catches for a game-best 67 yards against Bluefield, including a 31-yard catch-and-run in the third quarter. He registered two receptions for 49 yards at the Cumberlands as well.

Defensive scores are the norm for CU

Under head coach and defensive coordinator Donnie Suber, Cumberland has registered 29 defensive touchdowns in nine-plus seasons, which includes interceptions, fumble returns and blocked punts, as well as forcing six safeties. The Phoenix registered three defensive scores in 2015, with Nathan Anderson blocking a punt out of the end zone for a safety at West Alabama and Anthony Knight picking up a blocked extra point and returning it 85 yards for two points at Valdosta State. At the University of Pikeville, Anderson blocked his second punt of the season and returned it six yards for the TD. Shedrick Kirk picked up a fumble and returned it 90 yards for a TD at Faulkner University, the only defensive score for the Phoenix in 2016. The chart to the left has a complete listing of all defensive scores under Suber.

Defense needs more turnovers

Cumberland's defense forced only 13 turnovers in 11 games in 2016 – seven interceptions and six fumble recoveries. The unit forced only 12 turnovers in 2015 – six fumbles and six interceptions – after registering 27 takeaways in 2014 and between 25 and 32 takeaways every season but one from 2009-14. The lack of turnovers did not provide short fields to a struggling offense and also contributed to the defense staying on the field for long stretches of the game. The unit was on the field for 34-plus minutes on four occasions and Cumberland lost the time of possession battle in seven of the team's 11 contests in 2015. Last year the Phoenix posted a season-high three takeaways versus Campbellsville University with two fumbles and one interception and added a pair of interceptions at Kentucky Christian and East Tennessee State. Shedrick Kirk provided the only defensive touchdown of 2016, returning a fumble 90 yards for a TD at Faulkner University, the first defensive score for the Phoenix since October 3, 2015 at the University of Pikeville. The unit posted one turnover in the the season-opener versus Bluefield College, a fourth-quarter interception by David Emanuel, who also recovered a fumble on a kickoff in the fourth quarter last week at the University of the Cumberlands.

Offense keeps turnovers to a minimum

After some major struggles with turnovers to end the 2015 campaign, Cumberland's offense kept miscues to a minimum last season, committing only 11 turnovers in 11 games. The Phoenix fumbled twice against the University of Pikeville and had two miscues versus Campbellsville University, leading to a pair of Tiger touchdowns. CU did not commit a turnover in four outings last year. In 2015 Cumberland took care of the ball very well in the first five games, committing just six total turnovers, but miscues over the last six contests led directly to five straight defeats. The Phoenix committed 19 turnovers during those last six outings, including four at Campbellsville and five versus Bethel University. Cumberland opponents feasted on the offense's 25 miscues in 2015, turning those into 115 points, including 24 by Campbellsville and 21 apiece from Bethel and Lindsey Wilson. Cumberland committed three miscues in the season-opener versus Bluefield College, two interceptions and a fumble, but those turned into just three points for the Rams. Last week at the University of the Cumberlands, the Patriots converted an interception and a fumble into 10 points.

Phoenix look to continue winning ways

Cumberland has compiled a 44-32 mark over the previous seven seasons, the best seven-year run in program history. The Phoenix posted 8-3 records in 2010 and 2012 and a 7-3

mark in 2011, playing for the division championship in all three campaigns. The squad was 7-4 overall in 2013, winning seven of its final nine outings, and finished 6-5 in 2014. CU ranks tied for fourth in total victories among the 18 football-playing schools in the state of Tennessee since the start of the 2010 season heading into this week's game. Chattanooga (52-34) leads all schools, with Carson-Newman (51-30) second and Tennessee (49-40) third. Cumberland (46-32) and UT Martin (46-35) are tied for fourth. The football-playing schools in the state include Austin Peay, Carson-Newman, Chattanooga, Cumberland, East Tennessee State (since 2015), Lane College, Rhodes College, Maryville College, Memphis, Middle Tennessee, Tennessee, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech, Tusculum College, University of the South, UT Martin and Vanderbilt.

Travecedo garners Mid-South Conference Player of the Week accolades

Cumberland's Pablo Dongarra Travecedo was voted Mid-South Conference Bluegrass Division Special Teams Player of the Week on August 28 after hitting three extra points and one field goal in CU's 24-17 season-opening victory over Bluefield College. The Guayaquil, Ecuador, native connected on three extra points and booted a 37-yard field goal in his Cumberland debut. The wind knocked down his last kickoff of the game and the ball bounced away from the return men, a fumble the Phoenix recovered that led to his field goal late in the third quarter, part of a 17-point period that helped CU take control of the contest and erase a 10-7 halftime deficit. Cumberland was just 2-of-7 in field goal tries last season and 3-for-13 over the last two years before Travecedo's 37-yarder versus Bluefield.

Campagne named TSWA Player of the Week
Cumberland's Alex Campagne was named the

Tennessee Sports Writers Association Defensive Player of the Week on August 31, collecting 11 tackles and one tackle for loss in CU's 24-17 victory against Bluefield College. It marked the first double-digit tackle performance of Campagne's career. He posted nine stops twice last season – versus Campbellsville University and at Bethel University. He collected four solo tackles in the contest. Cumberland limited Bluefield to just 322 yards of total offense, including 208 in the final three quarters.

Head Coach Donnie Suber



**Fifth Season as HC/
10th Season as
Defensive Coordinator/
Defensive Backs Coach**

Donnie Suber was named head coach at Cumberland University on January 28, 2013, the fifth head coach of the program since it was revived in 1990. He begins his fifth year as head coach and 10th season in his third stint at Cumberland, serving as the defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach. He has worked as an assistant or head coach at the collegiate level for the past 24 years, 13 of those at CU.

Suber has compiled a 21-23 mark over four seasons as head coach with the Phoenix, including a combined 13-9 in his first two campaigns. Cumberland rebounded from a disappointing 3-8 year in 2015 with a 5-6 mark last season that included four losses by a combined 15 points. During his tenure as head coach, CU has earned 27 First or Second Team All-Mid-South Conference honors while collecting a pair of MSC Defensive Player of the Year accolades.

In addition 78 players have been named Academic All-Mid-South and 37 have garnered Daktronics-NAIA Scholar-Athlete recognition.

The Phoenix continued their recent winning ways in Suber's first year at the helm of the program, winning four straight games in the middle of the year and seven of the final nine outings to finish 7-4, the club's fourth consecutive winning season. Nathan Jernigan was voted the Mid-South Conference West Division Freshman of the Year. Cumberland also led the Mid-South Conference with 28 Academic All-MSC selections and ranked No. 1 in the nation for the second straight year with 16 Daktronics-NAIA Scholar-Athletes.

In 2014 the Phoenix ended the year 6-5 overall, losing its last three games thanks to a slew of injuries. Six players garnered All-Mid-South Conference recognition, including defenders Grant Jones, Justus Daus-

cha and Jernigan on the First Team.

Cumberland stood 3-3 midway through the 2015 campaign after a pair of victories and two early-season defeats to NCAA Division II institutions. Injuries and a sluggish offense led to a five-game losing streak to end the year. Eight players earned All-MSC honors, including defenders Cayman Russell and Jernigan on the First Team and Dauscha on the Second Team. Jernigan was voted MSC West Co-Defensive Player of the Year and First Team Academic All-America as well.

Cumberland's defense allowed 61.1 less rushing yards per game in 2016, helping the unit improve from 59th to 22nd in rushing yards allowed per game (140.4) and give up 12.0 fewer points per game, going from 72nd to 45th nationally. The unit also posted 28 sacks, ranking 21st in the country.

CU lost 33-29 in the season opener to Lindsey Wilson and dropped a 27-26 decision on the road at D-II Mississippi College on a last-second field goal. The club was on the wrong end of a 31-28 decision at Faulkner University and lost the season finale, 23-16, at East Tennessee State.

Four Cumberland players received All-MSC accolades, including defenders Dauscha and Jernigan, with Jernigan earning his second straight MSC West Defensive Player of the Year honor.

Suber earned his bachelor's in Recreation and Hotel Management from Georgia Southern in 1990 and played on NCAA Division I-AA national championship teams as a defensive back in 1986, 1989 and 1990.

His first coaching position was at Cumberland University as the defensive backs and strength coach as a graduate assistant. Suber earned his master's from Cumberland in Organizational Behavior in 1993.

He returned to his alma mater in 1994 as the restricted earnings coach in charge of defensive backs before coming back to Cumberland for two years in 1995-96 as defensive backs coach and men's and women's golf coach. The Columbia, S.C., native then spent four seasons as the defensive coordinator, defensive backs coach and recruiting coordinator at Newberry College.

In 2001 he held the same positions at Benedict College before serving as the linebackers coach in 2002 and then the receivers coach from 2003-06 at Presbyterian College.
