## WEEK 7 PREVIEW

All three unbeaten PFL squads take the field to highlight Week 7. Butler puts its unblemished PFL and overall marks at risk when it hosts long-time foe Valparaiso. PFL unbeaten Dayton hosts Davidson at Welcome Stadium while fellow 2-0 squad Drake travels to San Diego. Morehead State travels to Jacksonville while Campbell visits non-conference foe Old Dominion.

One of five unbeaten teams remaining in the FCS, **Butler** puts its unblemished mark on the line when it hosts **Valparaiso** in the annual "Battle for the Hoosier Helmet." The Bulldogs return to action following an off week and will play their fifth in-state contest this season. The Crusaders are seeking their first PFL victory after falling to San Diego in Week 6. The series between the two squads dates back to 1927 when both were members of the former Indiana Collegiate Conference.

**Dayton** looks to improve its 2-0 PFL start when it hosts **Davidson**. Dayton has recovered from a season-opening home loss with four straight victories, including a win at Campbell in Week 6. Davidson has not won at Dayton in three tries and has not posted a road victory in 2009.

**Morehead State** seeks its first PFL victory when it travels to **Jacksonville** which saw its seven-game PFL win streak stopped in Week 6. The Eagles saw fumbles derail a chance for their first victory at Davidson last week and have lost 12 fumbles this season. The Dolphins saw their win streak fall in the final seconds of a loss at Marist. Morehead State has lost the last three meetings in the series.

**San Diego** returns to Torero Stadium for only the second time this season when it hosts **Drake** in another key PFL matchup. San Diego won its only other home outing against Marist in Week 3 and returns home in the thick of the PFL race. Drake sits among a trio of teams at 2-0 and posted its season's second shutout against Missouri S&T last weekend. The Bulldogs will need to stop a four-game losing streak against the Toreros to remain unbeaten.

**Campbell** steps out of conference action to meet Old Dominion and looking to stop a four-game losing streak. The Camels are the second PFL team to meet the Monarchs this season, Jacksonville dropping a 28-27 decision, Sept. 19.

### **Chris Deowski, Marist**

Senior, Quarterback, Fountain Valley, Calif.

Deowski put together a pair of critical fourth-quarter scoring drives to lead Marist in a 31-27 come-from-behind victory against Jacksonville, Saturday. Down 27-17, he threw a 43-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver James LaMacchia on 4th-and-2. Then with seven seconds remaining and on 4th-and-12, he threw a 26-yard touchdown to wideout Kevin Fitzpatrick for the game-winning score. Deowski finished the day completing 20-of-34 passes for a career-high 327 yards and three touchdowns. He also added 36 yards on 11 carries to finish with 363 yards of offense.

## DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK



### **Alex Griswold, Davidson**

Senior, Defensive Lineman, Timonium, Md.

Griswold filled up the stat sheet to lead Davidson's defense in a 16-10 victory against Morehead State, Saturday. He finished the day with six tackles, including five solo stops. Griswold also had three tackles for loss, including a pair of quarterback sacks. One of those sacks resulted in a lost fumble that ended Morehead State's final drive. It was one of two fumbles he forced during the day – Davidson forced five fumbles total – and also broke up a pass. Behind Griswold's effort, the Wildcats defense limited the Eagles to 185 yards of offense, including just 59 yards rushing.

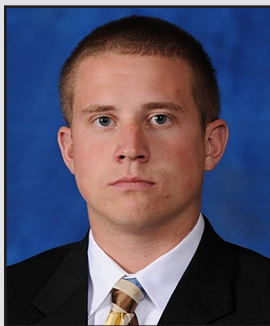

### **Brandon Wubs, Drake**

Fifth-Year Senior, Kicker, Hawthorn Woods, Ill.

Wubs led all PFL scorers with 13 points in Week 6 to lead Drake in its 19-0 non-conference victory against Missouri S&T, Saturday. He made all four of his field-goal attempts, converting tries from 36, 33, 45 and 29 yards. Wubs 45-yard field goal was a career-best. He also punted three times, averaging 35.3 yards per punt. The league's second-leading scorer this season, this is Wubs' second Special Teams citation this season, winning the league's Week 1 award.

# 2009 PIONEER FOOTBALL LEAGUE WEEKLY REPORT

## 2009 PFL QUICK SNAPS

**BUTLER ONE OF FIVE REMAINING UNBEATENS IN FCS:** Butler enters Week 7 as one of five remaining unbeaten teams in the FCS. The Bulldogs are joined by the Colgate (6-0, Patriot), Montana (6-0, Big Sky), New Hampshire (5-0, Colonial) and Richmond (5-0, Colonial) as the only teams left with an unblemished mark this season.

**YOUTH MOVEMENT AT SIGNAL CALLER:** A youth movement is afoot among the PFL's quarterback corps. Four teams – Butler, Drake, Jacksonville and Valparaiso – have regularly used a sophomore signal caller this season while Marist has seen its sophomore quarterback split time with a senior. Three sophomores – Butler's Andrew Huck, Jacksonville's Josh McGregor and Drake's Mike Pitkowski – are ranked 1-2-3 among the league's passing yardage leaders. In addition, San Diego has turned to redshirt freshman Sam Scudellari to take the snaps the rest of this season after senior Sebastian Trujillo left the team due to personal reasons.

**SAN DIEGO ALUMNUS JOHNSON MAKES FIRST NFL START:** Johnson was tapped as Tampa Bay's starting quarterback prior to its Week 4 contest at Washington. In his first start, Johnson completed 13-of-22 passes for 106 yards and was the team's second-leading rusher with 41 yards on 17 carries. His first throw of the game went for an eight-yard touchdown just two minutes into the game, giving Tampa Bay an early lead it would relinquish in the third quarter of a 16-13 loss. A fifth-round draft pick in 2008, Johnson made the 53-man roster as a rookie but was inactive for every game. At San Diego, he put up enormous numbers, including an NCAA FCS career record passing efficiency of 176.68. Johnson also ran for 1,864 yards and 19 touchdowns for the Toreros. As a senior, Johnson posted an incredible 43-1 touchdown-interception ratio while also rushing for 726 yards.

**CAMPBELL POSTS FIRST HOME VICTORY:** A long wait came to an end, Sept. 5, when Campbell defeated Methodist, 48-28, at Barker-Lane Stadium. It was the Camels first victory at their home constructed prior to the 2008 campaign as part of its return to football.

**WELCOME MARIST:** For the second-straight season the Pioneer Football League welcomes a new member into its ranks. Marist College in Poughkeepsie, N.Y. becomes the league's 10th member. A former member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference-Football League, the Red Foxes played 2008 as an independent, posting a 4-7 record, including a 1-1 record against PFL members. They followed the addition of Campbell, a first-year program, during the 2008 season.

**BUTLER LINEBACKER GRANT HUNTER A PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SELECTION:** Butler's Grant Hunter was named to Phil Steele College Football Preview's Preseason FCS All-American Second Team. Hunter, a redshirt sophomore defensive end, was a First-Team All-Pioneer Football League selection last season after leading the league in sacks (14) – the second most in Butler program history. He also ranked second among PFL tackles in tackles for loss (18). Hunter was the lone PFL player selected among the 56 players recognized on the first and second teams.

**VALPARAISO'S ADAM RUNDH NOMINATED TO ALLSTATE/AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM:** Valparaiso senior defensive lineman Adam Rundh is one of a record 106 student-athletes nominated for the 2009 Allstate American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Good Works Teams. Rundh has been actively involved in the Valparaiso community during his career. He has been a part of several projects at local elementary schools, including participation in a volunteer tutoring program at Parkview Elementary. Rundh

also helped organize a book sale to raise money for Opportunity Enterprises, a local organization that promotes self-sufficiency and life choices for challenged individuals. He also helped with a local Christmas gift collection for local families in need. Rundh also has excelled in the classroom, earning ESPN The Magazine Second-Team Academic All-America honors as a junior. He also was a First Team Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar Award recipient in 2007. On the field, he has twice received honorable mention All-PFL honors.

**DRAKE RECORDS HISTORIC 550th VICTORY:** Drake recorded the 550th win in program history with its season-opening victory against Grand View, Sept. 5. The Bulldogs are one of three PFL teams with 500 or more victories during their history. Below is a look at each PFL program's current all-time wins total, according to the NCAA:

**MORE ABOUT VICTORIES:** Last season, Dayton became the 11th NCAA FCS team – and the first west of the Alleghenies – to win at least 600 games in its football history when it downed Davidson. Here are the 12 members of the club, heading into the 2009 season. Yale (853), Harvard (798), Penn (796), Princeton (780), Fordham (738), Dartmouth (643), Lafayette (640), Delaware (633), Lehigh (625), Cornell (616), Dayton (603) and North Dakota State (601).

**DAYTON SHUTOUT STREAK STILL GOING STRONG:** Including Saturday's victory at Morehead State, the Flyers have not been shutout in 370 consecutive games, dating back to Oct. 16, 1976. During that streak Dayton has shutout its opponent 63 times. *A list of the last shutout win and loss for each PFL squad is available on page 7.*

**SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL:** For the fourth consecutive season, the Pioneer Football League's coaches have tabbed San Diego as the preseason favorite in the PFL Preseason Coaches' Poll, receiving only five of 10 possible first-place votes. While San Diego was picked to win, the league's coaches also expect a competitive conference race as only six points separate the Toreros from Dayton and Jacksonville who were picked to finish tied for second. Dayton, a perennial favorite, picked up three first place votes and 71 points while 2008 PFL Champion Jacksonville received the other two first place votes and also finished with 71 points:
