WEEK 10 PREVIEW

The PFL's three unbeaten teams will square off against one another during the season's final three weeks. First up is the Week 10 match up between Butler and Dayton. Meanwhile, Drake, the league's other unbeaten, hosts PFL first-time winner Campbell. Valparaiso seeks its season's first PFL win at Jacksonville while Davidson heads cross country to visit San Diego. Elsewhere, Marist steps out of PFL conference action to host former Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference conference foe Georgetown. Morehead State will get the week off after nine straight weeks of action.

Butler, one of the FCS's last unbeaten teams, travels to Dayton, the league's nine-time champion. Butler survived its Week 9 scare from Davidson and has won its five league outings by just 31 points (6.2 ppg). Dayton also survived a scare from San Diego last week but has won its five league outings by 88 points (17.6 ppg). Butler has won its three road trips this season while Dayton is 3-1 at home after a season-opening home loss.

Valparaiso seeks to end its six-game losing streak with a visit to Jacksonville. The Crusaders have not scored more than two touchdowns in any of their PFL outings, including being shutout at Marist last week. The Dolphins have scored more than 30 points in each of their last three outings, but surrendered a season-high 45 to Drake in last week's loss.

Marist steps out of PFL play in Week 10 to host Georgetown. The two were members of the former Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Football League from 1994-99. Marist has won the last two meetings in Poughkeepsie (2001, 2007), but has needed overtime in both instances.

Fresh off its first-ever PFL victory, Campbell takes to the road to visit Drake, the league's third unbeaten team. The Camels needed a come-from-behind effort to down Morehead State for its PFL victory last week. Drake won a shootout with Jacksonville last week and is unbeaten at home (4-0) this season.

Davidson makes the trek from North Carolina to California to square off against San Diego. Both teams bring three-game losing streaks to the contest. The Wildcats dropped a 14-7 decision at Butler while the Toreros dropped a 21-14 decision at Dayton. San Diego has lost two straight at Torero Stadium (1-2) but Davidson has not won a road contest this season (0-4).

Valentino was the go-to guy as Dayton stayed unbeaten in PFL play with a 21-14 come-from-behind victory against San Diego, Saturday. Down 14-7 at halftime, Valentino rushed for two second-half touchdowns. He capped an 11-play, 73-yard drive with a 15-yard touchdown run to tie the game in the third quarter. Valentino gave Dayton the lead with a one-yard scoring run that capped a nine-play, 61-yard drive. He completed 13-of-33 passes for 185 yards and a first-quarter touchdown. On the ground, he carried the ball 17 times for 107 yards and the two touchdowns. He finished the day with 292 yards of total offense.

Cody Lyon, Campbell

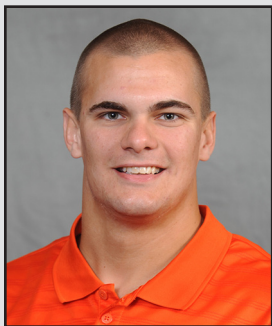
Sophomore, Defensive Back, Raleigh, N.C.

Lyon had two interceptions and ran one back for a touchdown to help Campbell secure a 31-22 PFL victory against Morehead State, Saturday. His interception in the second quarter stopped a Morehead State scoring drive at the Campbell 16-yard line and kept the Camels within a point, 14-13, at halftime. Lyon's returned his second interception 45 yards for a touchdown for Campbell's final score, cementing the victory. He also had nine tackles (seven solo) and was the team's second-leading tackler.

Willets made three field goals for the second consecutive week and kept Campbell close early on in its 31-22 PFL victory against Morehead State, Saturday. He opened the game's scoring with a 39-yard boot in the first quarter. In the second quarter, Willets booted a career-long 44-yard field goal to narrow the deficit to 14-13 at halftime. His third-quarter, 29-yard field goal gave Campbell the lead again and they would not surrender it. He made all three of his field goals and tacked on a pair of PATs to finish with 11 points. Willets also averaged 57.6 yards on his seven kickoffs.

2009 PFL QUICK SNAPS

THREE WEEKS TO DECIDE THE PFL CHAMPION?: In a bit of scheduling serendipity PFL regular-season race will come down to the season's final three weeks. Each of the league's three unbeaten teams will play one another during the final weeks and each team will host one home game. However, each of the teams will need to watch out for a spoiler when not playing one of the unbeaten triumvirate. Jacksonville and Marist each are close behind with two losses and could join the fray if the top teams falter down the stretch. The winner of the 2009 PFL regular-season crown earns the right to host the Northeast Conference Champion in the fourth installment of the Gridiron Classic, Dec. 5.

BUTLER ONE OF THREE REMAINING UNBEATENS IN FCS: Butler enters Week 10 as one of three remaining unbeaten teams in the FCS. The Bulldogs are joined by Montana (8-0, Big Sky) and Richmond (7-0, Colonial) as the only teams left with an unblemished mark this season.

YOUTH MOVEMENT AT SIGNAL CALLER: A youth movement is afoot among the PFL's quarterback corps. Four teams – Butler, Drake, Jacksonville and Valparaiso – have regularly used a sophomore signal caller this season while Marist has seen its sophomore quarterback split time with a senior. Three sophomores – Butler's Andrew Huck, Jacksonville's Josh McGregor and Drake's Mike Pitkowski – are ranked 1-2-3 among the league's passing yardage leaders. No. 4 on the list is Dayton senior quarterback Steve Valentino who is starting at quarterback for the first time in his collegiate career. In addition, San Diego has turned to redshirt freshman Sam Scudellari (No. 5 on the list) to take the snaps the rest of this season after senior Sebastian Trujillo left the team due to personal reasons.

PFL ALUMNI IN THE NFL: Two PFL alumni are seeing regular playing time as professionals. San Diego alumnus Josh Johnson is the starting quarterback for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, getting the nod in Week 3 at Washington. Drake alumnus Billy Cundiff was picked up as a kicker by the Cleveland Browns and also made his first 2009 appearance during Week 3 at Baltimore. It is Johnson's second season in the NFL while Cundiff is in his sixth season.

CAMPBELL POSTS FIRST HOME VICTORY: A long wait came to an end, Sept. 5, when Campbell defeated Methodist, 48-28, at Barker-Lane Stadium. It was the Camels first victory at their home constructed prior to the 2008 campaign as part of its return to football.

WELCOME MARIST: For the second-straight season the Pioneer Football League welcomes a new member into its ranks. Marist College in Poughkeepsie, N.Y. becomes the league's 10th member. A former member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference-Football League, the Red Foxes played 2008 as an independent, posting a 4-7 record, including a 1-1 record against PFL members. They followed the addition of Campbell, a first-year program, during the 2008 season.

BUTLER LINEBACKER GRANT HUNTER A PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SELECTION: Butler's Grant Hunter was named to Phil Steele College Football Preview's Preseason FCS All-American Second Team. Hunter, a redshirt sophomore defensive end, was a First-Team All-Pioneer Football League selection last season after leading the league in sacks (14) – the second most in Butler program history. He also ranked second among PFL tackles in tackles for loss (18). Hunter was the lone PFL player selected among the 56 players recognized on the first and second teams.

VALPARAISO'S ADAM RUNDH NOMINATED TO ALLSTATE/AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM: Valparaiso senior defensive lineman Adam Rundh is one of a record 106 student-athletes nominated for the 2009 Allstate American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Good Works Teams. Rundh has been actively involved in the Valparaiso community during his career. He has been a part of several projects at local elementary schools, including participation in a volunteer tutoring program at Parkview Elementary. Rundh also helped organize a book sale to raise money for Opportunity Enterprises, a local organization that promotes self-sufficiency and life choices for challenged individuals. He also helped with a local Christmas gift collection for local families in need. Rundh also has excelled in the classroom, earning ESPN The Magazine Second-Team Academic All-America honors as a junior. He also was a First Team Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar Award recipient in 2007. On the field, he has twice received honorable mention All-PFL honors.

DRAKE RECORDS HISTORIC 550th VICTORY: Drake recorded the 550th win in program history with its season-opening victory against Grand View, Sept. 5. The Bulldogs are one of three PFL teams with 500 or more victories during their history. Below is a look at each PFL program's current all-time wins total, according to the NCAA:

MORE ABOUT VICTORIES: Last season, Dayton became the 11th NCAA FCS team – and the first west of the Alleghenies – to win at least 600 games in its football history when it downed Davidson. Here are the 12 members of the club, heading into the 2009 season. Yale (853), Harvard (798), Penn (796), Princeton (780), Fordham (738), Dartmouth (643), Lafayette (640), Delaware (633), Lehigh (625), Cornell (616), Dayton (603) and North Dakota State (601).

DAYTON SHUTOUT STREAK STILL GOING STRONG: Including Saturday's victory at Valparaiso, the Flyers have not been shutout in 374 consecutive games, dating back to Oct. 16, 1976. 2009 PFL QUICK SNAPS

SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL: For the fourth consecutive season, the Pioneer Football League's coaches have tabbed San Diego as the preseason favorite in the PFL Preseason Coaches' Poll, receiving only five of 10 possible first-place votes. While San Diego was picked to win, the league's coaches also expect a competitive conference race as only six points separate the Toreros from Dayton and Jacksonville who were picked to finish tied for second. Dayton, a perennial favorite, picked up three first place votes and 71 points while 2008 PFL Champion Jacksonville received the other two first place votes and also finished with 71 points:

game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 20-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

DIVISION I FCS, PLEASE: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Pioneer Football League competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship
