## WEEK 11 PREVIEW

The PFL's two remaining unbeaten teams will have to buck history if they are to stay unbeaten following Week 11. Butler hits the road to face a Jacksonville squad it has not beaten in four tries. Drake closes out its home schedule against a Dayton team that has won the last six meetings in Drake Stadium. Elsewhere, Marist looks to extend its win streak to six games with a visit to Davidson, San Diego ends its PFL slate at winless Morehead State and Campbell visits Valparaiso for the first time.

Butler enters Week 11 as one of just two FCS unbeaten squads but will have to post its first-ever victory against Jacksonville to remain perfect through 11 weeks. The Bulldogs survived a Hail Mary at Dayton to win in Week 10 but saw its average margin of victory fall to 5.7 points in PFL play this season. The Dolphins rebounded from their second PFL loss with a home victory against Valparaiso in Week 10 and boast the league's top-scoring offense, averaging 35.7 points per PFL game.

Marist has quietly won five straight contests, including its last four PFL outings, and travels to Davidson which has won two of its three PFL outings at home this season. The Red Foxes extended their win streak with a non-conference victory against Georgetown but scored 23 points, the fewest in any of its six victories this season. The Wildcats ended a three-game losing streak with a victory at San Diego, scoring a season-high 34 points, and return home where they are 2-2 this season.

San Diego will close out its PFL schedule with a trip to Morehead State. The Teros have battled quarterback injury woes all season and enter Saturday's contest with a four-game losing streak after falling to Davidson in Week 10. The Eagles took Week 10 off and will seek its season's first PFL victory but will need to win for the first time in its series against San Diego.

Campbell makes its final regular-season road trip when it visits Valparaiso. The Camels have not won on the road this season, a streak lengthened with its loss at Drake last week. The Crusaders are seeking their season's first PFL victory after falling at Jacksonville last week despite posting 20 points — its third outing 20 or more points this season.

Dayton, freshly knocked from the ranks of the unbeaten, will seek to rebound when it travels to Drake. The Flyers dropped its first PFL contest to unbeaten Butler last week but travels to Des Moines where it has not lost in its last six visits. The Bulldogs won their sixth-straight contest by downing Campbell in Week 10, scoring a season-high 49 points — the second straight week they have scored more than 40 points.

### Andrew Huck, Butler

Sophomore, Quarterback, Bloomington, Ind.

Huck ran for three touchdowns and passed for another two as Butler remained unbeaten with a 31-28 PFL victory at Dayton, Saturday. He rallied the Bulldogs from a 7-0 first quarter deficit with a pair of second quarter touchdowns and they would not trail the game's remainder. Huck completed 12-of-29 passes for 146 yards and two touchdowns and carried the ball 12 times for 54 yards and three touchdowns. He had two seven yard touchdown carries and a 36-yard TD sprint. His seven-yard scoring pass to Dan Bohrer gave the Bulldogs the lead for good and he later added a 16-yard touchdown pass to Carter Wiley.

## 2009 PFL QUICK SNAPS

### HUCK NAMED TO COLLEGE SPORTING NEWS ALL-STARS

**LIST:** Sophomore quarterback Andrew Huck was named the College Sporting News' National All-Star list, Nov. 9, following his five-touchdown performance at Dayton, Nov. 7. He ran for three touchdowns and passed for another two, completing 12-of-29 passes for 146 yards and carrying the ball 12 times for 54 yards.

**TWO WEEKS TO DECIDE THE PFL CHAMPION?:** In a bit of scheduling serendipity PFL regular-season race has come down to the season's final three weeks. Each of the league's three unbeaten teams will play one another during the final weeks and each team will host one home game. Butler won the opening round of the "playoff" by winning at Dayton for the first time since 1988 while Drake remained unbeaten with a home win against Campbell. The second round has Drake hosting Dayton, who is now hoping to play spoiler. Meanwhile Butler travels to Jacksonville, who has two losses and would be happy to see the top three come its way in the standings. The winner of the 2009 PFL regular-season crown earns the right to host the Northeast Conference Champion in the fourth installment of the Gridiron Classic, Dec. 5.

**BUTLER ONE OF TWO REMAINING UNBEATENS IN FCS:** Butler enters Week 11 as one of two remaining unbeaten teams in the FCS. The Bulldogs and Montana (9-0, Big Sky) remain while Richmond fell from the unbeaten ranks after losing at home to Villanova. Butler is 9-0 for the first time since 1961, its last unbeaten season, and have tied the school record for wins in a season.

**PFL WELL REPRESENTED ON ESPN The MAGAZINE CoSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT LIST:** Twenty-Four Pioneer Football League student-athletes were selected to their respective ESPN The Magazine All-District squads as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). Dayton and Marist each led the way with five first-team selections. Dayton had eight student-athletes receive either first or second team honors. A complete listing of those Pioneer Football League student-athletes receiving Academic All-District recognition are listed on page five. To be nominated, student-athletes must be a starter or important reserve, and carry a cumulative grade point average of 3.20 or higher. Team members are selected by a vote of members of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) within the district.

**RUNDH ONE OF TEN FINALISTS FOR SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD:** Valparaiso's Adam Rundh has been named as one of the top-10 finalists for the fifth annual Sportsmanship Award handed out by the Awards and Recognition Association (ARA). The award is giving to one outstanding NCAA Division I collegiate football player who best personifies the spirit of sportsmanship. The 2009 Sportsmanship Award recipient will be chosen from one of these 10 finalists and announced this December. Rundh is one of only two finalists from NCAA Division I-FCS schools. To qualify for the award, an athlete must be a starting player or significant contributor on his team; be an athlete in good academic standing; demonstrate great respect for competitors, school, teammates and coaches; show an ability to accept victory and defeat graciously; convey a high degree of humility and integrity; and demonstrate commitment in the classroom and to the community.

**YOUTH MOVEMENT AT SIGNAL CALLER:** A youth movement is afoot among the PFL's quarterback corps. Four teams – Butler, Drake, Jacksonville and Valparaiso – have regularly used a sophomore signal caller this season while Marist has seen its sophomore quarterback split time with a senior. Three sophomores – Butler's Andrew Huck, Jacksonville's Josh McGregor and Drake's Mike Pitkowski – are ranked 1-2-3 among the league's passing yardage leaders. No. 4 on the list is Dayton senior quarterback Steve Valentino who is starting at quarterback for the first time in his collegiate career. In addition, San Diego has turned to redshirt freshman Sam Scudellari (No. 5 on the list) to take the snaps the rest of this season after senior Sebastian Trujillo left the team due to personal reasons.

**PFL ALUMNI IN THE NFL:** Two PFL alumni are seeing regular playing time as professionals. San Diego alumnus Josh Johnson is the starting quarterback for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, getting the nod in Week 3 at Washington. Drake alumnus Billy Cundiff was picked up as a kicker by the Cleveland Browns and also made his first 2009 appearance during Week 3 at Baltimore, but was released by the team following Week 9 action. It is Johnson's second season in the NFL while Cundiff is in his sixth season.

**CAMPBELL POSTS FIRST HOME VICTORY:** A long wait came to an end, Sept. 5, when Campbell defeated Methodist, 48-28, at Barker-Lane Stadium. It was the Camels first victory at their home constructed prior to the 2008 campaign as part of its return to football.

**WELCOME MARIST:** For the second-straight season the Pioneer Football League welcomes a new member into its ranks. Marist College in Poughkeepsie, N.Y. becomes the league's 10th member. A former member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference-Football League, the Red Foxes played 2008 as an independent, posting a 4-7 record, including a 1-1 record against PFL members. They followed the addition of Campbell, a first-year program, during the 2008 season.

**BUTLER LINEBACKER GRANT HUNTER A PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA SELECTION:** Butler's Grant Hunter was named to Phil Steele College Football Preview's Preseason FCS All-American Second Team. Hunter, a redshirt sophomore defensive end, was a First-Team All-Pioneer Football League selection last season after leading the league in sacks (14) – the second most in Butler program history. He also ranked second among PFL tackles in tackles for loss (18). Hunter was the lone PFL player selected among the 56 players recognized on the first and second teams.

**VALPARAISO'S ADAM RUNDH NOMINATED TO ALLSTATE/ AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM:** Valparaiso senior defensive lineman Adam Rundh is one of a record 106 student-athletes nominated for the 2009 Allstate American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Good Works Teams. Rundh has been actively involved in the Valparaiso community during his career. He has been a part of several projects at local elementary schools, including participation in a volunteer tutoring program at Parkview Elementary. Rundh also helped organize a book sale to raise money for Opportunity Enterprises, a local organization that promotes self-sufficiency and life choices for challenged individuals. He also helped with a local Christmas gift collection for local families in need. Rundh also has excelled in the classroom, earning ESPN The Magazine Second-Team Academic All-America honors as a junior. He also was a First Team Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar Award recipient in 2007. On the field, he has twice received honorable mention All-PFL honors.

**DRAKE RECORDS HISTORIC 550th VICTORY:** Drake recorded the 550th win in program history with its season-opening victory against Grand View, Sept. 5. ## 2009 PFL QUICK SNAPS

**DAYTON SHUTOUT STREAK STILL GOING STRONG:** Including Saturday's loss to Butler, the Flyers have not been shutout in 375 consecutive games, dating back to Oct. 16, 1976. During that streak Dayton has shutout its opponent 63 times. A list of the last shutout win and loss for each PFL squad is available on page 7.

**SAN DIEGO PICKED TO WIN PFL:** For the fourth consecutive season, the Pioneer Football League's coaches have tabbed San Diego as the preseason favorite in the PFL Preseason Coaches' Poll, receiving only five of 10 possible first-place votes. While San Diego was picked to win, the league's coaches also expect a competitive conference race as only six points separate the Toreros from Dayton and Jacksonville who were picked to finish tied for second. Dayton, a perennial favorite, picked up three first place votes and 71 points while 2008 PFL Champion Jacksonville received the other two first place votes and also finished with 71 points:

**DIVISION I FCS, PLEASE:** Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Pioneer Football League competes has been

retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 20-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

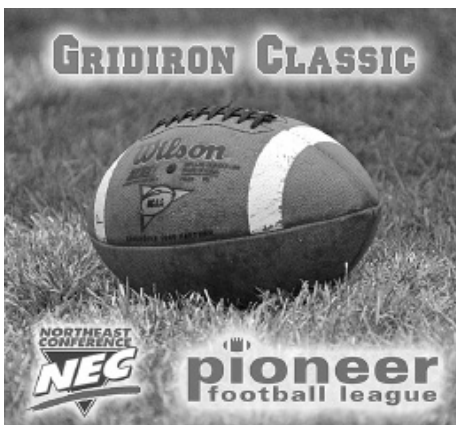
