WEEK 8 PREVIEW

JACKSONVILLE returns home after a successful road excursion to host **MARIST**. The Red Foxes stunned the Dolphins last season, scoring with six seconds remaining to post a 31-27 victory. Jacksonville running back Rudell Small is averaging 102.9 yards per game after posting 192 yards at Valparaiso last week. Marist wideout James LaMacchia showed his double-threat ability last week, returning a punt 69 yards for a touchdown against San Diego. **MOREHEAD STATE** travels to **BUTLER** after both squads lost at home in Week 7. Butler rolled up 348 yards offense in Week 7 but had just 13 points to show for its effort – kicker David Lang scoring six points on field goals of 41 and 38 yards. Morehead State's offensive output dropped to 218 yards in its Week 7 loss – quarterback Zach Lewis completed 16 passes for 171 yards. **CAMPBELL** returns to the road where it's unbeaten, but will meet a **DAYTON** squad that is unbeaten at home. Campbell gathered 154 rushing yards in a Week 7 loss, with four rushers finishing between 33 and 48 net yards rushing. Dayton scored on all six of its red-zone possessions in a Week 7 road victory, quarterback Steve Valentino passing for 208 yards and rushing for a team-best 74 yards. **DAVIDSON** also returns to the road where it has posted both its victories this season and meets a **DRAKE** squad that will be playing its third home game this campaign. Both teams survived final-drive scares to win their Week 7 road outings. Drake wideout Drew Blackmon caught eight passes for 122 yards, including a 42-yard touchdown pass that gave his team an eight-point fourth-quarter lead last week. Meanwhile, Davidson needed a crucial sack by Lewis McAlister to stymie a late Morehead State drive to secure victory, it was one of a career-high three sacks for McAlister. **VALPARAISO** will look to find the win column for the first time this season when it visits **SAN DIEGO** which returns home after its second cross-country trip. Valparaiso's offense has shown flashes this season, including a 52-yard touchdown pass by Nate Goergen in Week 7. San Diego's offense has continued to improve as the season has progressed, recording its third 300-yard outing in its last four games. Quarterback Mason Mills has led the effort, passing for 258 yards and running for 72 yards in last week's victory.

2010 PIONEER FOOTBALL LEAGUE WEEKLY REPORT

NEWS AND NOTES FROM THE PFL:

CHAMPIONSHIP RACE: Current league co-leaders Dayton and Jacksonville will not meet each other this season due to the PFL's eight-game league schedule. It is the second season the Flyers and Dolphins will not meet one another. However, next season the two teams will resume their series as their game will rotate back into the league slate.

BUTLER: Butler lost at home to Dayton despite a nearly even offensive battle – Dayton posting a narrow 349-348 advantage. Linebacker Jordan Ridley finished with 10 tackles against the Flyers, his sixth consecutive game reaching double-digits in tackles. Kicker David Lang booted a career-long 41-yard field goal to get Butler on the scoreboard and later added a 38-yard kick.

CAMPBELL: Campbell's 14-12 loss to Drake last week was the third consecutive game the Camels have lost a home contest by three points or less. Quarterback Daniel Polk completed a career-high 18 passes in the loss but his lone score came on one of his 13 carries – his eighth rushing touchdown this season. Kicker Adam Willets had six of the team's 12 points courtesy field goals of 20 and 38 yards.

DAVIDSON: Davidson won the first of its two games during its current road trip, winning at Morehead State. The Wildcats prevailed courtesy Jonathan Carkhuff's 71-yard touchdown pass to Lanny Funsten. Carkhuff finished with a career-best 270 passing yards. Funsten had seven catches for 175 yards (25.0 yards per reception) and two touchdowns. It is the 11th-best single-game reception effort in Davidson history.

DAYTON: Dayton ran its win streak to five games with a victory at Butler last week. Despite a one-yard advantage in total offense (349-348), the Flyers scored each of the six times they reached the red zone. Meanwhile, the defense limited Butler to three visits to the Redzone and allowed only 10 points (a touchdown and field goal). Quarterback Steve Valentino accounted for 282 offensive yards, rushing for a team-best 74 yards on 12 carries.

DRAKE: Drake returns to Drake Stadium after playing five of its last six games on the road. The Bulldogs held on to win at Campbell last week, the two-point margin of victory the third time this season Drake has been involved in a game where less than a touchdown decided the victor – they are 2-1 in those games. Wideout Drew Blackmon caught eight passes for 122 yards and a touchdown at Campbell, and needs just two receptions to surpass his 2009 reception total (31).

JACKSONVILLE: Jacksonville won its fifth consecutive game this season at Valparaiso, the second-longest win streak in program history. The Dolphins scored a PFL record 86 points in the victory at Valparaiso, posting a school-record 656 yards of offense. Quarterback Josh McGregor threw for 320 yards, his fifth consecutive game passing for more than 300 yards.

MARIST: Marist remained winless against San Diego, dropping a 14-10 decision. It is the fourth time in the last 15 games the Red Foxes have been involved in a game where the last score determined the outcome. Wideout James LaMacchia (2,018 yards) needs just two receiving yards to become Marist's career receiving yards leader. He had a 69-yard punt return for a touchdown in last week's game. Free safety Rory Foley enters the week-end with 272 career tackles, five shy of becoming the program's all-time leading tackler.

MOREHEAD STATE: Morehead State suffered its second consecutive loss to Davidson, but first loss to the Wildcats at Jayne Stadium. Defensive end Jerome Raymond had a 48-yard fumble return to set up the Eagles only touchdown. Kicker Rainer Duzan missed his season's first field goal and is now 4-of-5 on the season and 17-of-17 on PATs. Quarterback Zach Lewis needs to average 275 yards per game the season's remainder to set the Morehead State single-season passing yardage record.

SAN DIEGO: San Diego improved to 6-0 all-time against Marist, winning in its first visit to Poughkeepsie. Running back Sam Hoekstra's first collegiate touchdown was a memorable one, his seven-yard reception lifting the Toreros to victory with 30 seconds remaining. Senior wideout Godfrey Smith caught nine passes for 174 yards (19.3 yards per receptions) and a touchdown.

VALPARAISO: Valparaiso punter Greg Wood averaged 45.4 yards per punt on his nine punts against Jacksonville, placing two inside the 20-yard line. Kick returner Eric Slenk finished the day with 296 all-purpose yards, including 220 kick-return yards and averaged 18.3 yards per kick return. Adrian Gober recorded two interceptions against the Dolphins, his first setting up the Crusaders first touchdown.

PROLIFIC QUARTERBACKS: Jacksonville quarterback Josh McGregor continues to lead all FCS signal-callers with 21 touchdown passes this season, averaging a touchdown for every 10.95 attempts. Morehead State quarterback Zach Lewis is 13th in touchdown passes, completing 13 touchdown passes and is averaging a TD pass for every 16.46 attempts. Campbell quarterback Daniel Polk enters the week ranked second among FCS quarterbacks in scoring with eight touchdowns, trailing Missouri State's Cody Kirby (11) and tied with Appalachian State's DeAndre Pressley (eight).

WEEK SEVEN HONOREES BY COLLEGE FOOTBALL PERFORMANCE AWARDS: Davidson's Lanny Funsten (wide receiver) and Marist's James LaMacchia (punt returner) each received national performer of the week awards at their respective positions from the College Football Performance Awards, which are based on objective, scientific methodologies. Honorable mention recognition went to Butler's David Lang (placekicker), Davidson's Lewis McAlister (defensive line), Jacksonville's Rudell Small (running back), J.J. Laster (running back) and Mike Mayorall (defensive line), Valparaiso's Greg Wood (punter) and Marist's Kevin Pauly (punter). TRIO NAMED TO CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST LIST: Dayton defensive end Brandon Wingeier, Drake offensive lineman Dan Blinton and Marist nose tackle Terrence Turner were among the 121 semifinalists for the 2010 William V. Campbell Trophy, endowed by Healthsouth, the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame Announced, Sept. 30. Nominated by their schools, semifinalists must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. Renamed last fall in honor of Bill Campbell, the chairman of Intuit, former player and head coach at Columbia University and the 2004 recipient of the NFF's Gold Medal, the award comes with a 25-pound bronze trophy and a \$25,000 post-graduate scholarship.

DAVIDSON'S BEHM, DAYTON'S PRINDLE NAMED TO ALL-STATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM: Davidson junior linebacker John Behm and Dayton junior offensive lineman John Prindle were each named to the Allstate American Football Coaches Association Good Works Team, the two organizations announced, Wednesday. They were two of only 22 football student-athletes selected by the organization to receive the honor, one of the most prestigious off-the-field honors in college football. A total of 112 players across all collegiate levels of the sport were nominated for the award by sports information directors on behalf of their teams, the most ever in the 19-year history of the program. From the nominations, a special selection committee named 22 college football players from across the country to the 2010 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Of the two 11-member teams, one includes players competing in the NCAA® Football Bowl Subdivision (I-A) and the other is a com-

THREE FORMER PFL ATHLETES START SEASON ON NFL ACTIVE ROSTERS: Former San Diego wideout John Mathews became the third former PFL athlete to start the 2010 NFL season on an active roster when he was signed, Saturday, by Jacksonville to replace injured wide receiver Jarett Dillard. Mathews spent the preseason with the Jaguars before being waived during final cuts. He joined former Drake kicker Billy Cundiff and former San Diego quarterback Josh Johnson on NFL active rosters during the opening weekend. Cundiff was named Baltimore's starting kicker after winning the job during the preseason. Johnson is Tampa Bay's No. 2 quarterback behind starter Josh Freeman.

bined team representing the NCAA® Football Championship Subdivision (I-AA), Divisions II, III, and the NAIA.

DAYTON'S VALENTINO NAMED TO PAYTON WATCH LIST: Dayton quarterback Steve Valentino, the 2009 PFL "Offensive Player of the Year," has been named to the Walter Payton Award Watch List by the Sports Network. Last season was Valentino's first at quarterback after spending a year as a receiver. He led the Flyers to a 9-1 record while under center and led all PFL players in total offensive yards (281.6 yards per game) and all PFL quarterbacks in rushing yards (722). The Payton Award annual recognizes the FCS Offensive Player of the Year and is presented the night prior to the Division I Football Championship.

DAYTON'S VERCAMMEN NAMED TO BUCHANAN WATCH LIST: Coming off a record-setting year on defense, Dayton defensive back James Vercammen was named to the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List by the Sports Network. A 2010 co-captain, Vercammen set a PFL record with 134 total tackles in 2009, 25 more than the next closest athlete. The Buchanan Award annual recognized the FCS "Defensive Player of the Year" and is presented the night prior to the Division I Football Championship.

DAYTON SHUTOUT STREAK STILL GOING STRONG: Entering the 2010 season, the Flyers have not been shutout in 377 consecutive games, dating back to Oct. 16, 1976. During that streak Dayton has shutout its opponent 63 times. A list of the last shutout win and loss for each PFL squad is available on page 8.

MARIST NEARS 150TH ALL-TIME VICTORY: Marist needs three victories in 2010 to record the program's 150th victory. They are among a wide-ranging number of victories by PFL members. Leading the group is Dayton – in its 103rd season – entered the year with 612 wins. At the other end is Campbell, which enters its third season of football in 2010 with four victories to its credit. (See *PFL All-Time Victories, page 7*)

DAYTON PICKED TO WIN PFL: Ten-time Pioneer Football League Champion Dayton was tapped as the favorite in the league's pre-season coaches' poll. The Flyers received four first-place votes and 71 points. Also receiving first-place votes were second-pick Butler (two first-place votes) and third-pick Jacksonville (four first-place votes). Only eight points separated the top three teams in the 2010 poll, listed below:

NEW SIGHTS AWAIT AT PFL SCHOOLS: A building boom of sorts overtook the league's members over the summer with Butler and Jacksonville renovating their football facilities while Valparaiso added lights to Brown Stadium. Butler is completing renovations to its seating area and press box at the Butler Bowl, matching updates to its playing surface in 2005. Jacksonville has installed a new AstroTurf playing surface at D.B. Milne Field, replacing the natural turf that was the field's surface since 1998. One year after installing its

own artificial surface, Valparaiso has added lights at Brown Stadium and will play its first-ever game under the lights when it hosts St. Joseph's (Ind.), Sept. 18.

2010 NCAA INFORMATION TO KNOW

NCAA DIVISION I FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP EXPANDS, CHANGES LOCATIONS:

In 2010, 20 teams will qualify for the NCAA Division I Football Championship.

It is the first time since 1987 the NCAA Division I Football Championship has been expanded – then from 12 teams to 16 teams. In addition 10 of the 14 FCS conferences will receive automatic bids into the tournament – the Big South and Northeast Conferences gaining automatic berths. Entering 2010 there are 124 programs competing in football at the Division I FCS level.

PFL COULD RECEIVE AT-LARGE BID IN 2010: While the PFL did not receive a automatic qualifying spot into the 2010 championship, the league could still receive what would amount to an automatic at-large bid. Under criteria established by the championship committee, the PFL champion could receive an automatic at-large bid if it meets three criteria. First, it must win eight games against Division I opposition. Secondly, it must win two games against opponents from the 10 automatic qualifying conferences. Finally, it must finish the season ranked among the top 20 in the polls as calculated by the championship committee.

DIVISION I FCS, PLEASE: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Pioneer Football League competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 20-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.
