## WEEK 10 PREVIEW

**JACKSONVILLE**, the 2008 PFL champion, and **BUTLER**, a 2009 PFL co-champion, will square off in Indianapolis. Jacksonville has won all five previous meetings in the series, including last season's contest in Jacksonville which prevented Butler from winning the title outright. The Dolphins have scored more than 50 points in each of their last three outings while the Bulldogs 48-point total in Week 9 was a season-high. Jacksonville's Josh McGregor threw for a PFL-record tying seven touchdowns last week and has 29 touchdown passes this season. Butler quarterback Andrew Huck has completed 60 percent of his passes this season and has 10 touchdown tosses 🏈 The week's other key contest will pit league co-leader and defending co-champion **DAYTON** against second-place **DRAKE** in Dayton. The Flyers, who have won eight straight PFL games, have quietly kept pace with the high-flying Dolphins in search of their 11 PFL title. They will have to get past a Bulldogs squad that has averaged 40 points in its last two games and brings a three-game win streak into Saturday's meeting. Dayton quarterback Steve Valentino leads all PFL quarterbacks in rushing, averaging 62.1 yards per game. Drake's Pat Cashmore (seven TDs) and Steve Platek (six TDs) are both ranked among the league's top 10 in touchdowns scored 🏈 **DAVIDSON** will make its first trip to **MARIST** in a battle of 2-4 squads. The Wildcats have lost their last two contests after getting to 2-2, scoring just 23 total points in those losses. The Red Foxes won at Campbell in Week 9, scoring 42 points, but both of their PFL wins have come against team's behind them in the standings. Davidson quarterback Jonathan Carkhuff followed a 56-pass outing in Week 8 with 39 passes in Week 9 and is averaging 30.8 pass attempts per game. Marist wideout James LaMacchia leads the league with 7.1 receptions per game and caught 11 passes for 151 yards last week 🏈 **VALPARAISO** and **CAMPBELL** will square off in a series that has seen the visiting team win each of the two meetings. The Camels have not won at Barker-Lane Stadium this season while the Crusaders have not won on the road in the current campaign. Campbell boasts one of the league's more prolific rushing attacks, averaging 181.1 yards per game and leading the league with 349 rushing attempts. Valparaiso has attempted more passes (313) than rushes (290) this season, quarterback Nate Goergen completing 55.2 percent of his attempts 🏈 **MOREHEAD STATE** will make the trip westward where **SAN DIEGO** will host its final home contest in 2010. Both squads are coming off Week 9 losses to one of the league's top three teams. Morehead State quarterback Zach Lewis has throw 14 touchdown passes and is averaging 266.8 yards per game in his sophomore campaign. San Diego signal-caller Mason Mills has 12 touchdown passes and is averaging 186.7 yards per game in his sophomore effort.

McGregor tied a PFL record with seven touchdown passes as Jacksonville downed Morehead State, 61-17, in Saturday PFL action. He completed 15-of-19 passes for 347 yards, averaging 23.13 yards per completion. McGregor's seven TDs set the school record and are tied for the most by a FCS quarterback this season (Murray State's Casey Brockman). He threw touchdown passes to four different receivers, wideout Josh Philpart catching three, and Rudell Small and Rodney Sumter each grabbing a pair.

His interception came on the game's opening drive, which San Diego pushed to the 10-yard line before the interception. It was the Bulldogs only score until they posted a touchdown with 12 seconds remaining in the half. Morrison added three tackles (two solo).

### **Rolando Fines, Jacksonville** ▶

Junior, Defensive Lineman, Tampa, Fla.

Fines led Jacksonville with eight tackles, but was a constant presence in the backfield as Jacksonville posted a 61-17 PFL victory at Morehead State,

Saturday. He was responsible for three of the Dolphins five sacks on the day, finishing with four tackles for loss. His sacks totaled 23 yards in losses and helped limit Morehead State to 11 net yards on the ground in 20 attempts.

## NEWS AND NOTES FROM THE PFL:

**OFFENSE:** Andrew Huck (BUT), Daniel Polk (CAM), Steve Valentino (DAY), Pat Cashmore (DRA), James LaMacchia (MAR), Ronnie McDermott (MOR)

**BUTLER:** Butler's defense posted a shutout for the first time since 1998 – a span of 128 games – with its shutout at Valparaiso, Saturday. Quarterback Andrew Huck completed 12 passes for 186 yards and two touchdowns. Linebacker Jordan Ridley had a team-high eight tackles, the eighth consecutive game he has led the Bulldogs defensive effort. Kicker David Lang made a pair of field goals, bringing his season total to a Butler record-tying 11 this season.

**CAMPBELL:** Quarterback Daniel Polk completed a career-high 20 passes for 165 yards and two touchdowns in Saturday's loss to Marist. The Camels did not attempt a punt in the contest, their 10 possessions ending with two touchdowns, two interceptions, two turnovers on downs, a missed field goal, a fumble and twice by the end of the period. Campbell has not won game at Barker-Lane Stadium this season.

**DAVIDSON:** Quarterback Jonathan Carkhuff has been a busy man in the Wildcats last three games, hoisting 128 of his season's 245 pass attempts in that span, including 56 attempts two weeks ago. Kicker Ben Behrendt had two field goals and an extra point against Dayton to reach the 100 career point plateau. Return specialist Justin Williams is averaging a league-best 143.6 all-purpose yards per game.

**DAYTON:** Quarterback Steve Valentino improved to 17-1 as a starting quarterback with Dayton's victory at Davidson. He completed 11 passes for 223 yards and two touchdowns and added 57 rushing yards. Flyer James Vercammen capped a busy October with five tackles and an interception. He recorded 55 tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss, five sacks, two forced fumbles and an interception during the month.

**DRAKE:** Running back Pat Cashmore was the only PFL runner to record 100 yards in Week 9, with 15 carries for 112 yards and a touchdown in the Bulldogs win against San Diego. Drake forced a season-high five turnovers, including four interceptions... one returned for a touchdown by PFL co-defensive player of the week Ben Morrison. It is the fourth interception return for a touchdown this season, tied with Jacksonville for most in the league.

**JACKSONVILLE:** Jacksonville equaled its longest win streak in school history with its seventh-straight victory, Saturday. The Dolphins have posted more than 500 yards in six of their last seven games and lead the FCS in scoring (45.4) and offensive yardage (512.6) for the second consecutive week. Jacksonville's defense leads the league in defensive pass efficiency (113.4 rating) and interceptions (14). The Dolphins and Drake each have returned four interceptions for touchdowns this season.

**MARIST:** Wideout James LaMacchia grabbed a career-high 11 passes for 151 yards and two touchdowns in the Red Foxes victory at Campbell, Saturday. Quarterback Tommy Reilly completed 21 passes for 313 yards, for just his second career 300-yard passing effort. Junior Mike Rios has blocked three field goals this season and has seven career blocked kicks. He also had an 80-yard catch-and-carry in the contest, all four of his receiving touchdowns this season have been more than 60 yards.

**MOREHEAD STATE:** Quarterback Zach Lewis distributed passes to 11 different Eagles receivers, Saturday. Wideout Ronnie McDermott was his favorite target with seven receptions for 121 yards (17.3 yards per catch). Lewis finished the game with 21 completions for 223 yards.

**SAN DIEGO:** San Diego entered Saturday's game at Drake with a league-low eight turnovers in eight games, but committed five turnovers, including four interceptions. The miscues negated the Toreros narrow advantage in yardage (376-343). San Diego's rushing attack saw its streak of five consecutive 100-yard performances stopped with 68 yards on 43 attempts at Drake.

**VALPARAISO:** Punter Greg Wood has averaged more than 43.0 yards per punt in each of his last five outings, bringing his average for the season up to 42.9 yards per punt. Ten of his 53 punts this season have gone for more than 50 yards, including a season-best 58-yarder against Butler last week.

# 2010 PIONEER FOOTBALL LEAGUE WEEKLY REPORT

**JACKSONVILLE ENTERS COACHES POLL:** After entering The Sports Network/Fathead.com poll last week, Jacksonville found its way into the FCS Coaches Poll this week. The Dolphins entered the coaches poll at No. 25. Jacksonville also moved up one spot in the Fathead.com poll, moving into No. 23.

**DAVIDSON'S JUSTIN WILLIAMS ENTERS PFL RECORD BOOKS:** Davidson all-purpose runner Justin Williams became the PFL's career kick-return yardage leader, Saturday. In his three-plus year career he has amassed 2,536 kick-return yards on 116 returns. He now holds both records previously held by Butler's Justin Campbell who recorded 2,512 yards on 110 returns from 2001-04.

**DEWHIRST SIXTH PFL ATHLETE TO RECORD 100-YARD INT RETURN:** Jacksonville's Jordan Dewhirst became the sixth PFL athlete to return an interception 100 yards for a touchdown, accomplishing the feat against Marist, Oct. 23. He is the first to do so since the 2008 season when Morehead State's David Hyland accomplished the feat against Campbell.

**SPEAKING OF PICK-SIXES:** Seven PFL defenders have returned an interception for a touchdown this season. However, the seven come from just two schools – three from Jacksonville for four touchdowns and one touchdown each by four Drake defenders. Jacksonville's Jordan DeWhirst has done the feat twice this campaign. Here is the current list of pick-sixes (in chronological order) this season:

**DAYTON-JACKSONVILLE NOT ON 2010 PFL SLATE:** Current league co-leaders Dayton and Jacksonville will not meet each other this season due to the PFL's eight-game league schedule. It is the second season the Flyers and Dolphins will not meet one another. However, next season the two teams will resume their series as their game will rotate back into the league slate.

**PROLIFIC QUARTERBACKS:** Jacksonville quarterback Josh McGregor continues to lead all FCS signal-callers with 29 touchdown passes this season, averaging a touchdown for every 9.17 attempts. Campbell quarterback Daniel Polk enters the week ranked fourth among FCS quarterbacks in scoring with eight touchdowns.

**WEEK NINE HONOREES BY COLLEGE FOOTBALL PERFORMANCE AWARDS:** Jacksonville's Josh McGregor was named the "National Performer of the Week" by the College Football Performance Awards, which are based on objective, scientific methodologies. McGregor also was named the group's "Quarterback of the Week." Honorable mention recognition was awarded to four players this week: Marist's James LaMacchia (wide receiver), Drake's Ben Morrison (linebacker), Jacksonville's Joshua Philpart (wide receiver) and Rolando Fines (defensive lineman). **THREE FORMER PFL ATHLETES START SEASON ON NFL ACTIVE ROSTERS:** Former San Diego wideout John Mathews became the third former PFL athlete to start the 2010 NFL season on an active roster when he was signed, Saturday, by Jacksonville to replace injured wide receiver Jarett Dillard. Mathews spent the preseason with the Jaguars before being waived during final cuts. He joined former Drake kicker Billy Cundiff and former San Diego quarterback Josh Johnson on NFL active rosters during the opening weekend. Cundiff was named Baltimore's starting kicker after winning the job during the preseason. Johnson is Tampa Bay's No. 2 quarterback behind starter Josh Freeman.

**TRIO NAMED TO CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALIST LIST:** Dayton defensive end Brandon Wingeier, Drake offensive lineman Dan Blinton and Marist nose tackle Terrence Turner were among the 121 semifinalists for the 2010 William V. Campbell Trophy, endowed by Healthsouth, the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame Announced, Sept. 30. Nominated by their schools, semifinalists must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, ave outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. Renamed last fall in honor of Bill Campbell, the chairman of Intuit, former player and head coach at Columbia University and the 2004 recipient of the NFF's Gold Medal, the award comes with a 25-pound bronze trophy and a \$25,000 post-graduate scholarship.

**DAVIDSON'S BEHM, DAYTON'S PRINDLE NAMED TO ALL-STATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM:** Davidson junior linebacker John Behm and Dayton junior offensive lineman John Prindle were each named to the Allstate American Football Coaches Association Good Works Team, the two organizations announced, Wednesday.

They were two of only 22 football student-athletes selected by the organization to receive the honor, one of the most prestigious off-the-field honors in college football. A total of 112 players across all collegiate levels of the sport were nominated for the award by sports information directors on behalf of their teams, the most ever in the 19-year history of the program. From the nominations, a special selection committee named 22 college football players from across the country to the 2010 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®. Of the two 11-member teams, one includes players competing in the NCAA® Football Bowl Subdivision (I-A) and the other is a combined team representing the NCAA® Football Championship Subdivision (I-AA), Divisions II, III, and the NAIA.

**DAYTON'S VALENTINO NAMED TO PAYTON WATCH LIST:** Dayton quarterback Steve Valentino, the 2009 PFL "Offensive Player of the Year," has been named to the Walter Payton Award Watch List by the Sports Network. Last season was Valentino's first at quarterback after spending a year as a receiver. He led the Flyers to a 9-1 record while under center and led all PFL players in total offensive yards (281.6 yards per game) and all PFL quarterbacks in rushing yards (722). The Payton Award annual recognizes the FCS Offensive Player of the Year and is presented the night prior to the Division I Football Championship.

**DAYTON'S VERCAMMEN NAMED TO BUCHANAN WATCH LIST:** Coming off a record-setting year on defense, Dayton defensive back James Vercammen was named to the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List by the Sports Network. A 2010 co-captain, Vercammen set a PFL record with 134 total tackles in 2009, 25 more than the next closest athlete. The Buchanan Award annual recognized the FCS "Defensive Player of the Year" and is presented the night prior to the Division I Football Championship.

**DAYTON SHUTOUT STREAK STILL GOING STRONG:** Entering the 2010 season, the Flyers have not been shutout in 377 consecutive games, dating back to Oct. 16, 1976. During that streak Dayton has shutout its opponent 63 times. A list of the last shutout win and loss for each PFL squad is available on page 8.

**MARIST NEARS 150TH ALL-TIME VICTORY:** Marist needs three victories in 2010 to record the program's 150th victory. They are among a wide-ranging number of victories by PFL members. Leading the group is Dayton – in its 103rd season – entered the year with 612 wins. At the other end is Campbell, which enters its third season of football in 2010 with four victories to its credit. (*See PFL All-Time Victories, page 7*)

**DAYTON PICKED TO WIN PFL:** Ten-time Pioneer Football League Champion Dayton was tapped as the favorite in the league's pre-season coaches' poll. The Flyers received four first-place votes and 71 points. Also receiving first-place votes were second-pick Butler (two first-place votes) and third-pick Jacksonville (four first-place votes).

**NEW SIGHTS AWAIT AT PFL SCHOOLS:** A building boom of sorts overtook the league's members over the summer with Butler and Jacksonville renovating their football facilities while Valparaiso added lights to Brown Stadium. Butler is completing renovations to its seating area and press box at the Butler Bowl, matching updates to its playing surface in 2005. Jacksonville has installed a new AstroTurf playing surface at D.B. Milne Field, replacing the natural turf that was the field's surface since 1998. One year after installing its own artificial surface, Valparaiso has added lights at Brown Stadium and will play its first-ever game under the lights when it hosts St. Joseph's (Ind.), Sept. 18.



## 2010 NCAA INFORMATION TO KNOW

### NCAA DIVISION I FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP EXPANDS, CHANGES LOCATIONS:

In 2010, 20 teams will qualify for the NCAA Division I Football Championship.

It is the first time since 1987 the NCAA Division I Football Championship has been expanded – then from 12 teams to 16 teams. In addition 10 of the 14 FCS conferences will receive automatic bids into the tournament – the Big South and Northeast Conferences gaining automatic berths. Entering 2010 there are 124 programs competing in football at the Division I FCS level.

**PFL COULD RECEIVE AT-LARGE BID IN 2010:** While the PFL did not receive a automatic qualifying spot into the 2010 championship, the league could still receive what would amount to an automatic at-large bid. Under criteria established by the championship committee, the PFL champion could receive an automatic at-large bid if it meets three criteria. First, it must win eight games against Division I opposition. Secondly, it must win two games against opponents from the 10 automatic qualifying conferences. Finally, it must finish the season ranked among the top 20 in the polls as calculated by the championship committee.

**DIVISION I FCS, PLEASE:** Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Pioneer Football League competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 88 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 20-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.
