WEEK 7 PREVIEW

It will be an early wake-up call for **SAN DIEGO** which will face a noon, eastern time (8 a.m., PT) kickoff against **MARIST**. The Toreros have won all five previous meetings between the two teams, but all of those contests took place in San Diego, including last season's 17-10 USD win. Marist recovered from a week five shutout with 51 points in a win at Valparaiso last week, as five different players scored a touchdown. San Diego dropped a narrow 21-20 decision to league-leading Dayton last week, quarterback Mason Mills completing 27 passes for 221 yards 🏈. A matchup of 2009 PFL co-champions will occur when **DAYTON** travels to **BUTLER**. The two squads are a different ends of the standings entering the week - Dayton is unbeaten in league play while Butler posted its first PFL win at Davidson last week. Quarterback Steve Valentino continues to lead the Flyers offense, completing nine passes for 189 yards in last week's win at San Diego. Butler shuttled its two quarterbacks - Andrew Huck and Matt Kobli - in and out of last week's win, the duo combining to complete 18 passes for 170 yards 🏈. **DRAKE** will make its first-ever trip to **CAMPBELL**. Drake suffered its first PFL loss at Jacksonville last week and returns to the east coast for the second consecutive week. Campbell had Week 6 off but will enter this week's game seeking its first home victory in 2010. Drake wideout Drew Blackmon made an impression at Jacksonville, catching nine passes for 158 yards. Campbell running back Rashaun Brown carried the ball 20 times in their win at Butler two weeks ago and leads the Camels with 68 carries this season 🏈. **DAVIDSON** will make the trip across the Appalachians to meet **MOREHEAD STATE**. Davidson's lone victory this season has come on the road, a one-point win at Campbell in Week 3. Morehead State will be playing only its second home contest this season, winning its only other home outing against St. Francis (Pa.) in Week 2. Linebacker Peter Kidwell recorded the Wildcats first interception this season against Butler last week. Morehead State quarterback Zach Lewis remains ranked second among PFL passers, averaging 286.6 yards per game, and returns to action following the Eagles off week 🏈. **JACKSONVILLE** takes the league's best offense on the road to square off against **VALPARAISO**, who host at Brown Field for the fourth time in five weeks. The Dolphins posted 490 offensive yards last week against Drake, falling just shy of their fourth consecutive 500-yard offensive performance. Jacksonville running back Rudell Small rushed for 124 yards against Drake. Valparaiso's offensive has battled inconsistency all season and was held to a solo touchdown against Marist in a home loss last week. Crusaders quarterback Nate Goergen is averaging 116.7 yards per game in six appearances this season.

Josh McGregor, Jacksonville

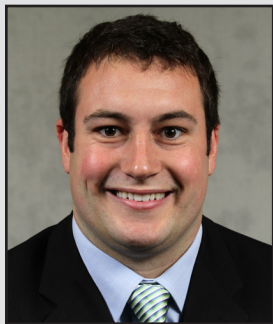
Junior, Quarterback, Belle Glade, Fla.

McGregor passed for a touchdown and rushed for another as Jacksonville held off Drake, 39-34, Saturday, in PFL action. He posted his fourth-consecutive 300-yard passing performance, completing 21-of-35 passes for 320 yards against the Bulldogs. McGregor opened the game's scoring with a career-long 39-yard touchdown run, but was sacked five times and finished the game with just three net yards rushing. He later added a 33-yard touchdown pass to Rodney Sumter to close the first half's scoring.

Ries made two critical fourth-down plays in the fourth quarter to help Dayton escape with a 21-20 PFL victory at San Diego, Saturday. On San Diego's next-to-last possession, he made the crucial tackle to stop Phil Morelli short of the first down on a fourth-and-one play. Ries then knocked a fourth-down pass to the ground on San Diego's final possession, sealing the Dayton victory. He finished the game with a team-best 10 tackles (three solo) and the pass breakup.

Shurson did his part to keep San Diego close early against Dayton, before falling 21-20 in PFL action, Saturday. He made a pair of field goals, converted two extra-points, averaged 38.3 yards on three punts and averaged 63.2 yards on five kickoffs. Shurson made a 29-yard field goal with four seconds remaining in the first half to cut the San Diego deficit to four points, 14-10. His 36-yard field goal was the third quarter's only points and moved San Diego to within one point, setting up the fourth-quarter dramatics.
