🏈 Jacksonville at Butler, Noon

Location: Indianapolis, Ind. (Butler Bowl)

Series: JAC leads, 7-2 **Streak:** BUT, two wins

Last Meeting: Butler def. Jacksonville, 45-27 (2013)

Notably: Jacksonville puts its 1-0 PFL start on the line when it travels northward to help Butler open PFL play. The Dolphins won the first seven meetings in the series, but the Bulldogs have won the last two contests. Butler owns the PFL's top passing offense after three games, averaging 267.7 yards per game and posting a 156.1 pass efficiency rating. Jacksonville ranks third in pass defense efficiency, limiting opponents to a 116.6 rating thanks to a league-leading seven interceptions.

🏈 San Diego at Marist, 1 p.m.

Location: Poughkeepsie, N.Y. (Tenney Stadium)

Series: SAN leads, 9-0

Last Meeting: San Diego def. Marist, 35-33 (2013)

Notably: San Diego makes its second trip to the east coast when it travels to Marist in the second PFL contest for both teams. The Toreros trek east after an impressive 39-29 victory against Ivy League favorite Princeton. Marist returns home after losing a defensive battle 21-6 at Drake. San Diego has scored 34 and 35 points in its last two meetings with Marist. The Red Foxes defense owns a league-leading nine turnovers gained (two fumbles, seven interceptions), but the team has only a +1 turnover margin after four games.

🏈 Valparaiso at Campbell, 6 p.m.

Location: Buies Creek, N.C. (Barker-Lane Stadium)

Series: VAL leads, 4-2 **Streak:** VAL, three wins

Last Meeting: Valparaiso def. Campbell, 49-42 in OT (2013)

Notably: Valparaiso also heads east to face Campbell in the PFL opener for both teams. The Crusaders continue a road trip that began with a nonconference win at William Jewell, its first non-PFL win since 2009. Campbell returns to action after an off week, seeking its season's first victory. Valparaiso is seeking back-to-back wins for the first time since 2007 and enters the game after scoring 39 points, its highest point total since scoring 49 points in last season's win against Campbell. The Camels opened the season with losses to FBS foe Appalachian State and FCS members Charlotte and Charleston Southern.

Davidson at Princeton, 6 p.m.

Location: Princeton, N.J. (University Stadium)

Series: PRIN leads, 1-0

Last Meeting: Princeton def. Davidson, 42-6 (1987)

Notably: Davidson visits the Garden State to meet Ivy League preseason favorite Princeton. Both teams enter the Week 5 contest after Week 4 defeats. Davidson saw Morehead State post a 40-32 come-from-behind win, while Princeton could not hold off PFL member San Diego in a 39-29 loss. The Wildcats enter the game with 119 points in the season's first four games, nearly equalling its 154 points in last season's 11-game slate.

◀ Reggie Bell, San Diego

Senior (RS) | Wide Receiver | Union City, California

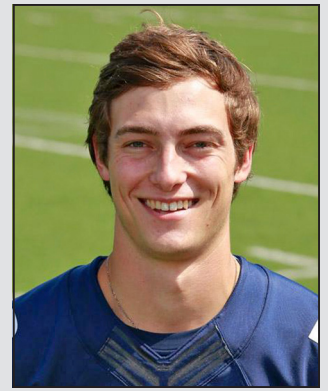
Bell caught just four passes but amassed 186 receiving yards to help San Diego down Ivy League preseason favorite Princeton, 39-29, Saturday. His first reception, an 82-yard catch and carry, set the tone for the day. Bell's first touchdown reception was a 29-yarder that put the Toreros ahead 21-12. His second score was a 48-yarder to put San Diego ahead for good, 29-22. Bell also had two punt returns, including a 55-yard return, and finished with 245 all-purpose yards.

Matt Shiltz, Butler ▶

Junior (RS) | Quarterback | St. Charles, Illinois

Shiltz accounted for all five Butler touchdowns in a weather-shortened 38-3 nonconference win against Taylor, Saturday. He completed 25-of-31 passes for 347 yards and three touchdowns. Shiltz also carried the ball seven times for 86 yards and two touchdowns and finished with 433 yards total offense. As part of his day, he ran for a 74-yard touchdown and threw for touchdowns of 53-yards (to Marque Martin-Hayes) and 75 yards (to Brando Collins) before departing the game.

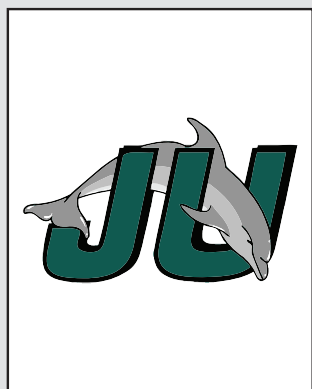
DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Donald Payne, Stetson

Sophomore | Defensive Back | Fayetteville, Georgia

Payne filled in the defensive stat sheet in a dominating performance to lead Stetson past Birmingham-Southern, 37-19, in Saturday nonconference action. He led all tacklers with 13 stops, including 12 solo tackles. Payne also had three tackles for loss, including a sack, forced a fumble, nabbed an interception and was credited with three quarterback hurries. Payne's interception came late in the third quarter and killed a drive at the Stetson 23-yard line. After a fake punt helped BSC get deep into Stetson territory, Payne stopped the drive on downs with a sack that forced a fumble on fourth down inside the Stetson 20-yard line.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Ryan Giaratano, Jacksonville

Sophomore | Punter | Coral Springs, Florida

Giaratano averaged 51.2 yards on six punts to help Jacksonville control field position in a 34-31 victory against Penn, in Saturday nonconference action. Giaratano's longest punt was a 67-yarder early in the fourth quarter that went into the end zone from the Dolphins 33-yard line. None of his punts went for less than 46 yards. With the Dolphins facing 4th-and-13 on the its own 29-yard line, Giaratano rushed for 22 yards and a first down on a fake punt that helped set up a JU field goal. His 22 rushing yards made him the second-leading rusher for the Dolphins, behind leading rusher Ulysses Bryant's 127-yard effort.
