🏈 Dayton at Marist, Noon

Location: Poughkeepsie, N.Y. (Tenney Stadium)

Series: DAY leads, 4-1 **Streak:** MAR, one win

Last Meeting: Marist def. Dayton, 31-20 (2013)

Notably: Dayton returns to the east coast for the second consecutive week, traveling to Marist for a Week 7 matchup. Marist, which ended a season-opening five-game losing streak last week, begins a stretch of four home games in its next five outings. This will be the third meeting between the two teams in Poughkeepsie and the first two were thrillers. Dayton won a 2010 matchup in overtime to clinch the PFL title and then needing an interception on the final Marist drive of a 21-17 victory in 2012.

🏈 Butler at Campbell, Noon

Location: Buies Creek, N.C. (Barker-Lane Stadium)

Series: BUT leads, 4-2 **Streak:** BUT, two wins

Last Meeting: Butler def. Campbell, 35-14 (2013)

Notably: Butler also makes a return trip to the east coast, visiting PFL unbeaten Campbell. The Camels, who are 2-0 in PFL for the first time, begin a stretch where they will play four of the next five at home. Butler has won the last two meetings in the series, but both were played in Indianapolis. Campbell won a 38-23 decision in 2011 – the last time the two teams met in North Carolina.

🏈 Jacksonville at Morehead State, 1 p.m.

Location: Morehead, Ky. (Jayne Stadium)

Series: JAC leads, 9-4 **Streak:** JAC, eight wins

Last Meeting: Jacksonville def. Morehead State, 69-19 (2013)

Notably: Jacksonville becomes the PFL's road warriors this week, starting a stretch of five consecutive road games when it visits Morehead State. This series has been lopsided recently with Jacksonville outscoring Morehead State, 157-50 in the last three meetings. This season, the Dolphins have won their first three PFL contests by an average of 20 points, while averaging 33 points per outing. Morehead State has averaged 32 points in its first two PFL contests, but will face a Jacksonville defense holding PFL opponents to just 13 points per game.

🏈 Davidson at Drake, 2 p.m.

Location: Des Moines, Iowa (Drake Stadium)

Series: DRA leads, 5-1 **Streak:** DRA, four wins

Last Meeting: Drake def. Davidson, 27-6 (2013)

Notably: Davidson travels to Drake for the first time since 2010. Drake puts its 17-game home win streak in PFL play on the line but it has not lost to Davidson at home (3-0). Davidson came oh-so-close to an upset victory at Dayton, falling in a PFL record five overtimes. The Wildcats are averaging a PFL-leading 30.7 points per game while the Bulldogs rank 10th with just 16.6 points per game.

Missouri Baptist at Valparaiso, 2 p.m.

Location: Valparaiso, Ind. (Brown Field)

Series: First Meeting

Notably: Valparaiso continues its homestand when it hosts first-year Missouri Baptist in nonconference action. The Crusaders will seek to bounce back after being held to a season-low 239 offensive yards in a loss to Marist, which came one week after a season-best 533-yard performance at Campbell.

🏈 Stetson at San Diego, 5 p.m.

Location: San Diego, Calif. (Torero Stadium)

Series: SAN leads, 1-0

Last Meeting: San Diego def. Stetson, 59-0 (2013)

Notably: Stetson makes its longest trip in program history when it travels to San Diego. The Hatters have had better luck on the road this season, where they are 2-0 against an 0-3 mark in DeLand. San Diego returns to the field after its off week and will seek to extend a two-game win streak. Stetson's offense has been firing in the last two weeks, totalling 1,034 offensive yards and 78 points. The Toreros have 59 points and 740 offensive yards in its last two outings – wins against Princeton and Marist.



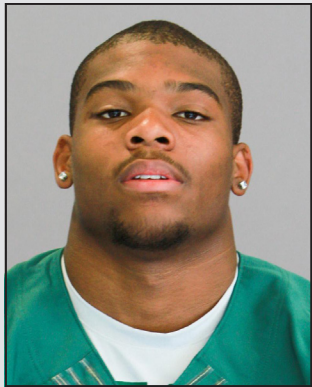
OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Connor Kacsor, Dayton

Senior | Running Back | Leo, Indiana

Kacsor scored four overtime touchdowns to help Dayton fend off Davidson, 54-48, in a PFL record five overtime contest, Saturday. In overtime alone, Kacsor was involved in 19 of the Flyers 21 plays and amassed 96 yards, including 90 on the ground. He finished the game with 47 carries – the most by any FCS back this season – for 213 yards and four touchdowns while adding six receptions for 23 yards. He now has two of the FCS' top 10 rushing efforts this season, this week's effort ranking ninth (and the most in Week 6) and joining his FCS single-game best 301 yards earlier this season.

Junior | Linebacker | Daytona Beach, Florida

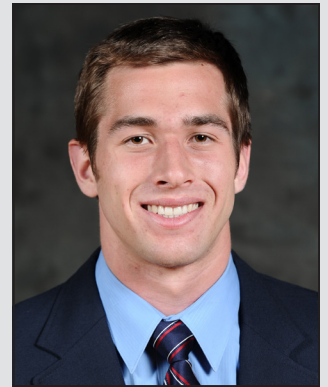
Howard posted a team-leading 12 tackles to help Jacksonville remain unbeaten in PFL play with a 29-14 victory against Drake, Saturday. His total also included two tackles for loss, a sack and two pass breakups. Howard's sack came on a key fourth down play that ended Drake's final possession on downs.

Ryan Schwenke, Dayton ▶

Junior | Flyer | Solon, Ohio

Schwenke was all over the field in Dayton's 54-48 quintuple overtime victory against Davidson, Saturday. He finished the game with 10 tackles (eight solo), two tackles for loss, a sack, a fumble recovered and two pass breakups from his defensive secondary position. In overtime, he was responsible for three tackles (two solo), a tackle for loss and added a pass breakup on Davidson's final drive of the contest.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Isaiah Howard, Campbell

Junior (RS) | Cornerback | Boynton Beach, Florida

Howard's 91-yard kickoff return for a touchdown helped Campbell improve to 2-0 in PFL play for the first time in its history with a 31-24 victory at Morehead State, Saturday. He had three kickoff returns totalling 138 yards in the contest, with returns of 23 and 22 yards in the first quarter. Howard's third opportunity came early in the third quarter and he broke it for a 91-yard return to put Campbell ahead 24-10. It is just the 15th kickoff return of 90-plus yards in the FCS this season and is the longest in the PFL this season.
