Saturday, Nov. 8

Missouri Baptist at Campbell, 1 p.m.

Location: Buies Creek, N.C. (Barker-Lane Stadium)

Series: First Meeting

Notably: Campbell will seek to end a two-game losing streak when it meets first-year program Missouri Baptist in a nonconference tilt. The Camels two losses during their current streak were each by a touchdown or less as the offense recorded more than 350 yards in both contests.

🏈 Jacksonville at Davidson, 1 p.m.

Location: Davidson, N.C. (Richardson Stadium)

Series: JAC leads, 9-6 **Streak:** JAC, four wins

Last Meeting: Jacksonville defeated Davidson, 56-13 (2013)

Notably: Jacksonville ends a five-game road trek and will look to bounce back from its first PFL loss when it travels to Davidson. The Dolphins were held to 16 points in the loss at Marist last week, its lowest point total since scoring just three points at Southeastern Louisiana in Week 1. Davidson returns to action after an off week and will seek to end an eight-game losing streak, but has scored at least three touchdowns in its last two outings prior to the break.

🏈 Drake at Dayton, 1 p.m.

Location: Dayton, Ohio (Welcome Stadium)

Series: DAY leads, 24-6 **Streak:** DRA, one win

Last Meeting: Drake defeated Dayton, 36-10 (2013)

Notably: Dayton will wrap up its two-game homestand when it hosts Drake in a key PFL matchup. Dayton is 5-0 when scoring more than 30 points this season, but 1-2 when held below that mark. Meanwhile, Drake has not allowed a PFL opponent to score more than 29 points this season. The Flyers have been ground based in 2014, leading the PFL in rushing yards (228.8 ypg) and rushing touchdowns (16). The Bulldogs boast the league's best rushing defense in both rushing yards allowed (84.5 ypg) and rushing touchdowns allowed (five).

🏈 Butler at Valparaiso, 2 p.m.

Location: Valparaiso, Ind. (Brown Field)

Series: BUT leads, 38-24 **Streak:** BUT, six wins

Last Meeting: Butler defeated Valparaiso, 72-12 (2013)

Notably: The annual battle for the Hoosier Helmet will take place at Brown Field when Butler visits Valparaiso. The Bulldogs rolled up 62 points (they entered the game with just 105 in PFL play) in a win against Morehead State, scoring touchdowns by pass (1), rush (6), kick return (1) and interception return (1). Valparaiso returns home after a winless two-game road trip that saw it allow two of its highest point totals this season. Still, the Crusaders held a lead in both of those losses and has held a lead in each of its PFL outings this season.

🏈 Marist at Stetson, 3 p.m.

Location: DeLand, Fla. (Spec Martin Stadium)

Series: MAR leads, 1-0

Last Meeting: Marist defeated Stetson, 27-0 (2013)

Notably: Marist travels to Stetson in a matchup of teams with two-game win streaks. The Red Foxes have won three of their last four after opening the season with five straight losses and are looking to move above .500 in PFL play. The Hatters are hoping Homecoming will change their luck at Spec Martin Stadium, where they are winless in four tries. Both teams defeated Campbell during their two-game win streaks, Marist winning a 27-20 decision at home while Stetson claimed a 28-24 victory on the road.

🏈 Morehead State at San Diego, 4 p.m.

Location: San Diego, Calif. (Torero Stadium)

Series: SAN leads, 9-0

Last Meeting: San Diego defeated Morehead State, 56-3 (2013)

Notably: Morehead State heads to the west coast to face San Diego in the PFL's Week 11 finale. The Eagle's offense has found a different gear in its last two games, scoring 100 total points, but is 1-1 in those two games. The outburst has doubled Morehead State's PFL point total and they now rank second in the league at 32.8 points per PFL game. San Diego is the hottest team in the PFL, owning a six-game win streak after a Week 3 loss to Jacksonville. In addition, the Toreros ended Drake's 19-game home PFL win streak last week and now have the league's longest such streak with a 17-game home PFL win streak.



OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Sam Schrader, Butler

Freshman (RS) | Running Back | Mishawaka, Indiana

Schrader's three second quarter touchdowns turned the tide in Butler's 62-52 PFL victory against Morehead State, Saturday. He finished the day with 13 carries for 162 yards and 4 touchdowns, but it was his second quarter performance that stood out. Schrader had 4 carries for 82 yards in the quarter with touchdown runs of 21, 55 and 4 yards, catapulting Butler to a 35-23 halftime lead. He would add a 68-yard touchdown run to start the third quarter. It is the third 4-touchdown performance by a PFL running back this season, joining the two pieced together by Dayton's Connor Kacsor.

◀ Zach Adler, Marist

Senior (RS) | Linebacker | Akron, Ohio

Adler nabbed a pair of interceptions to help Marist upset PFL-leading Jacksonville, 17-16, Saturday. His first interception came in the end zone on the game's first drive, denying a Jacksonville score. Adler's second interception was credited by head coach Jim Parady as the game's turning point. He intercepted a pass at the Marist 14-yard line and returned it 23 yards. The resulting Marist possession ended with a touchdown, closing the deficit to 13-10.

Donald Payne, Stetson ▶

Sophomore | Defensive Back | Fayetteville, Ga.

Payne set a PFL record with 27 tackles in Stetson's 28-24 PFL victory against Campbell, Saturday. Including his one pass breakup, Payne had a hand in stopping more than one-third of Campbell's 79 offensive plays. Payne had 10 solo tackles in the contest and also chipped in a pair of tackles for loss and two tackles for no gain. He also had a 20-yard return on a missed field goal just before halftime. It was Payne's second 20-tackle effort in 2014, joining a 21-tackle outing against Jacksonville in Week 8.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Derek O'Connor, Butler

Senior | Wide Receiver | Bourbonnais, Illinois

O'Connor's 80-yard punt return proved to be the game-securing score in Butler's 62-52 PFL victory against Morehead State, Saturday. After Morehead State scored on two consecutive possessions, O'Connor's 80-yard return stemmed the tide and gave Butler a 55-38 lead. It is only the 12th punt return in the FCS for more than 80 yards and longest in the PFL this season.
