Championship/Automatic Bid Scenario

If Jacksonville defeats Campbell in Week 12, it claims at least a share of the PFL title and earns the league's automatic bid to the Division I Football Championship by virtue of its victory against San Diego earlier this season.

If San Diego defeats Valparaiso in Week 12, it claims at least a share of the PFL title but only earns the league's automatic bid to the Division I Football Championship if Jacksonville loses.

If both Jacksonville and San Diego lose, the league's automatic bid will be determined by the its tiebreaker procedure based on all teams tied with two losses at season's end.

Saturday, Nov. 15

🏈 Dayton at Butler, Noon

Location: Indianapolis, Indiana (Butler Bowl)

Series: DAY leads, 26-12-1 **Streak:** BUT, three wins

Last Meeting: Butler defeated Dayton, 33-30 (2013)

Notably: Dayton and Butler meet bright and early (11 a.m. CT) in the 40th meeting all-time between the two teams. Dayton posted its fourth-straight 300-yard outing, but lost for the second time in that stretch as its defense allowed more than 30 points for the fourth time (1-3 in those games). Butler was held to 3 points in a Week 11 loss, its lowest point total in a PFL game since a PFL opening suffering shutout at San Diego in 2010. The Bulldogs 263 offensive yards was its second-lowest output this season.

🏈 Davidson at Marist, Noon

Location: Poughkeepsie, New York (Tenney Stadium)

Series: MAR leads, 5-1 **Streak:** MAR, three wins

Last Meeting: x

Notably: Davidson travels north to face Marist in a game that will feature senior wideouts moving up their respective team's receiving Top 10 lists. Senior wide receiver William Morris is second all-time with 2,239 receiving yards at Davidson and sixth all-time in total receptions (153). On the other side of the field, redshirt senior Armani Martin recorded his 18th receiving touchdown, breaking the Marist career mark set in 2012 by Michael Rios, and his 1,862 yards are fourth-most in program history.

Saturday, Nov. 15

🏈 Campbell at Jacksonville, 1 p.m.

Location: Jacksonville, Florida (D.B. Milne Field)

Series: JAC leads, 6-0

Last Meeting: x

Notably: Jacksonville will seek to clinch a share of its first PFL title since 2010 and its first-ever Division I Football Championship berth when it hosts Campbell. The Dolphins bounced back from their first PFL loss in Week 10 by posting its first PFL shutout since 2010. Jacksonville's 56 points were its second most this season and it is the third time it has held an opponent to a touchdown or less. Campbell halted a two-game losing streak with a 66-point outing in a nonconference tilt against Missouri Baptist, its 788 yards in that game were the second most in the FCS this season.

🏈 Stetson at Morehead State, 1 p.m.

Location: Morehead, Kentucky (Jayne Stadium)

Series: STE leads, 1-0

Last Meeting: Stetson defeated Morehead State, 41-0 (1953)

Notably: Stetson travels to Morehead State in the first meeting between the teams in 61 years. Stetson improved to 5-5 with a Week 11 victory - its first five-win season since 1951 - and its current three-game win streak is the longest since that 1951 campaign. Morehead State was held to 366 offensive yards in its Week 11 loss at San Diego and fell to 0-5 in games it has been held below 300 yards this season. The Eagles rank second in total offense, averaging 442.4 yards per game this season.

🏈 Valparaiso at San Diego, 4 p.m.

Location: San Diego, California (Torero Stadium)

Series: SAN leads, 16-5 **Streak:** SAN, 10 wins

Last Meeting: x

Notably: San Diego looks to clinch a share of its third PFL title in the last four years when it hosts Valparaiso. The Toreros are the hottest team in the league currently, winning their last seven outings. San Diego also owns a 17-game home PFL win streak that dates back to a Oct. 9, 2010 loss to Dayton. Valparaiso's Week 11 win was its third victory of 2014, its first three-win campaign since 2008. The Crusaders defense worked its magic in the win, allowing just three points, the fewest points an opponent has scored since a 2006 shutout against Wisconsin Lutheran.

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Kade Bell, Jacksonville

Junior (RS) | Quarterback | Fleming Island, Florida

Bell threw six touchdowns – a PFL single-game best in 2014 – to lead Jacksonville past Davidson, 56-0, Saturday. His six touchdowns were the third most (one shy of the best mark) in the FCS this season. Bell completed 20-of-24 passes with no interceptions for 417 yards, giving him a 313.38 pass efficiency rating on the day – third best in the FCS this season. He threw touchdown passes to five different receivers with three going for 50-plus yards.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

John Guilford, Valparaiso

Junior | Defensive End | Spencer, Ohio

Guilford was credited with four tackles for loss, including three sacks, as Valparaiso defeated Butler, 17-3, Saturday. Both his tackle for loss and sack totals were the best in the PFL this season and ranked 13th and 10th among FCS single-game performances this season. Guilford also had seven tackles (five solo) in the win and helped Valparaiso limit Butler to three points – its lowest point total against Valparaiso since 1945.

◀ Kyle Pignatiello, Dayton

Senior | Punter | Tipp City, Ohio

Pignatiello averaged 41.8 yards on five punts in Dayton's 34-30 PFL loss to Drake, Saturday. He had one downed inside the 20-yard line and had a 64-yard punt. Pignatiello saw four punts returned but Dayton special teams helped him maintain a 35.4 yard net punting average.

Ryan Belden, San Diego ▶

Sophomore | Punter | Diamond Bar, California

Belden averaged 41.7 yards on six punts in San Diego's 49-28 win against Morehead State, Saturday. He saw two punts fall in the end zone for touchbacks and had a 48-yard long punt. Belden saw one punt return against him and San Diego's special teams helped him keep a 34.3 net punting average.
