**Next Up in Valpo Baseball:** The Valparaiso University baseball team will finish out the 2019 regular season this weekend with a three-game Missouri Valley Conference series at Missouri State. Valpo enters the weekend trailing the defending conference champion Bears by one game in the standings and can overtake Missouri State for sixth by winning this weekend's series. Valpo enters the weekend with a four-game winning streak and the team will shoot to surpass its conference win total from a year ago (six) with at least one win this weekend.

**Last Time Out:** Valpo topped Chicago State 4-3 on Tuesday in the home finale at Emory G. Bauer Field, also the final nonconference game of the season. Steven Fitzsimmons finished a home run shy of the cycle, while four Valpo relief pitchers did not allow any earned runs over 4 1/3 innings to help secure the triumph. Montana Quigley garnered his first win out of the bullpen, while Easton Rhodehouse nailed down his fourth save.

**On the Air:** All three games will have radio coverage and stats courtesy of Missouri State Athletics. The series finale on Sunday will be broadcast on ESPN+. Follow @ValpoBaseball for updates throughout the weekend.

**Series Notes:** Valpo will look to pick up its first win over Missouri State this weekend as the Bears lead 5-0 in a matchup that began in 1985 but had been on hold since 1987 until a three-game series at Emory G. Bauer Field last year. The 1985 meeting was part of the Association of Mid-Continent Universities Tournament in Charleston, Ill., while the 1987 matchup was part of the same event in Chicago. This will be Valpo's first trip to Springfield.

**Relief Heroics:** Valpo reliever Easton Rhodehouse had the game of his life in the series opener against Southern Illinois on May 10, earning the victory in a 5-4, 14-inning win. Inning after inning, Rhodehouse mowed down Saluki hitters. He did not allow a hit over six scoreless frames and issued just two walks while striking out eight. He set career highs in innings pitched, strikeouts and pitch count (85), outdoing his previous career long outing of four innings on May 14, 2017 vs. UIC. His previous career watermark in strikeouts also came in that appearance as he fanned seven Flames on his way to an eventual Horizon League Pitcher of the Week honor. His previous career high for pitches thrown was 60 in two innings on March 7, 2018 at UC Riverside. After finishing his sophomore season with a 9.68 ERA, Rhodehouse is at 3.00 over 33 innings as a junior.

**Rhodehouse Recognized:** For his aforementioned achievements, Easton Rhodehouse was tabbed the Missouri Valley Conference Pitcher of the Week on Monday while also being named a National Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. Rhodehouse was one of three pitchers named National Players of the Week by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper and the only reliever to receive recognition as he joined West Virginia's Alek Manoah and Ball State's John Baker. In addition, he became the first Valpo athlete to win MVC Pitcher of the Week honors since the program joined the conference prior to the 2018 season. He was Valpo's second Valley weekly award winner as Sam Shaikin won a Player of the Week award last season. Rhodehouse also accounted for Valpo's most recent Pitcher of the Week award in any conference when he was named the Horizon League Pitcher of the Week on May 15, 2017 after retiring all 12 batters he

faced over four scoreless innings in a 7-6 win over UIC.

**Nailing It Down:** To complete the trifecta of notes on Rhodehouse, here's one more. The Valpo junior allowed one unearned run while nailing down his fourth save of the season in a 4-3 victory over Chicago State on Tuesday. That marked the eighth save of Rhodehouse's career, allowing him to climb into a tie with Chip Pettit (1993-1996) for seventh in program history. He has the most career saves by any Valpo player since Karch Kowalczyk graduated with 24 from 2010-2014.

**Friendly Confines:** Valpo finished the season with an 8-6 record in games played at Emory G. Bauer Field, posting a winning home mark for the fourth time in the last five years. Since 2006, Valpo has finished with a losing record at home just twice in 14 seasons. Valpo has a 146-82 (.640) record at home since Brian Schmack joined the coaching staff in 2007.

**#NoRunZone:** Southern Illinois entered the May 10 series opener at Valpo ranking third nationally in stolen bases per game and fifth nationally in total stolen bases, but the Salukis went just 4-of-9 against freshman catcher Jake Kapers and the Valpo pitching staff in a three-game set at Emory G. Bauer Field. On the flip side, Valpo entered the weekend just 11-of-24 in stolen base attempts and went a perfect 7-for-7 over the three games.

**Fricke on Fire:** Zach Fricke delivered the first nine-inning complete game by a Valpo pitcher this season, allowing just one run on four hits while earning his third win in a 7-1 triumph over Southern Illinois on May 11. Entering his start against Evansville on April 28, Fricke had an 0-3 record and 7.64 ERA over 12 games (five starts). Since then, the rookie right-hander has gone 3-0 with a 2.14 ERA over 21 innings with opponents hitting just .214 against him.

**Bringing Out The Brooms:** Valpo's three wins over Southern Illinois from May 10-12 allowed the team to string together three straight victories for the first time this season and record its first ever sweep in Missouri Valley Conference play. It marked Valpo's second series win (2018 at Evansville) since joining The Valley prior to the start of the 2018 season and first at Emory G. Bauer Field. In addition, it was Valpo's first series win since March 16-17 at Northern Illinois and the team's second series win of the season. The victories allowed Valpo to lift its Valley win total to six, matching its conference win total from a year ago with three Valley games still to play. This marked Valpo's first three-game series sweep since May 19-21, 2016 vs. Youngstown State. Since then, Valpo has tacked on its fourth straight win to make this the team's longest winning streak since securing six straight victories late in 2016.

**Starting Staff Shining:** The Valpo pitching staff had its best weekend of the season, posting a 1.41 ERA in the series against Southern Illinois from May 10-12. The starting staff was particularly impressive, posting a 1.17 ERA in the three games against the Salukis with all three starting pitchers going at least seven innings and each of the three Valpo starters limiting SIU to only one earned run. Southern Illinois scattered 12 hits over 23 innings against Valpo starting pitchers.

**Billinger Receives Recognition:** Valpo senior Blake Billinger was recognized for his success on the field and in the classroom by earning a place on the 2019 Google Cloud Academic All-District Team selected by CoSIDA. Billinger holds a 3.49 grade point average in psychology with a minor in business analytics. He was one of 11 honorees on the Academic All-District Team among student-athletes from Division-I baseball programs in Indiana, Illinois, Michigan and Ohio. He became the first Valpo player to receive Academic All-District recognition since Nolan Lodden in 2016.

**Bonus Baseball:** Valpo's 5-4 win over Southern Illinois on May 10 was the team's second extra-inning game of the season and first since Feb. 24, a 7-6 loss at Arkansas State. The four-hour, 14-inning funfest was Valpo's longest game in terms of innings since April 17, 2012, a 2-1 defeat at Indiana State that required 16 frames. The game against the Salukis was Valpo's longest in terms of time since the team enjoyed a four-hour, 29-minute mid-week marathon in an 8-7 win over Western Michigan on May 5, 2015. The series opener against Southern Illinois tied for Valpo's longest home game on record in terms of innings, matching a 4-3 win over Chicago State on May 14, 2016 and a 2-1 loss to Indiana Central on April 15, 1978.

**Senior Spotlight:** This year's senior class features four players who are four-year members of the program, two junior college transfers and one graduate transfer. Nick Leaverton, Patrick Donohue, Sam Shaikin and Chase Dawson have spent their entire careers at Valpo, Brent Jones has been with the program the last three seasons, Blake Billinger is in his second season on campus and this marks Mike Kornacker's lone year at Valpo after graduating from Purdue. Shaikin and Dawson have been cornerstones of the program over the last four seasons, serving as four-year starters and comprising Valpo's middle infield combination. Several Valpo players have plans in place for what they'll be doing after graduation.

- Nick Leaverton, a finance major with a minor in business analytics, plans to become an officer in the air force.

- Mike Kornacker, a grad transfer with an undergraduate degree in organizational leadership from Purdue, will finish his master's in sports administration from Valpo in December 2019. He will complete an internship this summer at Lewis University before interning at St. Laurence High School in the fall. He hopes to work in high school or collegiate athletics after graduation.

- Brent Jones, a physical education major, has future plans of becoming a P.E. teacher.

- Patrick Donohue, a finance major, has future plans of being a financial representative or planner.

- Blake Billinger, a psychology major with a minor in business administration, has future plans as a commercial real estate investment sales agent at the downtown Chicago office for Marcus & Millichap.

- Sam Shaikin is a business management major with future plans of working on the business side of sports.

**Chasing the Record Book:** Seniors Chase Dawson and Sam Shaikin rank among Valpo's career leaders in several statistical categories.

- Dawson ranks tied for second in program history in career assists with 448. He is even with John Giusti (2005-2008, 488) and trails only Spencer Mahoney (2012-2015, 559). Shaikin is also among the program's leaders in career assists with 386, which ranks sixth. Marc Boggio is fifth at 387 with Rick O'Connor fourth at 424.

- Dawson has 195 career hits and needs five more to become the first Valpo player since Spencer Mahoney (2012-2015) to enter the 200-hit club. He can crack the Top 10 in program history if he gets to 205, a mark currently held by J.J. Swiatkowski (1997-2000).

- A pair of Valpo players have a chance to enter the career record book in doubles. The mark needed to crack the Top 10 is 38 with Shaikin (34) and Blake Billinger (34) both hoping to rack up at least four doubles prior to the end of the season.

- Dawson is up to 142 career runs scored, tied with Marc Boggio (1999-2003) for seventh in program history. Rob Hadrick (1994-1997) is sixth at 144 with Spencer Mahoney (2012-2015) fifth at 147.

- Dawson ripped his 12th career triple on April 19 at SIU Edwardsville, moving into a tie for third in program history. He needs one more to become just the third Valpo player to get to 13 and tie Robert Skaltsas (1974-1977) for second. Rod Hadrick is the all-time leader with 15.

- Shaikin has 21 career home runs and needs one more to join four others in a tie for fifth in program history. He is currently tied for ninth in program history in career home runs after entering the all-time Top 10 on May 8 at Michigan State.

- Shaikin has 103 walks, which ranks third in program history. Marc White (1989-1992) is second at 137, while Spencer Mahoney (2012-2015) holds the record with 138.

**Head Coach Brian Schmack:** Brian Schmack, the 17th head coach in Valparaiso University history, is in his sixth season in charge of the program. He led Valparaiso to 25 wins in his inaugural campaign, a school record for victories by a first-year skipper. The former big leaguer followed that up with a 22-win season in 2015, then guided the team to its first winning record since 2013 in 2016. In 2017, Schmack continued his success despite managing a youthful roster that featured 11 freshmen and 15 total newcomers. He led his team to 24 wins, including a strong finish to the regular season that saw them win eight of their last 11. The 2018 season saw Valpo transition to the Missouri Valley Conference. The Brown & Gold made an immediate splash in the highly-respected baseball league, putting together a strong showing in the MVC Tournament, including a 13-10 victory over host Dallas Baptist, a team that went on to receive an at-large NCAA Regional berth. Schmack, a member of the 2003 Detroit Tigers, served as pitching coach/associate head coach at Valpo for seven seasons prior to his promotion.

## In The Other Dugout: Missouri State

- Having a rare down season for a powerhouse program that is coming off a 40-win campaign that culminated with MVC regular season and tournament titles and an NCAA Regional appearance.

- Lost two of three last weekend at Evansville in a series that featured three one-run games. Both losses were by the score of 4-3 (Friday and Sunday) with the first one coming in 12 innings, while the middle game of the series was a 10-9 Missouri State victory.

- Own series wins over DBU and Indiana State, two of the top three teams in the standings. However, the Bears were swept by Bradley and Illinois State.

- Led in hitting by Dakota Kotowski (.305) and Jack Duffy (.291). Kotowski's 11 home runs lead the club, while Ben Whetstone is the team leader in RBIs with 30.

## Pitching Profiles – Weekend Rotation

- **RHP Jon Tieman** – Named a 2018 All-MVC Honorable Mention selection, 2018 MVC Scholar-Athlete First Team honoree and 2017 Collegiate Baseball Newspaper Freshman All-American... Was Valpo's Friday starting pitcher throughout his sophomore season, garnering five wins while making 15 starts and one relief appearance... Compiled 98 2/3 innings, the most on the team and the third-most in the MVC... Led the team with 56 strikeouts, a total that ranked 15th in the conference... Became Valpo's first underclassman pitcher to start on Opening Day since 2009... Threw his first career complete game in a 7-2 win over Evansville on April 20, 2018... Had his second CG on May 11, 2018 at Illinois State, yielding just one run on eight hits and two walks to lift Valpo to a 2-1 victory... Started his freshman year as Valpo's closer before moving into the weekend rotation by season's end. Is tied for eighth in program history in career saves with seven despite spending less than a full season as the team's closer... Is majoring in finance with a minor in business analytics... Has lived in Missouri, Georgia and Illinois... Picked up the win in his season debut on Feb. 16 at Lipscomb, a game his team won 8-6. Allowed three runs on six hits and two walks over five frames... Struck out six but also walked six and allowed five earned runs on four hits in 4 2/3 innings on Feb. 24 at Arkansas State, taking the defeat... Turned in a quality start on March 2 at UNCW and got no decision in a game Valpo eventually lost 4-3. He allowed three runs on five hits in six frames while striking out eight... Enjoyed a dazzling outing on March 9 at South Carolina, when he left in position to earn a win against the nationally-ranked Gamecocks but eventually settled for no decision. He permitted just one run, and it was unearned,

on six hits and no walks in eight innings while striking out five. That marked the first time in his collegiate career that Tieman started and did not allow an earned run... Had a tough-luck loss on March 16 vs. Northern Illinois at Chicago State, allowing four runs but just two earned on four hits in six innings. One of the two earned runs scored in an inning that did not feature a hit... Allowed three runs on six hits while walking two and striking out six in six innings and took the defeat on March 23 in the first game of a doubleheader vs. Butler... For the second time this season, started and did not issue a walk on March 29 at DBU, going 6 1/3 innings. He allowed seven runs on eight hits (six for extra bases) against the powerful Patriots... Allowed seven runs but four were unearned while taking the defeat on April 5 vs. Illinois State... Allowed 13 runs but five were unearned in two innings of a loss at Indiana State on April 12... Racked up a career-high 12 strikeouts on April 19, yielding just two hits in six shutout innings while picking up the win at SIU Edwardsville. Those 12 punch outs were the most by a Valpo hurler since 2011... Took the defeat on April 26 in the series opener vs. Evansville... Pitched his third career complete game and his first of the season on May 3 at Bradley, but it came in a tough-luck 2-1 defeat. He scattered six hits and struck out seven while walking two in the eight-inning CG. It was the first complete game by a Valpo pitcher this season... Received no decision despite exiting in position for the win on May 10 vs. Southern Illinois, when he went seven innings and allowed two runs (one earned) on three hits while striking out five in a game Valpo eventually won 5-4 in 14 innings.

- **RHP Zach Fricke** – Was an all-conference and all-area performer as a junior and senior in high school... Named the MSL East Player of the Year as a senior... Honored as the Daily Herald Player of the Year following his senior season... Was an all-area captain and first-team all-state selection as a senior... Also played basketball and golf... Favorite MLB player is Dansby Swanson... Slated to make his first career start on Tuesday... Worked 2/3 of an inning on Saturday vs. Butler and did not allow a run in his most recent appearance... Made his first collegiate start on March 26 at Purdue, allowing three runs (one earned) on three hits and two walks in four innings in a tough-luck loss... Made his first career weekend start and permitted four runs (three earned) on six hits in three innings on March 31 at DBU... Turned in a solid start to help Valpo to its first conference win of the season, a 4-2 triumph over Illinois State in the second game of a doubleheader on April 6. He recovered from a bout of wildness where he allowed two runs without yielding a hit in the third inning to get out of that frame and put two more zeros on the board, finishing with a line of two runs on just two hits while striking out six in five innings. He received no decision against the Redbirds... Allowed five runs (three earned) on seven hits in four frames and received no decision on April 13 in Game 2 of a doubleheader at Indiana State... Took the defeat in the rubber match of a series at SIUE on April 20... Recorded his first career win on April 28 vs. Evansville, pitching Valpo to a 6-2 victory thanks to 6 2/3 innings of four-hit, two-run ball in which he walked five and struck out three... Made it back-to-back

victories by earning the win on May 4 at Bradley, allowing two runs on seven hits and three walks in 5 1/3 innings... Earned his third straight win on May 11 vs. Southern Illinois, this time becoming the first Valpo pitcher to throw a nine-inning complete game this season in a 7-1 rout of Southern Illinois. He scattered four hits and walked five while striking out five.

Broke his leg in seventh grade and his right leg is now three centimeters shorter than his left... Did not allow a run in 1 1/3 innings of relief on March 23 vs. Butler, helping Valpo to a 5-2 win... Turned in two scoreless innings in a road game against Big Ten foe Purdue on March 26, walking none and yielding just two hits... Allowed three runs on four hits in 1 2/3 innings on March 29 at DBU, then needed only two pitches to retire the only man he faced in the finale of the series in the Lone Star State on March 31... Set the tone atop the lineup with three hits, three RBIs, a walk and two runs scored in Valpo's first victory of the season, which came 8-6 over Lipscomb on Feb. 16... Had his fourth multi-hit game of the season on March 9 vs. South Carolina... Had two doubles in a March 17 win over Northern Illinois, becoming the first Valpo player

with a two-double game this season... Had hits in all three games of a weekend series against Butler March 23-24, extending his hitting streak to seven. Ripped a run-scoring triple in the middle game of the series to help Valpo to a 5-2 win... Moved his hitting streak to eight with his second triple of the season on March 27 at Ball State... Also in 2018, slugged the most home runs by a Valpo player since 2008 (Josh Wallace, 11) and the second-most by a Valpo player since 2002 with nine... Named to the Brooks Wallace Award Watch List by College Baseball Foundation for an award that goes out to the top shortstop in the nation... Was the only Valpo player to earn MVC Player of the Week honors in the program's first season in the conference. Did so after hitting .700 in three games against Oklahoma and Holy Cross the second week of the season... 2016 Horizon League All-Freshman Team honoree... Member of Valpo's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee... Named to the 2018 California Collegiate League All-Star Game... nephew of Bill, who works as a baseball writer for the Los Angeles Times... Belted a two-out, go-ahead, eighth-inning grand slam on March 3 at UNCW to lift Valpo to a 10-8 victory over the Seahawks. That was his first home run of the season and the 14th of his collegiate career... Belted career home run No. 15 and his second of the season on March 23 vs. Butler, a two-run blow in the eighth inning of a game the Bulldogs won 6-4... Was cut down on each of his first two stolen-base attempts of the year, but went 10-for-10 the rest of the season... After launching his first career home run on Feb. 24 at Oklahoma, ripped a two-run blast in the top of the ninth inning on March 2 against CSUN, capping a miraculous nine-run ninth that tied the game at 13... Became the first Valpo player since 2016 to rack up five hits in a single game by doing so on March 2 against CSUN... Hit a grand slam against Arkansas Pine Bluff on March 16... Has moved to the third spot in the batting order this season after hitting first, second and ninth over his first three seasons... Had his first four-hit game of the year on March 2 at UNCW. In fact, he had as many hits in that game as he did over the first five games of the season prior to that contest... Started at first base in all three games of a series against Northern Illinois March 16-17, playing out of position while battling an injury. Became the first Valpo player since Quinnette in 2008 with a three-homer game as he put together the first three home run performance in the Missouri Valley Conference in 2018 in an 18-13 win over Western Michigan on May 8... Started his collegiate career in The Valley at Bradley in 2017... Dislocated his elbow 10 days before the start of his junior season in high school, but returned to the diamond in six weeks (rather than the projected six months) to help the team down the stretch... Has two uncles and a grandfather who were collegiate student-athletes, including one uncle, Jim Kovach, who went on to play linebacker for seven years in the NFL with New Orleans (1979-85) and San Francisco (1985)... Was the winning pitcher in Valpo's dramatic victory over UNCW on March 3, the first decision of his Valpo career... Worked a scoreless inning on March 22 vs. Butler... Allowed one run but it was unearned in his inning on March 26 at Purdue.

- **RHP Tanner Skidmore** – Started his career at Potomac State, where he was an NJCAA Academic All-American... Two-time all-conference performer in baseball and basketball in high school... Double majoring in kinesiology and education... Pitched a 1-2-3 inning with one strikeout on March 5 at North Carolina A&T... Did not allow a run over 1 2/3 innings on March 22 vs. Butler.

- **RHP Mike Kornacker** – Came to Valpo as a graduate transfer after four years at Purdue... Received his undergraduate degree in organizational leadership... Father was drafted by the San Francisco Giants and reached the Double-A level after a collegiate career as a standout performer at Saint Xavier in Chicago... Brother Mark played baseball at Lewis University, where his mother is a professor of nursing... Is pursuing a masters in sports administration... Was an academic all-Big Ten selection each of the last three years... Made his Valpo debut on Feb. 15 and took the loss despite allowing just one hit over 4 2/3 innings at Lipscomb. He did permit four runs (three earned) while walking four and striking out four... Became the first player to make his Valpo debut as an Opening Day starting pitcher since Bryce Shafer got the nod as a true freshman on Feb. 23, 2008... Received no decision in his second start on Feb. 24 at Arkansas State despite exiting in position for the win. Allowed just one run on two hits while walking five and striking out six over six innings... Allowed five runs on four hits and six walks in 2 2/3 innings on March 2 at UNCW, receiving no decision... Got the nod against No. 24 South Carolina on March 8 and took the loss after allowing four runs on four hits and four walks in four innings. He struck out six and was lifted after four because the game was suspended due to rain and finished the following day... Had no decision on March 16 vs. Northern Illinois at Chicago State, allowing three runs on three hits and three walks in four frames... Was charged with five runs on three hits and two walks in 1/3 of an inning on March 24 vs. Butler... Allowed five runs (four earned) in two innings of a midweek

start on March 27... Returned to form with two shutout innings of hitless relief on March 30 at DBU.

**Looking Back:** Despite a 19-34 overall record and 6-15 MVC mark, Valpo's first season in The Valley was filled with numerous accomplishments, unforgettable games and noteworthy achievements.

- Valpo had four wins against teams that finished the season in the Top 50 nationally in RPI in 2018. The team beat DBU twice including a 13-10 victory on the Patriots' home field in Valpo's first-ever MVC Tournament game. The other Top 50 wins came against Oklahoma and Illinois. Valpo beat the No. 25 Fighting Illini 11-7, tying with Nebraska for the most runs scored all season against Illinois, a Big Ten team that went 33-20.

- Valpo will look to sustain its offensive success in 2019 after ranking in the Top 5 in program history in doubles, home runs and walks last season. The home run total was Valpo's highest since 2002, while the team had a .404 slugging percentage, its best since 2010.

- After besting a single-season fielding percentage mark that had stood since 1998 in 2017, Valpo again rewrote that record by posting a fielding percentage of .973 in 2018.

- Valpo had a pair of 20+ run outputs in single games in 2018 after the team hadn't scored 20 or more runs in a game since 2010. The first time was against defending Patriot League champion Holy Cross on Feb. 24 (20-6), the second against Milwaukee on April 11 (23-5).

- DBU, an at-large NCAA Regional team, played 63 games in 2018. Two teams scored 13 or more runs against them – Oklahoma (15, March 6) and Valpo (13, May 23).

- Valpo's first ever MVC win won't soon be forgotten, as Zack Leone launched a walk-off homer in the bottom of the 10th to lift his team over Bradley 5-2 on March 30 at Emory G. Bauer Field. That was Valpo's first walk-off blast in over 15 years.

- Blake Billinger had the program's first three-homer game in 10 years on May 8, helping Valpo to an 18-13 win over Western Michigan.

- Following the season, junior catcher Scott Kapers was selected in the 17th round of the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft by the Texas Rangers. He became the eighth Valpo player in the last nine years to be drafted and was the program's highest selection since 2011.

**The Grandest of Slams:** A grand slam is even more grand when it comes with two outs in the bottom of the eighth inning down by two runs. An inning that started modestly – with two outs and nobody on base – finished with Sam Shaikin hitting a go-ahead grand slam to lift Valpo over UNCW 10-8 on March 3. The grand slam was Valpo's first of the season, but the second time in the last three years that the team used a go-ahead, eighth-inning grand slam to win a game in dramatic fashion. The first came on April 13, 2017, when James Stea's slam helped Valpo beat Oakland 7-6 at Emory G. Bauer Field.

**A Challenging Slate:** Under Brian Schmack, the Valpo baseball team has not shied away from scheduling high-level nonconference opponents. With the move to the Missouri Valley Conference, the overall schedule has gotten even more challenging. Here are a few notes on the quality of Valpo's schedule this year:

- Seven opponents played in an NCAA Regional in 2018 – UNC Wilmington, South Carolina, Tennessee Tech, Purdue, DBU, North Carolina A&T and Missouri State.

- Six of those teams all had 37 wins or more last season and averaged 41.5 wins, while the other had 32 wins.

- Those teams combined for 13 NCAA Regional wins last season and Tennessee Tech and South Carolina both advanced to Super Regionals.

- The Gamecocks have reached the College World Series 11 times and won national championships in 2010 and 2011. They finished last season ranked 16th nationally.

- Tennessee Tech finished second in the nation in wins with 53 behind only Oregon and finished the season ranked 15th in RPI.

- Six of those teams finished in the Top 60 in RPI last season and five in the Top 40.

- In addition to South Carolina (SEC) and Purdue (Big Ten), Valpo has two other Power 5 opponents – Notre Dame (ACC) and Michigan State (Big Ten). Big East foe Butler is also on the slate after the team finished 34-20 last season.

**Inside the Assistants:** Although Brian Schmack has become a veteran of the head coaching role, Valpo's staff has a new look in 2018.

- After spending the last three seasons as a volunteer assistant, **Kory Winter** has been hired as Schmack's top assistant and hitting coach for the 2019 campaign. Winter played collegiately at Wittenberg and has completed coaching stints at Muskingum University and Shippensburg University. He is also Valpo's outfield instructor.

- **Casey Fletcher** has joined the staff as an assistant coach. He spent the last two seasons at Illinois, where he was a volunteer assistant. Prior to joining the Fighting Illini staff, Fletcher played professionally for two seasons with the Joliet Slammers of the Frontier League. He enjoyed a prosperous collegiate playing career that featured two seasons as an All-Big Ten honoree at Illinois (2014-2015) and helped Illinois to the NCAA Super Regional for the first time in program history by hitting .326 with 48 runs, three homers and 33 RBIs as a senior. Fletcher was an outfielder in college before moving to catcher in the professional ranks. His father Darrin played in the big leagues from 1989-2002 with the Los Angeles Dodgers, Philadelphia Phillies, Montreal Expos and Toronto Blue Jays. His grandfather Tom also reached the big leagues with the Detroit Tigers in 1962 and his great grandfather Glenn spent 10 seasons in the minor leagues.

- Valpo has also welcomed first-year volunteer assistant **Dylan DeBrouwer** to the coaching staff. DeBrouwer serves as the team's infield instructor and oversees strength and conditioning. He spent the last two seasons as a graduate assistant at Greenville University, where he served as the recruiting coordinator, hitting coach, infield coach and strength and conditioning coach. He also served as the head coach of the Chesterfield Vipers in the Mid Atlantic Collegiate League, recruiting and building a summer league team that won a championship in 2018. He received his undergraduate degree from Whittier College, where he was a captain on the baseball team.

**Preseason Poll:** Valpo was picked to finish seventh of eight in the MVC Preseason Poll. Blake Billinger represented Valpo on the Preseason All-MVC squad.

**Who's Next:** The Valpo baseball program announced seven newcomers for the 2020 season in November.

- DJ Calvert – an infielder who is transferring from Northern Oklahoma College (JUCO). Was an all-conference shortstop at the junior college level in 2018. During his prep tenure at Edmond Memorial

in Oklahoma, Calvert was a 2016 6A state champion and a second-team all-conference performer.

- Ryan Klainos – A senior pitcher at Libertyville High School in Illinois. Is part of a prep team that has won conference and regional championships during his time with the program. Joined forces with two other Division I commits to form the conference pitching rotation during his junior season.
- Jake Miller – A left-handed pitcher from Don Bosco Prep. The Monroe, N.Y. native was a 2018 Rawlings-Perfect Game Preseason All-American. He will become just the second Valpo player to hail from New York since 2005, joining Zack Leone.
- Jacob Rosenkranz – A senior right-handed pitcher from Stevenson High School in Illinois who boasts a no-hitter among his prep accomplishments.
- Kyle Schmack – A local infielder who is currently a senior at South Central High School, where he was an all-area performer last season and was named the area's hitter of the year. He is the son of Valpo head coach Brian Schmack.
- Nolan Tucker – A local signee who is an infielder at Hanover Central. Batted .517 as a sophomore, is a two-time all-conference performer and gained 30 pounds in the offseason between his sophomore and junior year.
- Trent Turzenski – A RHP from Burlington, Wis. who has twice earned Perfect Game All-American Honorable Mention (2016, 2018) in addition to being named Southern Lakes All-Conference honorable mention (2018), Racine All-County Second Team (2018) and to the Perfect Game Kernels Foundation All-Tournament Team (2018). He was ranked No. 14 in the state of Wisconsin for the 2019 recruiting class.
